their sales tax permit renewed on or after October
The refunds coincide with the $\$ 25$ sales tax filing fee paid to the Comptroller's Office is abol ished, effective October 1 abolished, but we're also going to issue a sales tax permit to a business for an indefinite period of time. As long as they are making sales and sending their taxes to the state, businesses
won't be required to renew those permits every year, as they are now," Sharp said.
