#### Turkey-Quitaque Census Takes Downturn In '80s

The U. S. Bureau of the Census has tallied preliminary 1990 census figures for Texas counties, U. S. Sen. Phil Gramm reported today.

The census figures could change from now until July 15, he said. Some counties might contest the preliminary figures and will have an opportunity to do so.

Population figures for Hall County are 3,905. Other area counties' figures include: Childress-5,953; Donley 3,969; and Briscoe-1,971.

A census count of Texas cities was received last week by the office of Hall Co. Judge Kenneth Dale. The population count of the cities is also subject to change as are those of the counties, it was stated.

Memphis' 1990 population total is 2,465, down from the

1980 total of 3,352. Also, in Hall County, Turkey has a population of 507; Estelline-194; and

Population figures of other area towns of interest are as follows; Childress-5,055; Clarendon-2,067; Matador-790; Quitaque-513; and Silverton-779.

In the past ten years Turkey has declined 137 people while Childress has lost 762 and Clarendon 153.


