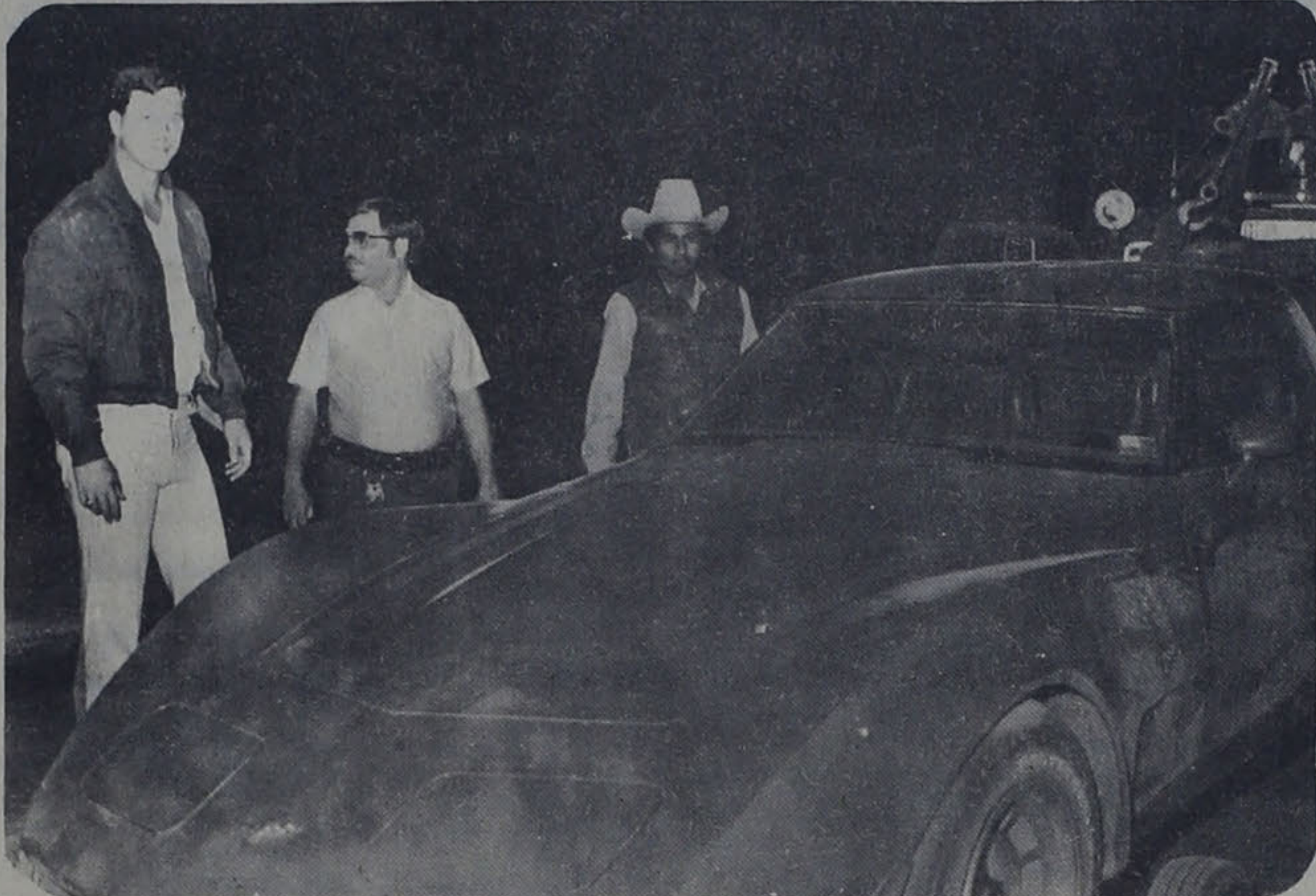

*** THE OLD AND THE NEW—** Present scheduling calls for the completion of Eastland County's new jail facilities about May. 1. County Sheriff Johnnie Morren predicts that no one will ever escape the new county jail.

"If they get out of this jail it'll be because we gave them the keys and let them get away," Morren said of the \$700,000 facility being built adjacent to the present jail.

The facility will replace the one originally built in 1897, which Morren said will be used for storage when the new jail is completed in May.

The new jail, which can accommodate 35 prisoners, including eight juveniles and eight women is being built with cinderblocks reinforced with iron and secured in concrete.

"There's no way anyone will be able to get through the walls unless we just aren't doing our jobs," the sheriff said, adding that "it would take months" for a prisoner to dig a space through the walls sufficient for escape.

Above the prisoners will be a galvanized steel ceiling that will be welded to angle irons laid into the framework of the structure, Morren said, and all locks will be electronically controlled.

The structure was designed by the Abilene architectural firm of Boone and Pope to comply with Texas Jail Commission standards concerning safety and security, County Judge Scott Bailey said.

Commissioners, Bailey said, had an option of whether to finance the new jail with county funds or appeal for federal Criminal Justice Council funds.

"But one of the reasons we decided not to apply for CJC funds," the judge explained, "is because of the problems they're having in Graham."

