All of the articles about QEMS over the past several weeks have been leading up to this week, which is National EMS Week. Lets take a look at what is in
volved in maintaining the Ambulance Service. There have been some critical changes over the years, one aspect, some of
you are aware of, is the cost. It is age of personnel. We no longer have to beat them off with a stick! In fact the Service has
been operating shorthanded for been operating short handed for several years. So, Why!, you may
ask, is an all volunteer service, with no paid personnel, so expensive?
Let's look at what your ambureceives lar pays for. Each EMT room instruction and 24 hossworking in a major hospital emergency room, before they can take the State Certification Test at a cost of over $\$ 100.00$ per person. The EMT must recertify every four years and accumulate 80 hours of continuing education units during that time This usually means travel and
meal reimbursement. The CEU classes cost as much as $\$ 150.00$ per person per class.
