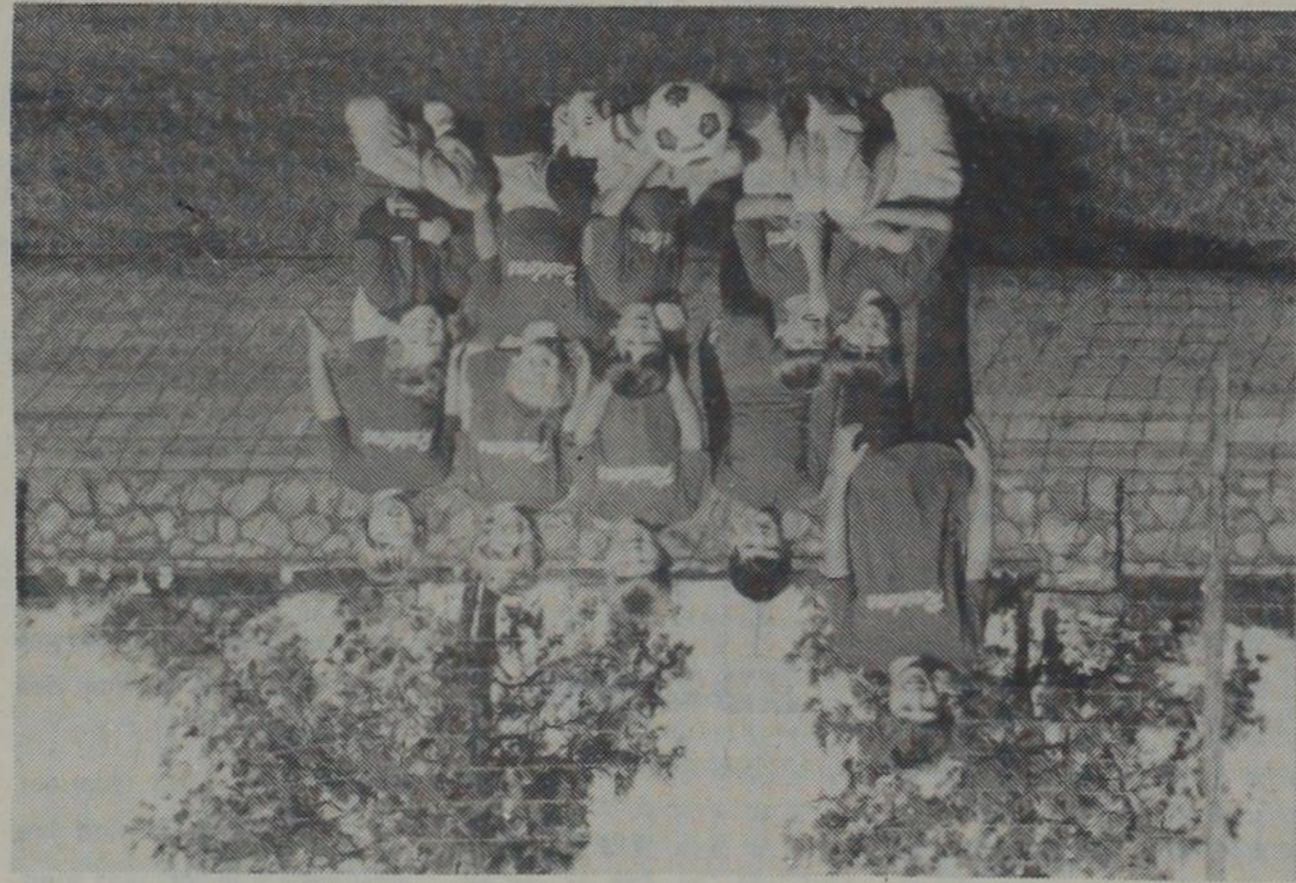

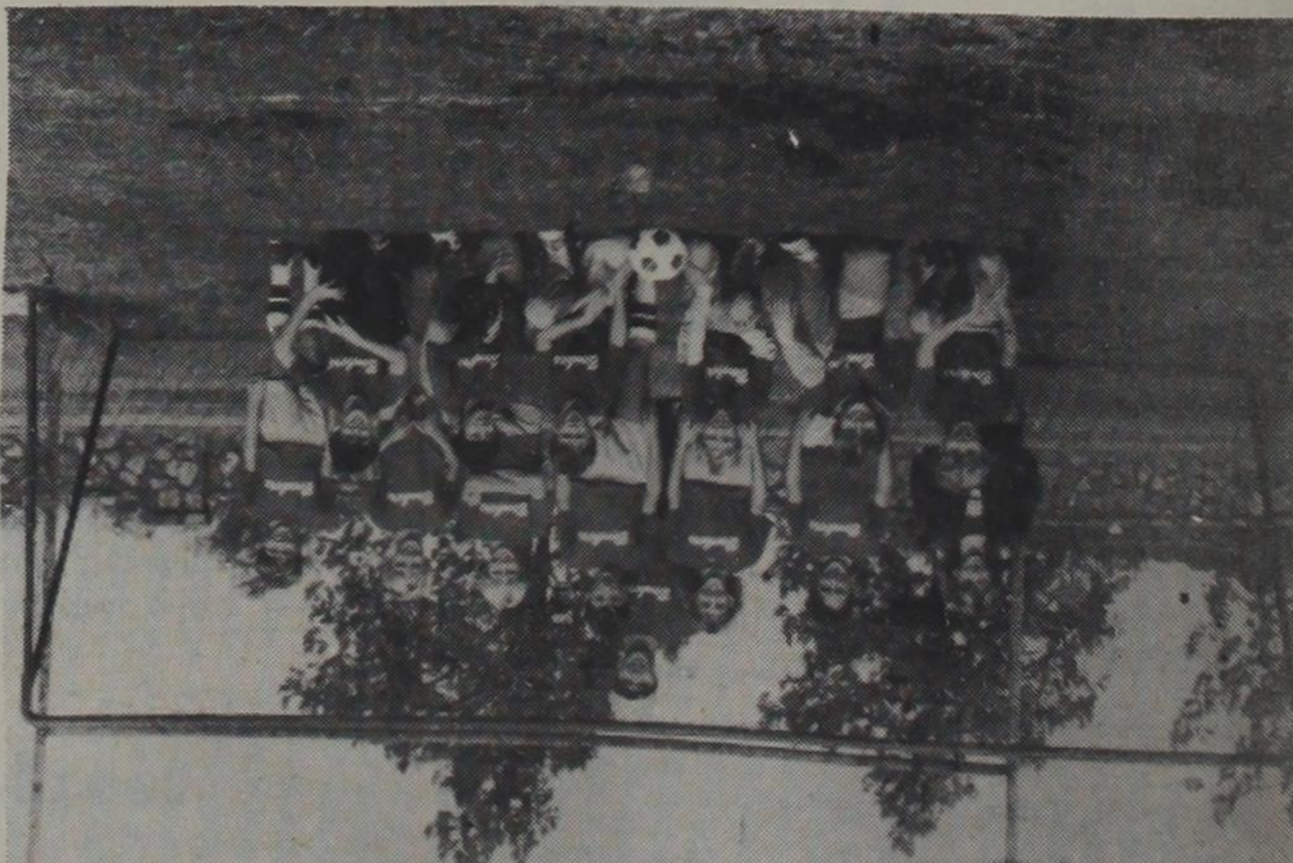

When Eastland County people have a problem they learn about it, pull together, and set to work. They even have a good time while dealing with it.

This was demonstrated by the 200 interested citizens who met in Siebert Cafeteria Tuesday night, Dec. 17 at the War On Drugs Rally.

They heard speakers from the Texas War On Drugs Committee, including Richard Salwen, an attorney who has worked with most of the drug abuse legislation enacted during the past few years.

Marilyn Golightly, Regional Director for War On Drugs, also spoke, as well as Bob Bailey, a Committee member. All the talks were packed from the state-wide effort.

Local people who attended the program included County officials, attorneys, STAND (Students of Texas Against Narcotics and Drug Abuse) members, and many walks of life. They rallied with sponsors of the "People Against Dangerous Drugs," the Eastland County Law Enforcement Association, and Eastland Alliance.

The crowd gave a standing ovation when Joe Cooper, P.A.D. and P.A.D. leader, was handed a certificate of appreciation by Bob Bailey on behalf of the Texas War on Drugs Committee.

Public recognition was also given to groups and individuals by the Rev. Robert Jeffries, Master of Ceremonies for the event.

Cited for special contribution to the war against drug abuse were all members of P.A.D., the Courtwarders, the S.T.A.N.D. chers, the Hot Line organization, the Telephone Committee, members of the Ministerial Alliance, and the Eastland County Newspapers.