Graham officials have been plagued by a rash of escapes after their jail, designed to conform with CJC standards, was finished about four years ago.

Bailey said commissioners chose to fund the new jail because "to get CJC money, your jail has to conform to their standards," which he described as "motel-type."

The Graham jail featured windows in cell areas and ceilings that could be lifted from the surrounding walls.

"But the only windows we'll have," Morren said, "will be bullet-proof windows in the front of the building and a couple of windows in the offices."

"I don't think we'll ever have any trouble with escapes," he said.

Homemaker's Tips

The Eastland County Extension Service will soon begin "Nutrition Today - Weight Control Tomorrow." The "Nutrition Today - Weight Control Tomorrow"

is the title of an informative letter series to be conducted by Mrs. Janet Thomas, County Extension Agent. The purpose of the series is to help people analyze their

eating behavior; learn how to determine overweight, normal and underweight; learn how to plan nutritionally adequate meals with low calories; and learn why people overeat and how to change eating behavior to lose weight and maintain normal weight.

Today, there are over 30 million Americans who are overweight and 15 million Americans are obese to a degree that actually shortens their lives. There is significant correlation between obesity and ill health including cardiovascular disease, hypertension, diabetes and arthritis.

Too many people turn to fad diets, pills and gadgets in an effort to take off unwanted pounds. These often lead to

poor nutrition, economic loss and bad health. It takes a steady balanced diet and regular exercise to take weight off and keep it off.

Mrs. Thomas advises that people who are at least 10 percent overweight should have a physical examination before beginning a weight reduction program.

The Extension Agent encourages interested persons to enroll for this free letter series.

Deadline for enrolling is March 20th. Interested persons will be enrolled on a first-come, first-serve basis, until 100 have signed up. Mrs. Thomas stated that she expects many of the participants to be women, but hopes to have some men enroll, also.

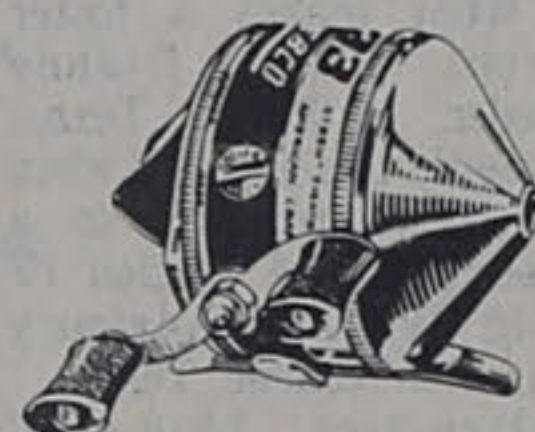

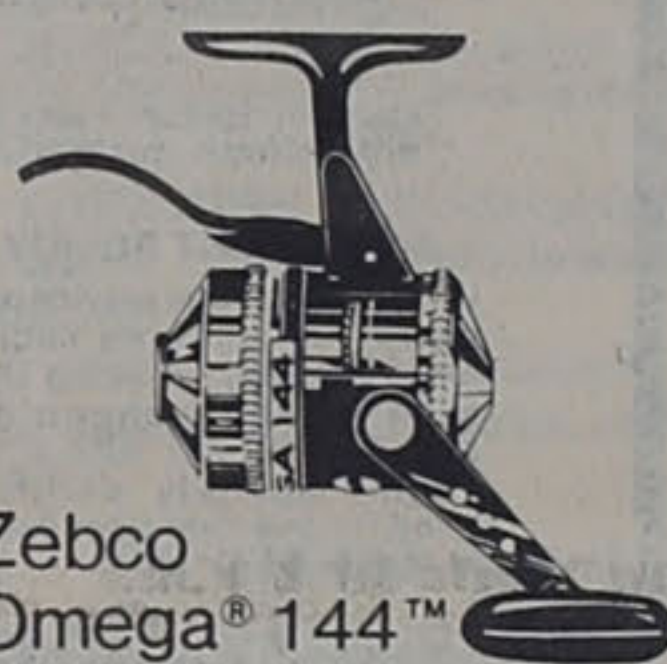

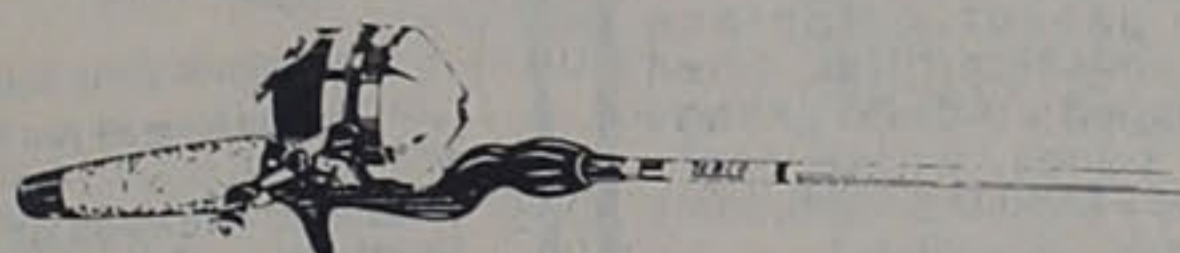
