### PIPELINE PROJECT COMPLETED RECENTLY IN AUSTRALIA

A 280-mile pipeline, which carries natural gas from Roma to Brisbane in Australia, was recently completed and opened with an impressive with a number of Australian dignitaries taking part.

The project has been in charge of Amos Persons, son of R. B. Persons of Quitaque, and brother of Lela Mae Barrett. The project has been underway for about a year and a half.

The pipeline, Australia's longest, and the first to take natural gas into one of the capitals, has cost \$11 million, according to reports.

Eventually it will supply 20 million cubic feet of gas daily.

Two ceremonies marked the official opening of the line. The Premier of Australia, Mr. Bjelke-Petersen, turned a valve to release the gas into the pipeline.

A large photo of Amos appeared on the front page of the Brisbane newspaper which carried the story of the opening of the gas line.

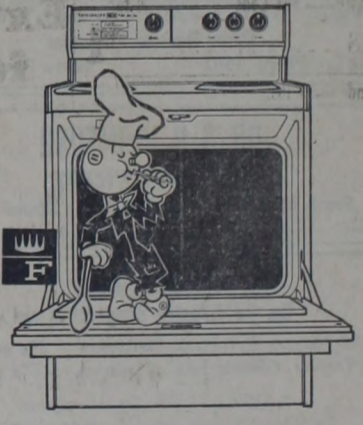
