Our widow was married twice, but she had never looked
into the possibility of getting Social Security benefits on her first husband's account, After her second husband died, her wife benefit was automatically con-
verted to a widow's benefit by a computer that tid not know she'd been married twice. If we had interviewed her for a widow's benefit
application, we would have found application, we would have found
that she was eligible on two records and paid her the biggest amoun. When the widow came to our of fice, we checked her first husband's
record and found that she could get record and found that she could get
almost twice as much on his ac


Unfortunately, many women do not realize that they can get
benefits from a previous marriage, benefits from a previous marriage,
under certain circumstances. If the marriage ended in death or if the couple divorced after at least 10 years of marriage, Social
benefits may be payable. When a woman applies for consider the benefits she could receive at the time. If her marital
status changes later because of death, divorce, or remarriage of woman should contact Social security again. That way she can make sure she is receiving the
highest benefit amount possible. While the rules covering So-
cial Security eligibility apply equalcial Security eligibility apply equal
ly to women and men, almost all lo to women and men, almost all
beneficiaries who receive benefits on a former spouse's record are women. Some men worry that their own Social Security benefit or their
current wife's benefit will be lower if a former spouse applies for benefits on their record. Neither one of these will happen. Both a current spouse and a former spouse can get full benefits simul-
taneously.

To find out if you are eligible for Social Security benefits on your fice. We will need to know your former spouse's Social Security number, your number, and any other Social Security number you
receive benefits on now. If you don't know the Social Security number, we can find it through our
