a span of mules to a wagon. That is what the country people did back in the horse and buggy days. At 4:00 oclock in the
morning, someone in the fagmily had to get out of bed and feed morning, someone in the family had to get out of bed and feed
the mules so they would be ready for a day's work beginning at sunrise.
Each farmer had to break two or three wild mules to work each year in order to keep his team in good shape. The first thing you had to have was a large snubbing post about 20 inche
in diameter somewhere in the corral. It took two men or boys one to rope the mule and the other one would help pull the mule up to the snubbing post so the harness could be buckled on, and
this was no easy job for the mule kicked and foch this was no easy job for the mule kicked and fought every inch
of the way. You very seldom ever had a six-mule team without at least one wild mule. It took six mules to pull a two-row lister or four to pull a one row plow. A good span of young mules
would cost about $\$ 600.00$ before they were broke to work and would sill for about $\$ 8700.00$ afer they were gentle, and it took
