

Evening computer courses to be offered at CC

Clarendon College will offer three computer courses this fall as part of its Continuing Education program. Courses to be offered include MS Excel 97, BUD PRO, and Windows 95.

"Our computer classes are our most requested continuing education classes," Pam Denney, Business Chair said. "And, of course, they are always the ones that fill up first. It's not unusual for a whole office to sign-up, so I recommend early registration for any one of these classes."

Starting Thursday, September 11, is MS Excel 97. A foundation computer course in one of the most popular spreadsheet programs, MS Excel

97 will be offered on Thursdays from 6-9 p.m. until September 25, in the CC Administration Bldg., Room 203. Experience with Windows is helpful and basic computer literacy is needed for this course. Cost of the course is \$25.

Starting Thursday, October 9, is BUD PRO. A popular, new agriculture computer program, BUD PRO projects budgets by using estimates for crops, cow/calf, and stocker industries.

No computer experience is needed for this class. BUD PRO will be offered on Thursdays from 6-9 p.m. until October 23 in the CC Administration Bldg., Room 203. Cost of the

course is \$25.

Windows 95 will be offered on Mondays, from 6-9 p.m., beginning October 13.

This is an introductory computer course which teaches fundamentals such as modifying the desktop, starting and closing application programs, creating, saving, and printing documents, and file management. Windows 95 will be offered in the CC Administration Bldg., Room 203, and will end on Monday, October 27. Cost of the course is \$25.

Experts offer advice to new college parents

GEORGETOWN, TX - It happens every fall. Daughters and sons across the country leave the nest and take flight to college. Parents from Maine to Montana are thinking, "Free at last!" Or more likely, "How can I let her go?"

Relax. Several experts at Southwestern University have pooled their pearls of wisdom about how parents can survive their teenager's first year away from home, what they can do to help, and when they need to take a backseat.

Dr. Dale Knobel, provost and dean of the faculty; Sherri Babcock, vice president and dean of students; Dr. Lee Edwards, director of counseling services; Dr. Nick Sikes, professor and chair of the Education Department; and Betsy Barnhart, associate dean for academic services, offer some down-to-earth advice to parents of first year college students:

1. Realize that things have changed enormously since you were seventeen. You may like it, you may hate it, but it's true.
2. If you did your job as a parent, your teenager was ready to leave.
3. Allow your student to experience making decisions on his or her own. Freedom is one thing - being able to set limits has to be learned.
4. Your student should establish his or her

own checking account. It provides a sense of money management.

5. Regarding finances, provide your student with what is needed and a little more without allowing irresponsibility. Make surprises treats rather than bail-outs.
6. Send a bag of groceries back to school with a friend or surprise your student with something he or she wants or needs that isn't part of the support you promised. Most importantly, send mail.
7. The hardest thing for parents to do is to let go. Don't meddle. Be willing to leave your student alone.
8. Don't insist on a career choice that fits your values and interests.
9. For a student trying to settle upon the choice of a course of study, the best advice is and always has been, "Do what you enjoy the most." Students pursuing areas of real interest always do their best, and doing well always opens the most doors in the long run.
10. Don't be shocked when your son or daughter questions values that you cherish. It's a natural part of developing his or her own values.
11. Parents need to find ways to take care of themselves. It is vital to the health of a son or daughter that parents don't continue to make the student the center of their lives.
12. Ask your daughter or son about something other than grades.
13. Encourage a balanced lifestyle, paying attention to studying, relationships with new friends, work, spiritual health, and physical activity.
14. Realize that their first big experience with

independence will make it extremely hard to follow schedules and curfews on visits home.

