## CC women rout Howard Payne, 70-40

Clarendon College's Lady Bulldogs grabbed 49 rebounds and shot 46 percent from field goal range on the way to a 70-40 rout of Howard Payne University's J.V. Friday during the opening round of Clarendon's Coca-Cola Classic.

Clarendon led 35-19 at intermission by playing solid defense and taking wise shot selections, head coach Joel Zehr said.

Andrea Watson shot an amazing 87 percent from the field while Charmaine Alfred shot 55 percent.

The Lady Bulldogs outscored Howard Payne 35-21 in the second half.

"We were fortunate to play a lot of kids," Zehr said.

Scoring for Clarendon were Maxie Flores, 18; Watson, 15; Alfred, 12; Brandy Thomas, 10; Angie Kepley, 4; Jeanette Tubbs, 4; Chy Waters, 2; Jodi Card, 2; Chimira Williams, 2; Rebecca Soto, 1.

Clarendon was slow to lead in the first half against Saturday's game against Hardin Simmons University's J.V. squad leading 33-26 at halftime.

"I think we had handled them pretty easily the first time (we played them), and we were ready to wind it down (for Christmas break). We played really sluggish the first half and missed a lot of easy shots.

"We still shot 46 percent, but it could have been better."

Thomas scored all of her 15 points in the first half to lead Clarendon in College.

"They got an intense halftime speech on focusing on the job at hand, and we picked it up the second half. We ended up winning 77-55.

"We still shot 46 percent, but it could have been better, and we ended up with 42 rebounds. Shot selection had a lot to do with that."

Scoring for the Bulldogs were Watson, 20; Thomas, 15; Patricia Castillo, 9; Alfred, 9; Flores, 8; Card, 6; Soto, 4; Kepley, 4; and Waters, 2.

Clarendon doesn't pick up the basketball until the Jan. 2-4 Western Texas Classic in Snyder.

"We're looking forward to the break. We're 7-2, so you hate to see us break right now; but we need it."

## Broncos take fourth place in Floydada

The Clarendon Broncos grabbed fourth place in last weekend's Floydada Varsity Tournament and lost a game Dec. 3 in Canyon to the Class 3A school.

Their record is 3-6 at press time as they head into Thursday's Lockney Varsity Tournament. Clarendon meets Silverton at 2 p.m.

If the Broncos win, they will play at 11 a.m. and possibly at 8 p.m. Friday. If they lose their opening round game, they'll play Friday at 2 p.m. The finals are scheduled for Saturday at 8 p.m.

All eight players scored in the Broncos opening round blowout with Spur as they raced to an 86-42 win.

Junior Brent Gaines shot 74 percent from the field, scoring a team-high 32 points and grabbing six rebounds to pace the Broncos.

Clarendon built up a 27-7 first quarter lead and never looked back as Roy Williams connected on two three-pointers and a field goal while Dean Stanzione hit a trey and two buckets. Gaines started his scoring rampage in the first quarter with seven points.

Williams got the hot hand in the second quarter hitting 11 points, including two treys, as the Broncos en-

tered the locker room with a 51-22 advantage.

"They were letting us taking almost any shot we wanted," head coach Jimmy Avery said. "It was nice to have a less intense game after the schedule we've opened with this season. We just relaxed and shot the ball real well."

Scoring for the Broncos were Gaines, 32; Williams, 31; Stanzione, 9; Derek Shields, 3; Scott Bivens, 3; Jason Archuleta, 3; Scotty Elliott, 2; and Nathan Sears, 1.

The shots didn't fall as well for Clarendon Friday as they faced a tough Lorenzo squad. The Broncos shot 34 percent from the field.

The Hornets raced to a 16-9 first quarter advantage, but Clarendon rebounded and trailed 28-27 at halftime. Elliott's pair of treys sparked the Broncos before intermission.

Lorenzo outscored Clarendon 26-17 in the third period for a 54-44 lead after the end of three quarters.

Williams rattled off four field goals to lead the Broncos.

Lorenzo went to the line 17 times in the fourth quarter - 29 for the entire game and outscored the Broncos 17-16. Clarendon shot 13 times convert-

ing seven.

"We just could not get the ball to fall," Avery said. "I don't know how many times the ball circled around the goal and then just fell out. It was very frustrating. But the kids hustled, and that's the important part. I was proud of their effort."

