tion plan for the land and have it approved by the local soil conservation district by December 31, 1989,
in order to remain eligible for many in order to remain eligibe for many
USDA farm program benefits. Producers who do not have an approved plan will be giving up
USDA program benefits on not USDA program benefits on not
only their highly erodible acres, but only their highly erodible acres, but
on all of the land they farm. Proon all of the land they farm. Pro-
gram benefits include not only price supports and commodity-related payments from ASCS, but
also federal crop insurance also federal crop insurance and
Farmers Home Administration loans.
If you have highly erodible cropland, you must have a conservation plan by December 31st, or you will be ineligible for farm pro-
gram participation until you have gram participation until you have a
