A new bill in the Texas legislature would take away the 100th District Court and give it to Houston. That would mean more criminals loose

Last year the 100th District Court--with one judge--settled 1059 cas from Carson, Childress, Collingsworth, Donley and Hall Counties. By comparison, the 31st District Court in Gray, Hemphill, Lipscomb, Roberts
and Wheeler Counties, with two judges and a far larger population, handled only 1375 cases. (Gray county alone has a larger population than all the Ochiltree Counties, coompleted 1190 cases, with two judges. Briscoe, Dickens, Floyd and Motley counties had 933 cases finished by their judge in the 110th district court.