The first order of business at the meeting was to secure barbecue plates. Then Roy Anderson with his guitar furnished rousing music while the crowd ate. The table decorations of pine cones and greenery centered with the Texas War On Drugs Commission had been arranged by Janet Thomas.

By doing this he did not mean to depreciate the hard, dangerous work of the law-enforcement officers in the apprehending of drug dealers, he said. "This was a vital part of the total picture."

He said that when the War On Drugs Commission was formed several years ago it set out to work in three lines: prevention, law enforcement, and legislation.

Salwen told of some major deficiencies in drug-enforcement laws which had existed until recently, and some which still do. He outlined the provisions of some new, tougher laws which have recently been passed.

On Delivery to Minors, new law has increased penalties against adults who deliver illegal drugs to persons 17 years of age or less. Persons convicted are now subject to first degree felony penalties. No deferred adjudications are permitted.

A new statute has changed Texas drug law in several areas of trafficking. It made attempts to solicit and conspiracy, solicitation and areas of trafficking. It made P.A.D. organization for its work. Joe Cooper, he said, had led out with a strong, aggressive initiative.

care professional convicted of drug-related felonies may be revoked immediately.



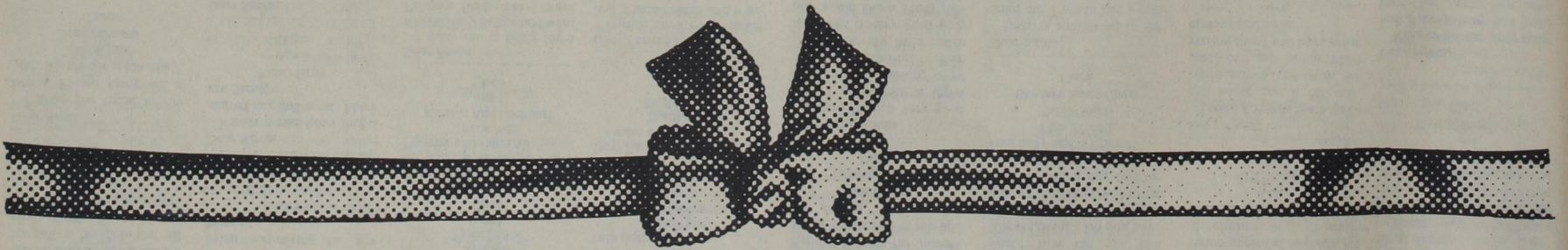
