## Homeowners 65 or older may now pay the taxes on their currenthome- steads in four installments.

 steads in four installments. Mostelderly homeowners received their home tax bills this month. To set up installment payments,
65 -or-older hemeoner 65 -or-older homeowners must pay
at least one-fourth of their at least one-fourth of their 1990 the February 1 delinquency date. Then, three equal install ments are due before April 1, June 1, and Au-
gust 1. If all installments are paid on
time, homeowners will not be charged penalty or interest for late payment. However, those who fail
to pay an installment on time must opay an instaliment on time must
pay penalty and interest on that installment.
Homeowners 65 or over who are interestedin arranging installments
need to contact the tax collection need to contact the tax collection city, school, or special district