15. Encourage your child to stay on campus until Thanksgiving. This will give him or her time to develop relationships, plan weekend activities, create a new community. Well, maybe Thanksgiving is a little too far off. At least don't let your child come the first weekend. Or the second.
16. Expect to see some changes in your daughter or son. College is and should be a time of growth, exploration, and questioning for a young person. It is part of growing up into an educated and self-confident adult.
17. There is no way to prepare yourself for the mood swings you'll feel as a parent, except to recognize that you'll have them.
18. Don't foster guilt for how much you are spending on education.
19. Don't change your student's room into a sewing room until at least the sophomore or junior year. Make sure there is a place to come home that is familiar.
20. You've raised a child who can go out into the world and make new friends, new mistakes, and new discoveries. The most positive thing parents can do is convey to their students that they trust them, love them, they are there for them, they believe in their education, and they are proud of them.
21. Listen.

Check It Out

Among other things, school time means reference time. "Reference time" because of students' upcoming research for reports, essays, exams, and term themes. In addition to excellent encyclopedias, Burton Memorial Library offers assistance with numerous varieties of reference material.

High school and college students might want to take advantage of the Social Issues Resource Series (SIRS) when discussing important social issues confronting citizens today. SIRS include 26 gray and two red loose-leaf binders dealing with the following issues: alcohol, crime, drugs, family, mental health, pollution, sexuality, youth, and Third World. The two red binders are entitled *AIDS in Crisis*. Included in the SIRS collection is a study guide. Each indexed article makes it convenient to locate a certain aspect of each subject.

Seven volumes of *Chilton's Auto Repair Manuals*, approximately 1,500 pages each, give multiple information on mechanical system of automobile from American Motors, Chrysler Corporation, Ford Motor Company, and General Motors. These manuals cover the years 1964-1971 and 1980-1992.

Handguns of the World by Edward C. Ezell contains research of the years 1870-1945. It begins with military weapons from which many handguns have evolved. Over 1,000 photos and drawings accompany the written information on 692 pages.

A beautiful reference describing masterpieces and curiosities with 1,050 illustrations 608 of which are in color, is *Artist's Handbook of Materials and Technique*. Information concerning oils, tempera, mural painting, pigments, water color, mediums, sculpture, and synthetic materials is interestingly expressed by author Ralph Mayer to sharpen artist's skills.

International Encyclopedia of Music and Musicians, edited by Oscar Thompson, includes a list of over one hundred names of those who have contributed vast musical knowledge to readers.

Showboat, West Side Story, Oklahoma, and *Porgy and Bess* are only four of classic Broadway Shows discussed in *Broadway Musical* by Martin Gottfried.

College students, when you check references at our county library, ask Librarian Mary Green to show you the *1915 Wester*, Clarendon College's annual in the rare article case. It might be interesting to compare your 1997 organizations with 1915 clubs. Also, there are jokes of the day and a review of three prominent college sports, baseball, tennis, and football. You'll enjoy a humorous report concerning a big football rivalry during a certain 1914 game.

Additional reference material will be discussed in my next article. In the meantime, why not check it out?

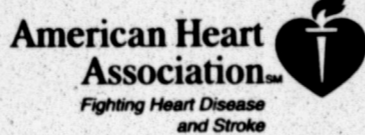
25 Years Ago in **THE LEADER**

DOG CONTROL ORDINANCE ARTICLE 1
RUNNING AT LARGE ON AUTHORITY'S PROPERTY PROHIBITED

It shall be unlawful for the owner of any dog to permit or allow such dog to run or be at large on any property of the Authority.

ARTICLE 2
DEFINITIONS

1. Authority: "Authority" shall mean the Greenbelt Municipal and Industrial Water Authority.

2. At Large: "At large" shall mean not under the control of the owner by a rope, cord, chain, or other adequate restraining line securely attached to a sturdy collar or harness, or not restrained securely within an enclosure or fence.

3. Person: "Person" shall mean an individual, corporation, partnership, firm, or any entity whatsoever, whether composed of one or more individuals.

4. Owner: "Owner shall mean any

person owning, keeping, harboring, or having control of a dog.

ARTICLE 3
PENALTY

The owner of any dog who shall violate the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in an amount not exceeding Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00).
