## Important Meeting Set

Meetings with various community and school groups are being conducted this week with Tom Jarboe, consultant for Texas Association of School Boards, to develop a profile for the new superintendent for Clarendon Consolidated Independent School District. The Clarendon CISD school board desires to have input from all segments of the community regarding the qualities and qualifications people feel the superintendent should possess.

Groups and organizations have been contacted to attend profile meetings at specific times this week.

Any patron who is not involved or unable to attend any of these meetings is invited to attend a session at 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, January 21st in the High School Auditorium.

The gathering of input for the profile development will be culminate with the school board having their profile session on Thursday evening and TASB will finalize the profile of the candidates that will be sought for the position.

Deadline for applications will be March 19, 1993. The board will then conduct in depth interviews in finalizing the selection of the successful candidate. The tentative time line for the naming of the new superintendent is about April 20th.

## Texas and Rural Economies Up

Sales tax receipts mailed out in January (collected on November sales, and submitted in December), were up for the state as a whole, in spite of mediocre performance by the largest cities. John Sharp, State Comptroller, said "As a whole, Texas continues to outpace the nation in terms of economic growth."

Sales tax receipts for Donley County were up 41.91 per cent compared to the same period a year ago. Clarendon was up 24.24 per cent. Hedley and Howardwick were not calculated by the Comptroller's office due to their longer reporting period.

Houston, Dallas and Fort Worth were all down. Austin and San Antonio were up slightly. It appears that many rural economies were up.

There was a wide variety in the performance of various counties in this area. Armstrong County (Claude) was up 94.03 per cent. Briscoe was up 40.20 per cent with Silverton indicating a particularly strong growth at 69.2 per cent.

The City of Panhandle added a .5 per cent sales tax last year, so the figures for Carson County are not comparable. But Groom was up 45.74 per cent, while Skellytown and White Deer were both down, 5.48 and 10.55 per cent respectively.

Childress was up 22.7 per cent. Wellington increased its sales tax rate last year by .5 per cent, so its figures do not compare.

Gray County figures were skewed by a tax increase in Pampa. But LeFors was off by 1.7 per cent, while McLean reported a 95.92 per cent increase.

Hall County, likewise, had a sales tax increase, so its figures were not comparable. (Memphis went from a 1 per cent city sales tax to a 1.5 per cent figure). Estelline was down by 21.65, while Turkey was down 18.03 per cent.

Hemphill County did not have a happy November. Sales slipped in Canadian by 29.11 per cent. Merchants in Miami must have hustled, since Roberts County reported an increase of 60.60 per cent.

Potter and Randall Counties chalked up slight gains, 4.32 and .56 for each.

## Mail Fraud Alert-2 cent Scam

Dallas/Fort Worth, Tx- The Postal Inspection Service is warning consumers today not to fall prey to a nationwide mail order scam

that is encouraging the underpayment of first-class postage. Promoters of the mail order scam are selling an information package at a cost ranging from \$5 to \$100 that describes how to mail first-class letters for 2 cents, rather than the current rate of 29 cents. The scheme is designed to bilk the postal customer out of their money using inaccurate and out-of-date information says Inspector in Charge D.C. Strader.

The information packages cite Title 39, United States Code, Section 4253, as a legal basis for the 2 cent first-class rate. Inspector Strader advises that this section was eliminated in August 1970 under the Postal Reorganization Act. The current first-class rate is 29 cents for the first ounce or fraction of an ounce.

Unfortunately, some letters bearing only a 2 cent stamp have been delivered without collection of the deficient postage, and that has given credence to the claims made by the promoters of this fraudulent scheme. This is because most mail is processed through automated equipment, and not because it is legal to mail at the 2 cent rate. Postal Inspectors investigating this scheme have filed administrative and criminal complaints against the promoters. It is our goal to protect the Postal Ser-

vice from loss of revenue and to stop this fraudulent promotion, says Inspector Strader.

Postal employees have been alerted to the scam and are being instructed to check first-class mail for appropriate postage. Any mail carrying less than 29 cents will be delivered with a charge for the amount due as required by postal regulations.

