 THAT WE CAN LIVE WITHWho should make the decisions lives? This is nóase simple question In fact, the framers of the Constitution labored long and hard over this parlicular point during their deliberations close to 200 years ago. Some of the Founding Fathers felt ment interference in the day to day lives of its citizens was preferable. Others felt that a strong central government was necessary for the
defense of our freedom and liberties. $\mathrm{A}^{\text {i }}$ compromise was eventually reached between the two views that
guaranteed both a lack of governguaranteed both a ack a defense of
mental interference and a freedoms for close to 200 years. in Washington have not taken heed to the wisdom of this compromise, and have worked hard on intruding further into the lives of the Ameri-
can people. One example of this unfortunate trend concerns the issue of a national speed limit.
Since its enactment in 1974, the 55 mph speed limit has been the law