Scoring for the Broncos were Williams, 17; Stanzione, 15; Gaines, 9; Archuleta, 8; Elliott, 6; Shields, 3; and Sears, 2.

Clarendon led several times during their third place game with Smyer, but Smyer edged Clarendon, 67-61, after the Broncos four starters fouled out, leaving four Clarendon players on the floor to finish the game.

"We had too many fouls," Avery said. "I think that kept some of us back at times. We always hustled though."

Roy Williams scored a team-high 26 points and grabbed 8 rebounds. Brent Gaines scored 14 points and grabbed 10 boards. Scotty Elliott had six assists and five steals - a career high.

Scoring for the Broncos were Williams, 26; Gaines, 14; Archuleta, 8; Sears, 4; Stanzione, 4; Shields, 3; and Elliott, 2.

## Bulldogs run over Hardin Simmons

The Clarendon College Bulldogs went 2-1 last week to boost their record to 8-6 before breaking for the Christmas holidays.

Their first game back will be Jan. 10 against Oklahoma Baptist College at 7:30 p.m. in the college gymnasium.

Clarendon used their transition game to build a 62-43 halftime lead before blowing out Hardin Simmons University's J.V. 117-92 in Abilene. Freshman Ryan Ross hit three treys and two field goals, and Jason Kinney, a sophomore out of Lubbock, had 11 points in the first half.

"With every possession we sprinted the ball down the floor," head coach Joe Mondragon said. "I think we finally got the identity that we're a transition team more than a set-up team."

Wendell Harris, a freshman from Hillsboro, had 12 points in the second half as Clarendon pushed the ball up the court.

"I was real impressed how we played," Mondragon said. "They brought four guys down from the varsity. They had some older kids than we did. It was a real good effort for them."

Scoring for the Bulldogs were Harris, 23; Ross, 20; Marlon Green, 20; Kinney, 17; Angel Otero, 14; Corey Fields, 7; Sam McLeod, 6; Kimmett Brigham, 6; Steven Browning, 2; and Antonio Williams, 2.

Clarendon opened up last weekend's homestand Coca-Cola Classic with a 106-85 win over Hardin Simmons University's Junior Varsity squad.

The Bulldogs were up 53-36 at halftime behind platooning by the Clarendon squad. Kinney and Bryan Shed led the Bulldogs with nine points

apiece.

"We had played them Monday (Dec. 2), and we just felt like we could play a lot of kids and get a lot of playing time."

Green hit a couple of threes for 11 points in the second half. Ross added 11 of his own to boost the Bulldogs.

Scoring for Clarendon were Green, 18; Ross, 13; Shed, 13; McLeod, 10; Kinney, 9; Harris, 8; Tony Clark, 8; Otero, 8; Williams, 7; Fields, 3; Brigham, 2; Kedrick Monson, 2; Jamie Carter, 2; Lawrence Bailey, 2; and Browning, 1.

Next up for Clarendon was Saturday's rematch with Amarillo's Athletes in Action, a team that had previously beaten the Bulldogs by two points.

The home team was up 54-46 at halftime. "We pushed the ball extremely hard," Mondragon said. "They're not a bunch of guys we felt could run. In the second half, they slowed it to a possession game and got the ball inside."

"We fouled them 20 times, and they took the lead midway through the second half."

A bright spot in the loss was the play of Green, the 6'3" sophomore out of Austin. He had a Clarendon College career-high 31 points through strong inside and outside play. "He had five threes in the first half," Mondragon said. "He was playing very aggressive and he was in a zone and never forced the issue."

Athletes in Action won, 106-99.

Scoring for Clarendon were Green, 31; Kinney, 17; Clark 14; Harris, 10; Shed, 10; Otero, 10; Fields, 5; and Carter, 2.

"I hope they'll stay in shape (over

## Cotton crop looks good; Cole has first bale

The first bale of cotton for 1996 belongs to Bob Cole and was ginned on October 23.

The bale was purchased by Con-

solidated Cotton Co. and sold for \$1 per pound. It had grade of 21-1, STPL -35, MIC -Base, Strength -29.1, and Loan -54.02.

As of Monday, Dec. 9, a total of 3,300 bales had been ginned at the Paymaster Gin in Lelia Lake.

Paymaster's Earl Shields reports that the quality of this year's crop is excellent. Some of the county's cotton will yield two bales per acre, Shields said.

Last year, local crops yielded an average of 3/4 bales per acre.

Shields says that overall Donley County cotton farmers should have a very good year.