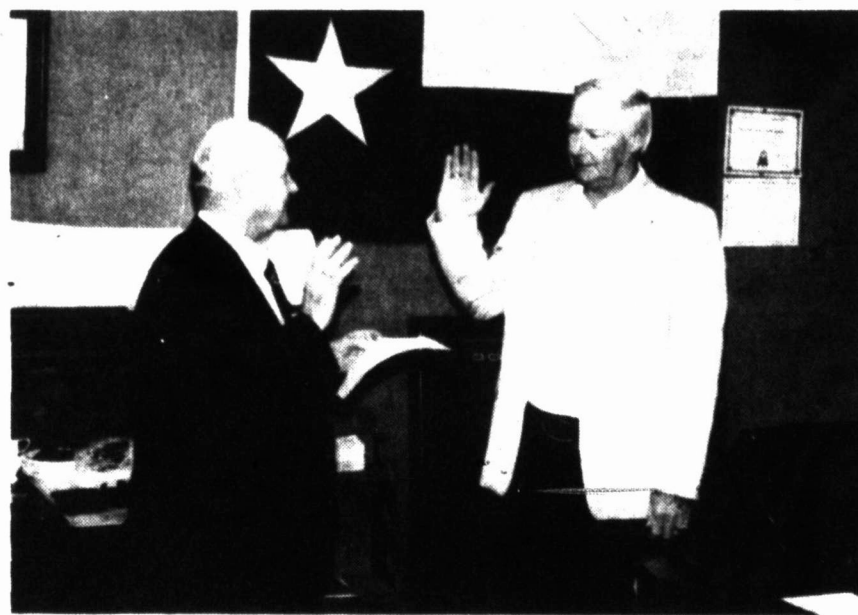

Through close-up portraits of girls engaged in a variety of Girl Scout activities, the boxes depict the supportive, "girls only" environment in which girls practice new skills, establish lasting friendships, learn from positive female role models and have fun. National studies have shown that a single-sex setting helps girls develop the self-esteem and confidence needed to grow into resourceful, happy citizens.

Each box features a message from a girl, sharing her views on a Girl Scout experience. One girl's message about aerobic exercise experience says, "our Girl Scout leader must be double jointed. She can bend in every direction. Okay, so maybe I can't wrap my leg around my neck, but I'm having a great time anyway!"

The boxes were designed by acclaimed graphic designer Saul Bass, of Bass/Yager & Associates, Los Angeles, California. The award-winning Bass, whose designs include logos for such major corporations as AT&T, Exxon, and United Airlines, also created the Girl Scout service mark in 1978.

Cookie-selling is a voluntary activity involving approximately 1,000,000 girls and 400,000 adult volunteers across the country. 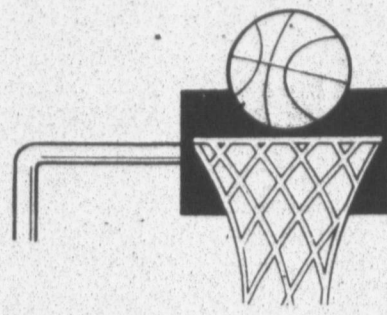

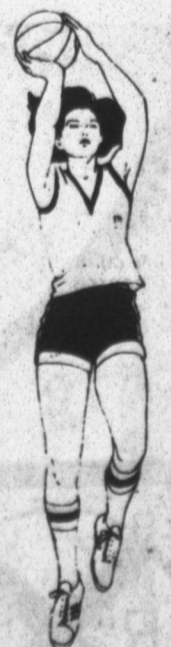

## Social Security News

### The Differences Between Medicare and Medicaid

You've hear of Medicare. And you've probably heard the term, Medicaid. Is there a difference?

The answer is yes... and although there also are similarities between the two programs, many people use the two words interchangeably and this can lead to problems.

Both Medicare and Medicaid are government-sponsored health care programs and both help pay medical bills. But there aren't many other similarities after that and the eligibility rules for each are very different.

Medicare is the health insurance program that's tied into the Social Security program (although

it is possible to get Medicare without being on Social Security). Most people know it by the terms Part A and Part B, which refer to what are commonly called the hospital (A) and doctor's (B) parts of Medicare. Part A is paid for by a portion of the Social Security taxes you pay while working. Part B is paid for by the monthly premiums of those who enroll. You can get Medicare if you're 65 or older or if you've been getting Social Security disability benefits for two years. Some people with permanent kidney disease also qualify for Medicare. People getting Social Security are automatically enrolled in Medicare when they turn 65 or 24 months after they started getting disability benefits. Those not already getting Social Security benefits need to contact the Social Security office before their 65th birthday to sign up for Medicare.

