 receives sales tax paymentState Comptroller Bob Bullock sent checks totaling $\mathbf{5 6 8 . 8}$ million in local lax payments to the 991 cities that levy the one-percent local sales tax.
Overall, the checks represented large increases over city payments made last March, but Bullock warned that the increase resulted from the
way the city money was procescel way the city money was processed
and did not necessarily indicate anything about the economy. March checks represent taxes collected on sales made in January and reported
February 20 .
Donley County had a 1.39 percent increase. This is the first time in months that the county has been out of the minus column.
