The Texas Department of Health has scheduled an immunization clinic in Clarendon, November 12th, from 9 to 12 noon and from 1-3 p.m., on the second floor of the Old Courthouse, 300 S. Sully.

The clinic will offer vaccines that give protection against several childhood diseases including polio, diphtheria, lock jaw (tetanus), whooping cough (pertussis), measles, rubella, mumps, and haemophilus influenzae type B. Influenza vaccine will be offered to the elderly and chronically ill.

The Texas Department of Health is charging money to help with the cost of keeping the clinic open. The amount of money charged will be based on family income and size, and the ability to pay.

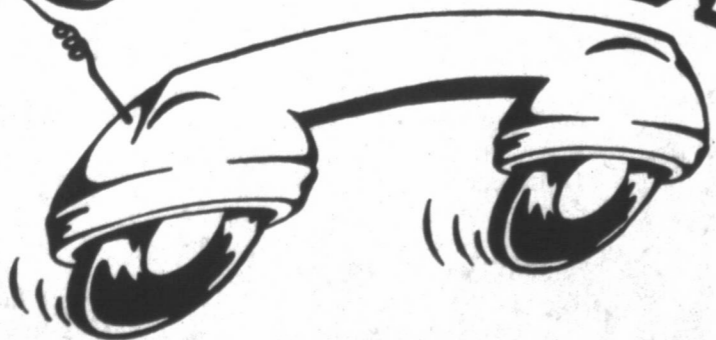

Public Notice

On July 1, 1991, Southwestern Bell Telephone filed an application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas that proposes to delete Paragraph 3.4(G) from Section 3 of Southwestern Bell's intrastate Access Service Tariff, which concerns credits where a customer uses Switched Access Service to furnish a service which has been defined to be an exchange service. The application was assigned Docket No. 10463.

Because Southwestern Bell is not aware of any customers who presently use switched access service to furnish an exchange service, Southwestern Bell does not believe its revenues will be affected. However, certain interexchange carrier customers of switched access service have made claims under the aforementioned tariff. Such customers, but only to the extent they provide an exchange service using switched access, would be affected by this application. Based on claims made for credits (assuming such credits were allowable), Southwestern Bell's revenues would be affected by no more than \$1,168,962 annually, which is .037 percent of the Company's adjusted revenue for the 12-month period ending December 31, 1990. It is not possible to know how many interexchange carriers might believe themselves entitled to credits, but 189 carriers have registered with the Commission pursuant to PUC Substantive Rule 23.61.

The tariff, after suspension, is proposed to be effective May 1, 1992.

Persons who wish to intervene or otherwise participate in these proceedings should notify the Commission as soon as possible, but no later than November 15, 1991. A request to intervene, participate, or for further information should be mailed to the Public Utility Commission of Texas, 7800 Shoal Creek Blvd., Suite 400N, Austin, Texas 78757. 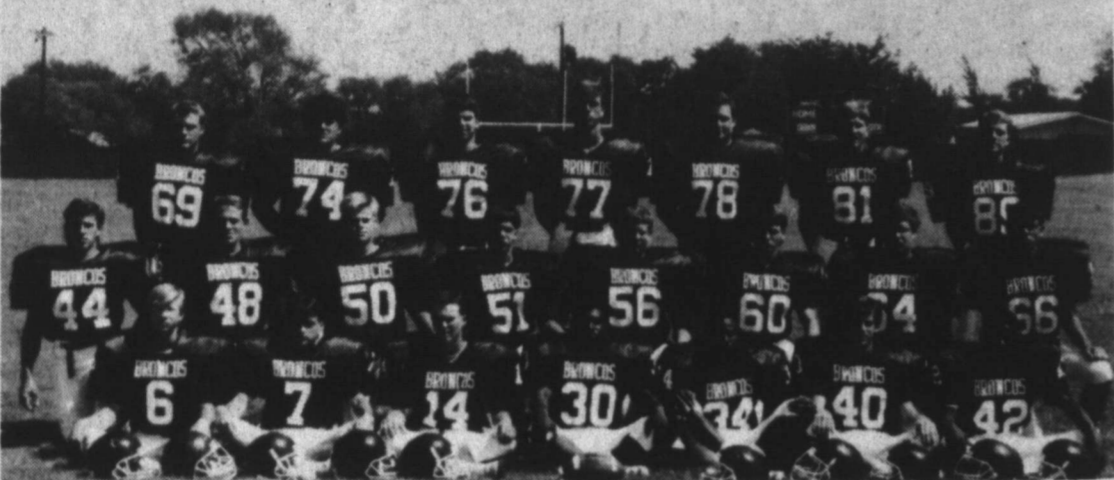

