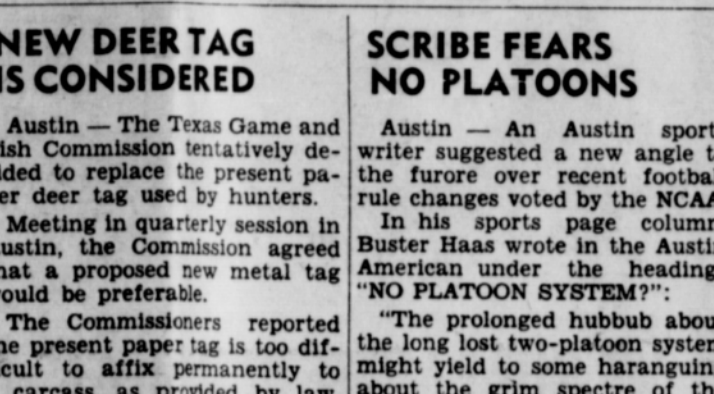
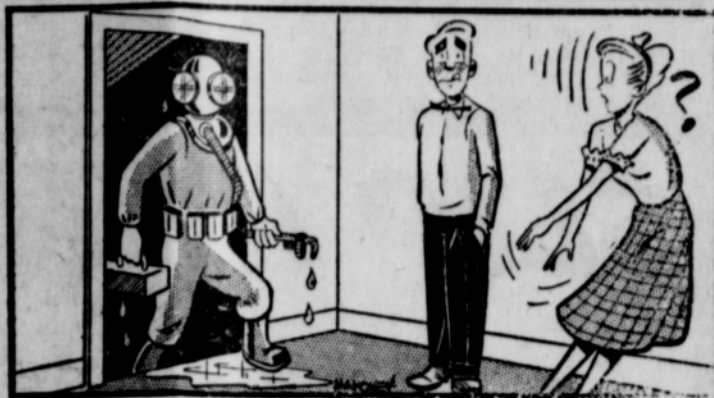

NEW DEER TAG IS CONSIDERED

Austin - The Texas Game and Fish Commission tentatively decided to replace the present paper deer tag used by hunters.

Meeting in quarterly session in Austin, the Commission agreed that a proposed new metal tag would be preferable.

The Commission reported the present paper tag is too difficult to affix permanently to a carcass, as provided by law, and also held that the paper tag sometimes is re-used.

The theory behind the tag, according to the Executive Secretary, is to identify the owner of harvested deer and to prevent any individual from taking more than two deer per season under the General Law.

The Commission approved purchase of the J. C. Gambill Wildlife Refuge near Paris, subject to final location of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service which would provide three fourths of the funds under the Pittman-Robertson Act.

We hope to be able to pass on to you answers from others who respond to this project the sixth grade is sponsoring. Here is Bobby Curtis' well-written and concise letter:

Dear Atrelle:
 I am a Sixth Grader, and my teacher's name is Mrs. Webster. I like my teacher, and I have lots of fun with my class mates. We are organizing a Citizenship Club, and I would like very much your advice on how to be a better citizen. I would appreciate it very much if you could answer as soon as possible and give me all your ideas.

Dear Bobby:
 Thank you for your very kind letter, and the opportunity to participate in this very worthwhile activity which your class is engaged in. You and your teacher are to be complimented highly on your choice of studies, for in this day of crisis when democracy, yes, and even civilization, is on trial for its life, it is more than important that young people such as you have a clear understanding of your responsibilities as citizens and be ready to discharge those duties in whatever capacity you may be called on to fill. You have asked, Bobby, how

to become a better citizen. Right now, today, by answering "Present" at roll call, you are preparing in the best way possible for good citizenship. You are becoming educated. A wise man once said "Courage is just fear that has gone to school." And this is true, for knowledge banishes fear. Fright that you feel of a problem turns into courage once you understand what the situation is and what it requires to master it. You need never face a crisis or make a decision as though it had never been examined before by great thinkers, Divine and human, and conclusions drawn. You have this precious story of history, philosophy, and revealed truths to guide you. Communitistic governments would have you believe, Bobby, that Christianity is a failure, and the dignity of mankind his purpose are myths. They would substitute an all-powerful state for God, decency, and your precious liberty. Perhaps they will not phrase it quite so bluntly, but no matter how they distort the facts to make a repulsive monster seem attractive, you will know, by the knowledge you are gaining, how to evaluate their offers, and you will never be hoodwinked into purchasing a poor, poor substitute for a genuine article.

I think, Bobby, that the whole secret of Citizenship hinges on this dignity of man and his purpose, which is to know God, to love Him, and to serve Him. A person who holds steadfastly to this purpose and does not swerve from it, and neither infringes on others rights to that same purpose, will certainly be filling the duties of a citizen in its broadest meaning. That person will remember too, man's obligation to men has never been more clearly stated than this "All things therefore whatsoever you would that men should do to you, do you also to them."

This, and a profound and humble knowledge of your own frail human nature and inadequacy, realizing that all strength and accomplishments of any worth come from God of whom you must continually ask for assistance, will make you a valuable citizen, Bobby, and the world will be a finer place for your having walked this way. Census Records Used As Substitutes For Birth Certificates

Persons lacking birth certificates or other legal evidence of citizenship, age or family relationships can obtain transcripts of their personal census records which are, in most instances, acceptable substitutes, according to District Supervisor James M. Hamilton of the U. S. Census Bureau.

More than 100,000 Americans turned to the Census Bureau for such evidence in 1952. They needed proof of identity or age for Government and defense jobs, Social Security, passports, the Armed Services, and in connection with insurance and estate cases.

The normal fee is \$3.00 for searches of two censuses for one individual, each application being handled in regular turn which generally requires approximately 30 days to complete service. Expedited handling is furnished for a \$4.00 fee.

Application blanks and instructions may be obtained from the Census Bureau's District Office at 925 T&P Bldg. Fort Worth, Texas or by writing to the Bureau of the Census, Washington 25, D. C.

BLACK'S RECIPE OF THE WEEK
 By Mary Lee Taylor
Peach Ginger Dessert

1 package gingerbread mix
 1/2 cup water
 1/2 cup Pet Milk
 1 package vanilla pudding powder

1 1/2 cups Pet Milk
 1 1/2 cups water
 1 teaspoon vanilla
 No. 2 1/2 can cling peach slices, drained

Put gingerbread mix into bowl. Stir in 1/4 cup water gradually. Mix until smooth. Stir in gradually 1/2 cup Pet Milk. Pour into an 8 x 8 x 2 in. pan, greased and lined with waxed paper. Bake as directed on gingerbread mix package. While gingerbread mix bakes, put pudding powder into a saucepan. Stir in a mixture of 1 1/2 cups milk and 1 1/2 cups water. Cook and stir over medium heat until mixture comes to a boil and is slightly thickened, about 5 minutes. Remove from heat. Add vanilla. Cover and cool thoroughly. When gingerbread is cold, split crosswise to make two layers. Put half of drained peaches on one layer. Spoon half of sauce over peaches. Cover with other layer of gingerbread. Cut into serving pieces. Top with rest of sauce and peaches. Serve at once. Makes 6 servings.
