Compost Corner By Bob MeComber,
Recycling Coordthato
A compost pile may be started directly on the ground surface, using a container or structure which will save space, hasten decomposition, and keep the yard looking neat. The many options to composting can easily b The following easy steps
th contruct a simple pile:

1. Select a level area near a water source.
2. Apply a 3"-6" layer of rials such as branches, dead leaves straw, and twigs to allow air circula ion around he base of the heap. manure, sawdust, grass clippings manure, sawast, and kithen food damp, but not wet and sogegy An oc casional sprinkle of soil is also a wel come addition to this layer. Cutting or shredding the above ingredients helps speed the composting. The idea pile is 4 to 5 feet wide and high. Re member, when constructing your pile, grass clippings, manure) and browns (straw, leaves, woody ma of carbon and nitrogen in the pile which is food for the microorganisms. 4. Repeat steps 2 and 3 until the pile is sufficient in height. The ideal pile is 4 to 5 feet wide and high. Every couple of weeks, turn urning the pile more often makes compost faster.
A properly made heap will reach temperatures up to $160^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ in several days. During this time, you will no-
tice settlement in the pile. This is a good sign that your pile. is working properly The composting process may last from a few weeks to many months depending on the types of materials you use for compost, water requirements, and how often you turn the pile. Compost is ready for use when the decomposition process is completed. The compost will appear dark brown, crumbly, and will have an eafthy smell. Let the material sit a few extra days to stabilize it, then you may want to screen it through a $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ screen. Apply $1-3$ layers of comand shrubs. Treat your lawn by spreading $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ of sifted compost over a given area in the spring

SPRINGTIME has arrived, the season when some of the biggest fish of he year will be caught. Catching a lake record is rewarding, but each yea several anglers do not "officially" make the book because they fail to doci$t$ their catch
In Texas, the official keeper of the records is the Texas Parks and Wildiife Department. In order to be recognized, anglers must (1) weigh the legally caught fish on a Texas Department of Agriculture certified scale, (2) the full length of fish in relation to some object of recognizable dimension and finally, (4) fill out TPW Form \#79-N3200 within 60 days. Most marina have certified scales and some will even provide a camera.