Medicaid is a health care program that's tied into a person's economic circumstances. Generally, you qualify for Medicaid if you have a low income and few assets.

For example, most people who get Supplemental Security Income (SSI) usually qualify for Medicaid. Medicaid is financed through general tax revenues - not through Social Security taxes. To apply for Medicaid, you should contact Department of Human Services, Amarillo.

Some people qualify for both Medicare and Medicaid. But sometimes, people who have only Medicare confuse Part B of that program with Medicaid coverage. For example, a woman visiting our office recently told me she had "Medicare Part A and Medicaid Part B." I knew she really meant she had both Parts A and B of Medicare, but if she were to tell the same thing to a doctor's billing clerk, it could lead to problems.

One way to tell which program you have is by the identification card you were issued. The Medicare card is white with a red and blue strip running across the top.

## Check It Out

Parents, do you have a graduating student who has not taken the required Scholastic Aptitude test (SAT) yet? If assistance for studying for the test is necessary, Samuel C. Brownstein, former chairman of Science Department at George W. Wingate High School in Brooklyn, New York, and Mitchel Weiner, former member of English Department at Brooklyn's James Madison High School, have authored the book, **How To Prepare For SAT** which is currently in Burton Memorial Library's reference section. The book contains seven full length exam patterns with carefully explained answers; in depth verbal and math preparations which include strategies and exercises that help master each type of question; a 3000 word vocabulary builder; and a review of standard written English.

Patsy Check, high school counselor, informs me that these exams are given at Amarillo College. Application forms, which may be secured from her office, are necessary, and registration for the test is required a month in advance of the testing date. We appreciate her providing the following dates: Registration date is February 19 for the March 27 test; registration date is March 26 for May 1 test; registration date is April 30 for June 5 test.

Also in Burton Memorial Library is the book, **How to Prepare For The GED** by the same authors. Librarian, May Green, tells me that this book is in much demand. The GED is a high school equivalency examination. Since high school completion is becoming more important in our society, we are fortunate in this area that the GED may be taken at Clarendon College. This exam is given on the first Tuesday and Wednesday of every month. You need only to call counselor, Ruth Robinson (874-3571), for an appointment. Ruth is a very helpful and encouraging person. During our interesting conversation, she told me that more people are continuing to take the GED, and there is definitely no age limit. She has given the test to all ages from 17 to 72, and one out of three often make decisions to go to college. Several who are already successful in their employment, but have found a certificate of high school completion necessary, have also taken the GED. Citizens of our community can be very proud of this opportunity that Clarendon College offers and of people like Ruth Robinson with which to work.

## Dear Editor,

The result of the January 16, 1993 school election for abolishment of the Alanreed Independent School District was a total of 52 votes. 38 votes For and 14 Against the issue.

In accordance with the Texas Education Code, the commissioners courts of Donley and Gray County will canvass the returns. Each commissioners court will set a date and meet to annex the territory of the abolishment ISD in its county to one or more contiguous districts in the county. There are approximately 89 square miles in Donley County and 92 square miles in Gray County. The school districts receiving the territory will assume the assets and liabilities of the district. The effective date of transfer will be July 1, 1993. Alanreed ISD will continue as an Independent School District until July, 1993.

What about the community of Alanreed? The community doesn't want to lose its identity or existence and without a school that

becomes a possible reality. The commissioners court that is responsible for annexing the territory of the district, that area where the school buildings and other facilities are located, should consider not only where the students should attend school, but also the community affairs. Community affairs include a meeting every month of the Community Improvement Association (a pot-luck evening meal and Meeting), a polling place for voting, club meetings and programs, Alanreed Cemetery Association meetings, a place to take care of the families during periods of bereavement, and the annual homecoming. The 57th Annual Homecoming will be the second Sunday in June, 1993. The decision made by the commissioners court may be one that decides the existence and future of Alanreed Community.

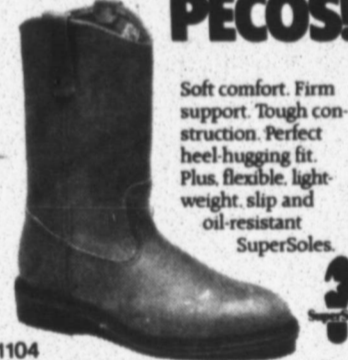
