## Hall County Election Called For Vote On Hospital District



Looking back about sixty three years ago and living out on the farm. People would look forward for the fall of the year to give the weather reports, you had to look to the North and give your own weather report. This meant it was hog killing time. The average family would usually kill around six to eight fat hogs which would give the family their hog lard to be put up in five gallon cans. Their sausage was put in sacks ust like sausage is put in plastic today. The women folks made the sack: out of cloth and stuffed them full of sausage,
these could be hung from the rafters in the smokehouse. The hams, shoulders and sides of bacon were put a large box, then you put a layer of salt, then meat and continue this until you have the box full. This would keep the meat all winter, but come spring you had to prize the meat our from under the caked salt and scauld it to get the salt off, then put liquid smok a fat yearling it could be butchered then cut in quarters, you would climb the windmill tower and hang the beef twenty feet or more from the ground, this would keep it until it was all used up. The only thing was someone had to climb the tower and cut off a piece of beef.
For something sweet we would first cut off some old broom taken to the syrup mill. This we did by stripping all the leaves off the stalks of cane, then cut it down with large knives and load it on a wagon and head for the syrup mill with gallon buckets to put the syrup in. The $m$