On October 18, 1991, Southwestern Bell Telephone Company filed an application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas to add a new optional service offering called SmartTrunk™ Service. The application has been assigned Tariff Control No. 10687.

SmartTrunk Service provides access between the customer's premises and the serving Southwestern Bell central office for circuit-switched voice and data communications. This communication capability is provided where facilities are available using Integrated Services Digital Network architecture. ISDN services available with SmartTrunk Service use Primary Rate Interface (PRI) technology. SmartTrunk Service requires PRI ISDN compatible Private Branch Exchange (PBX) customer provided equipment registered under FCC Part 68 Rules. SmartTrunk Service employs a 1.544 Mbps facility (denoted as SmartTrunk Interface) typically divided into twenty-three B channels and one D channel. B channels are used for voice and data communications while the D channel provides out-of-band signaling.

If approved by the Commission, the rates for each SmartTrunk Interface facility will be \$1,110 per month under a 36-month service contract or \$1,010 per month under a 60-month service contract. The proposed rate for the use of the central office varies from \$12.25 up to \$18.90 per month for each B channel depending on the rate group classification which is determined by the customer's location. Southwestern Bell estimates revenue of \$2.8 million from this offering during the first year.

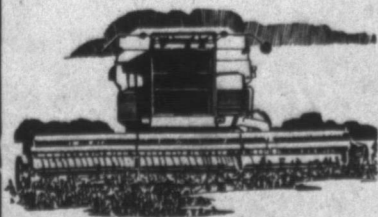

OCTOBER 22, 1991

The Board of Aldermen of the City of Clarendon met in regular session on October 22, 1991, in the Board Room, City Hall at 7:00 p.m.

Members present: Mayor James Sharrar, Aldermen Bobbie Kidd, McKinley Smith, James Kuhn, and David Pitts.

Members absent: Alderman Steve Smith.

Others present: City Secretary Sue Howard, Walt Knorpp, Ed Thames, Ernie Johnston, and San Thompson.

Minutes of the October 10, 1991, meeting were read, and upon a motion by Alderman James Kuhn, seconded by Alderman McKinley Smith, said minutes were approved. Motion carried.

The Mayor, James Sharrar, gave a report on the meeting attended by Mayor Sharrar, Alderman David Pitts, and City employee Ernie Johnston given by PRPC on information concerning solid waste.

Considering this is Drug Free Week, the City of Clarendon posted a policy concerning the City's position on Drug Free Work Place. Drug testing was discussed for City employees.

Motion was made by Alderman Bobbie Kidd, seconded by Alderman David Pitts, to buy the City Hall two reconditioned typewriters, not to exceed \$700.00. Motion carried.

The Texas Department of Transportation, Division of Aviation, "Aviation Facilities Development Rules" require that as a condition of receiving state financial assistance, an airport sponsor shall adopt, revise as necessary and enforce comprehensive airport zoning regulations to restrict the use of land and the height of structures adjacent to or in the immediate vicinity of the airport.

Motion was made by Alderman James Kuhn, seconded by Alderman McKinley Smith, to adopt the following ordinance. Motion carried.

ORDINANCE NO. 290

An Ordinance creating a joint airport zoning board and investing such joint airport zoning board with the powers such boards are authorized to exercise under the provisions of the Airport Zoning Act, Tex. Local Gov't. Code Ann., 241.001 et seq (Vernon 1988).

