would you think the claim would you think the claim
ridiculous? Or would you pay $\$ 30$ or $\$ 40$ for your first month'
supply of the devices and urge supply of the devices and urg
your friends to do the same? Unfortunately, the latter occurs
every day, according to the Texas Department of Health (TDH) Sales of adhesive skin "patches",
purported to contain non-standard drugs, alleged to be effective against a wide range of disorders,
have boomed in months.
TDH
Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and the Texas Attorney General in investigating the prod-
ucts, claims, and sales practices of some 30 skin patch manufacturers and their distributors known to be operating in the state.
Ken Davis, an inspector for the Ken Davis, an inspector for the
TDH Division of Food and Drugs, said that none of the products currently being sold without pres-
cription as skin patch medications cription as skin patch medications
have been approved by the FDA, have been approved by the FDA,
either as safe or as effective. By
law, he said, any drugs manufac tured in Texas must be registered and must undergo TDH inspect ion as well as be approved by
FDA. A manufacturer's failure to comply with the law is a Class A misdemeanor.
"To date,"
over-the-cour, Davis said, "all the over-the-counter skin patch reme
dies we have seen have not been in legal compliance. The patches and
the literature or advertising the literature or advertising for
them that have come to our atten them that have come to our atten-
tion have consistently been misleading, and the products we have sampled have been misbranded and adulterated."

Davis said that the so-called ac inve ingredients, usually supplied strips, often contain mixtures of common herbs and chemicals, or water. The products may be harm-
less, but investigations are underway about reports of skin rashes

The Division of Food and Drugs and the Attorney General's office continue to gather informa-
tion about the skin patch remedy tion about the skin patch remedy
industry, since it appears to be growing. "One manufacturer claims to have as many as 600
distributors in Texas, alone," Davis distributors in Texas, alone, Davis
said.
He said that anyone wishing to report adverse reactions or illness
following use of the patches following use of the patches should cath the local health depart
ment or the TDH Division of Food ment or the TDH Division of Food
and Drags. Reports of suspected
fraudulent advertising or sale of the products should be made
either to TDH or to the Attorney
General's office

In 2 -qt saucepan combine peaches, sugar, 2 Tbsp water and cinnamon. Stirring occasionally, bring to boil over medium heat;
boil 2 minutes. In bowl stir corn starch and remaining water until smooth; add to peaches. Stirring constantly, , bring to boili boill 1
minute. Pour into bowl; cover surface and cool. Meanwhile, preminute. Pour into bowl; cover surface and cool. Meanwhile, pre--
