## tax Rellif?

If you are 65 or over and are paying school taxes on your residence homestead, you are eligible for an additional homestead exemption and a tax freeze.

Texas law provides for a standard $\$ 5,000$ exemption off the market value of a residence homestead for school tax purposes. If you are 65 or over, you are entitled to an additional $\$ 10,000$ exemption off the market value of your homestead. And, if you are entitled to the 65 or over exemption, the school taxes on your residence homestead cannot increase after you apply and qualify for this exemption, unless you make improvements to your homestead.

It is important to remember that these tax relief measures do not go into effect automatically You must file for the exemptions this year before May 1.