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF CLARENDON, TEXAS:

Section 1. Subject to the like provisions being made by the Commissioners Court of Donley County, Texas by proper ordinance and order, duly promulgated and entered on their minutes, and as authorized by the provisions of the Airport Zoning Act, Tex. Local Gov't. Code Ann., 241.001 et seq (Vernon 1988), there is hereby created a joint airport zoning board to be known as the Clarendon-Donley County Joint Airport Zoning Board, which board shall have the powers and exercise the

duties set forth in Tex. Local Gov't. Code Ann., 241.002, 241.011, 241.012, and 241.014 (Vernon 1988).

Section 2. The Clarendon-Donley County Joint Airport Zoning Board shall be composed of five (5) members, two members to be appointed by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Clarendon, Texas and two members to be appointed by the Commissioners Court of Donley County, Texas. The fifth (5th) member shall be elected by a majority of the members so appointed and said fifth member shall serve as Chairman of the said Clarendon-Donley County Joint Airport Zoning Board.

Section 3. Steve Smith and David Pitts are hereby appointed as the City's members on said Clarendon-Donley County Joint Airport Zoning Board.

Section 4. Whereas, the immediate operation of the provisions of this ordinance is necessary for the preservation of the public health, public safety, and general welfare, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Board of Aldermen and its reading and posting as required by law.

Enacted and passed this 22nd day of October, 1991, at a regular meeting of the Board of Aldermen of the City of Clarendon, Texas by the following vote: four members voting Aye, and no members voting Nay.

The Donley County Industrial Foundation, represented by Walt Knorpp, discussed with the Board the revitalization of downtown Clarendon. Reinvestment zoning was discussed for future consideration of the Board of Aldermen. No action was taken at this time.

Motion was made by Alderman David Pitts, seconded by Alderman James Kuhn, to contact Gordon Maddox and order an audit. Motion carried.

Questions were raised about the accounting being done on the computer. City Secretary Sue Howard was instructed to call and see how much it would cost to find help with the program.

San Thompson met with the Board of Aldermen to ask for money to pay advertising for the November Trades Days. No action was taken at this time.

Ed Thames from Amarillo Waste Management discussed the solid waste hauling with the Board of Aldermen. Discussion followed but no action was taken at this time.

There being no further City business at this time, motion was made to adjourn by Alderman David Pitts, seconded by Alderman McKinley Smith. Motion carried.

Due to the rural nature of our area, many Panhandle residents lack actual street addresses. The 9-1-1 database allows rural residents the opportunity to provide directions to aid emergency response teams in locating them.

Another obstacle faced is updating the existing 9-1-1 database with new arrivals in the area and changes in telephone numbers and addresses. These changes may occur yearly, monthly, or daily. To ensure that the information provided to emergency response teams is current and accurate, they must rely upon the citizens of the Panhandle to notify them regarding these changes. Following is a questionnaire which may be filled out and returned to the Panhandle Regional 9-1-1 Network, P.O. Box 9257, Amarillo, Texas 79101-9257.

PUBLIC NOTICE

On April 16, 1991, GTE Corporation ("GTE") and Contel Corporation ("Contel") filed a joint petition for declaratory relief with respect to the obligations or requirements of GTE or Contel and/or any of its subsidiaries relating to the merger of GTE and Contel. GTE and Contel have requested a ruling from the Public Utility Commission of Texas that neither GTE nor Contel is required to report the merger of GTE and Contel pursuant to Section 63 of the Public Utility Regulatory Act ("PURA"), TEX. REV. CIV. STAT. ANN. art. 1446c (Vernon Supp. 1991), that no investigation of the merger by the Commission is required. In the alternative, GTE and Contel seek a determination that the merger is consistent with the public interest.

In reaching its determination, the Commission shall take into consideration the reasonable value of the property, facilities or securities to be acquired, disposed of, merged or consolidated. If the Commission finds that the merger is not in the public interest, the Commission shall take the effect of the transaction into consideration in GTE Southwest Incorporated's and Contel of Texas, Inc.'s next ratemaking proceeding and disallow the effect of such transaction if it will unreasonably affect rates or services.

This filing has been assigned Docket No. 10212. Persons who wish to intervene or otherwise participate in these proceedings should notify the Commission.
