Mrs. Pigg Hired By Motley County

The following was taken from the Lubbock A-J, November 30, 1989 edition.

Briscoe County Attorney Sharon Sutton Pigg has been hired as Motley County Attorney and will assume the new post January 1, 1990, according to Motley County Judge Joe Whitaker.

Mrs. Pigg lives in Silverton, and will work in Matador one day a week.

She succeeds Lubbock attorney J. Lynn Barnhill who had held the position since August 1988. Barnhill was released from his position by mutual agreement with County Commissioners, because of the inconvenience of traveling from Lubbock to Matador, according to Whitaker.

Motley County does not have a qualified attorney to run for the office of County Attorney, which required officials to hire someone for the position, Whitaker said.

Local Suffers Fatal Attack While Driving

Bill Joe Lane, 65, of Turkey died Sunday afternoon after suffering an apparent heart attack while hauling a load of cattle just west of Quitaque.

The passenger, Karen Suzanne Thomas, 31, of Spearman, daughter of Lane suffered only minor injuries.

According to the Department of Public Safety dispatcher in Childress, Lane was driving his Chevrolet pickup west on Texas 86 about 1.5 miles west of Quitaque when he suffered the fatal heart attack about 4 p.m. Lane, who worked as rancher in Turkey, slumped over into

the seat, the vehicle traveled through a bar ditch on the north side then came to a stop in the westbound lane.

Lane and Thomas were both transported to Lockney General Hospital. Floyd County Justice of the Peace C. L. Mooney declared Lane dead at 5:20 p.m.

Doctors treated and released Thomas, who suffered minor facial lacerations.

Quitaque ambulance attendants were David and Diane Brunson, Judy Barrett, Manuel Cruz and James Cathey.

The Hall County Sheriff's office would like to remind citizens "it is a state law prohibiting no driver of any vehicle other than one on official business may follow a fire truck or ambulance closer than 500 feet, nor park a vehicle with the distance of a city block where the emergency equipment is stopped to answer a fire alarm or ambulance call".

Deputy Wiginton also states "It is the law that no vehicle may drive over a fire hose of the fire department when laid on the street."

"These offenses are a Class C misdemeanor with up to a \$200 fine," he added.

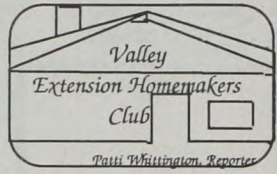
