

County must act to increase deputies' pay

It seems like just yesterday that the county budget was the hottest news in town. Now it's déjà vu all over again as supporters of the Donley County Sheriff's Department line up to call for higher salaries for our local peace officers.

It is a proven fact that while Donley County has one of the best sheriff's departments in our section of the state, it is also one of the lowest paid. Local deputies make only \$18,680 in gross income annually. By the time taxes and retirement are taken out, that total drops to less than \$16,000 in take home pay. At last check, Sheriff Blackburn is the fourth lowest paid sheriff in Texas, earning just a little more than \$20,000 per year.

We're getting much more than we pay for. Four of the officers in Blackburn's department have the highest level of certification available to Texas peace officers, and the years of experience in Blackburn's department are above and beyond most comparable counties. The record of cases cleared in the last year is remarkable also

What keeps these highly qualified men working here must be nothing more than a love for Donley County. They could move almost anywhere and be paid more and receive greater appreciation. Sheriff Blackburn struggles to recruit and keep top-notch lawmen, but it is hard to compete when he can't offer good salaries.

It's sad to say, but even Briscoe County pays \$4,000 more than Donley does. And folks, there is absolutely nothing in that county.

One deputy has reportedly already been offered a job elsewhere that pays \$40,000. You couldn't blame him if he jumped at the chance, but what holds him back is that he likes it here.

Now, no one is proposing that the county double deputies' pay. But we simply must do better than we have been. A paltry one- or two-percent raise isn't going to cut it. The increase must be significant.

The question becomes not whether our lawmen should be paid more, but where the money will come from. The answer, as stated in Monday's commissioners' court meeting by Jim Cockerham and Paul Bell, is to

Clarendon EDC considers help for motel

The Clarendon Economic Development Corp. met on August 6 for a regular monthly meeting. Jimmy Sindha gave a report on how the new motel is progressing. Jimmy said that the new motel would be a 50 bed Best Western motel, and they plan on opening it in March of 2003. Jimmy asked the EDC for help with the franchise fees and with a tax abatement. After a long discussion, the Board decided to work on an incentive package for the motel. The Board tentatively agreed to a \$31,000 payment to be used for architect fees. The details of the grant are to be worked out with EDC attorney and me. We will also work on the tax abatement after the property is in the Motel's name.

We also discussed paving the area across from the Post Office. This would be a good place for visitors to Kearney Street to park. It would also help with the College students attending the new nursing school this fall. The EDC will look at helping the city with their paving project, starting with the new budget year.

The Board did approve a request for DeeDee and me to attend a state law mandated training course. DeeDee gave her monthly report.

The new web page is up and running. There are several changes to be made, but it is a good start. Please give it a look and give us your input. The address is www.clarendonedc.org. The front page will change monthly with a featured business or project. We are also working up an inventory of all available buildings and properties to put on the web. Ideas are being gathered for downtown renovation projects. We need your input!

Update on the Mulkey. The senior partner, Bob Altman, has advised that he is not in favor of giving the Mulkey to the EDC. He would like to sell it for \$45,000. If anyone would like to purchase it, call me, and I will give you his phone number. It is a shame to see the building just sit there. There are grants to restore the building, but we have not found one that would purchase it.



Tobacco lawyer's stalling invites suspicion

Chief Appraiser Paula Lowrie has presented the county with what could be a solution to this situation. The county can levy a special "debt component" tax rate to pay down debt. The exact figure hasn't been calculated yet, but it is thought that a special tax rate of seven-cents per hundred-dollar valuation would generate enough income to make the annual payment on the note which finances the courthouse restoration. That rate would cost a taxpayer with a \$50,000 home just \$35 per year and would free up a little more than \$100,000 in the general budget, which could then be spent on other priorities.

The county has pretty well tightened its belt as much as it can go. Now it needs more income to really take care of business effectively. The commissioners have the tool before them to bring in more income. They must simply find the political will and the intestinal fortitude to use it.

This will be unpopular, and there can be no doubt that as soon as this issue hits the streets, there will be the shrill cries from the "don't raise taxes" crowd. "We're a poor county," they will say. "All our people are old and on fixed incomes," they will whine. Frankly, both arguments have become repetitive to the point of being nauseating. The time has come for Donley County to be educated to the fact that taxes must be raised for the county to fulfill its legal duties and to provide the services that our citizens want and need.

Being a deputy sheriff in Donley County must surely be like working for Scrooge. All our "Marleys" ask for is an extra lump of coal, and all they are given is the cold shoulder and a scowl. Our lawmen deserve more than further lessons in frugality.

Certainly, similar statements could be made about any employee in the county. They are all grossly underpaid. Their jobs are all vastly different, however, from those in the sheriff's office. I don't know of any deputy county clerks, for instance, who wear bulletproof vests. I certainly haven't seen any headlines about a county road hand getting shot. Not many tax assessors are killed in the line of duty.

Almost every employee of the county has a reasonable degree of certainty that they will go home at the end of the day. But in a lawman's mind and in the minds of his loved ones, there is always some nagging doubt. A higher salary won't alleviate that doubt, but it would show that the citizens of this county value that lawman's life and the commitment he is making to us.

After September 11, policemen and firemen became heroes all across America and rightly so. Our local firemen are volunteers. Their service is invaluable to this community, and they expect no pay for their time and the risks they take. But our lawmen are not volunteers. They are trying to make a living by protecting you and mc and the guy next door. They are trying to provide for their families, and they are working to improve the quality of life in Donley County by stamping out drugs and curtailing crime

Any one of them would lay down his life for one of us. Is it really too much to ask that we lay down a few dollars for them so they can earn a decent living?

Do you solemnly swear to tell the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth, so help you God?

Five personal injury lawyers hired by the State of Texas are fighting tooth and nail against having to hear those words as they begin testifying under oath how they engineered a deal that paid them a \$3.3 billion legal fee in the Texas tobacco litigation. In fact, it required three years, thousands of hours of legal work, and a decision by the United States Supreme Court to make these five lawyers explain how they got their \$150,000-plus an hour sweetheart deal.

When Big Tobacco settled Texas' lawsuit for more than \$17 billion, I would have thought these lawyers would be eager to reveal the details of their victory. Instead, they simply took the money and ran. Even current Texas Attorney General John Cornyn, the state's top lawyer whose duty and responsibility it is to examine these questions on behalf of his clients - the people of Texas - has been unable to get answers in a state court proceeding from the men who were supposed to be working for us, the taxpayers. John Cornyn has pursued these matters with determination and diligence, even at his own political peril in the face of a well-financed and sophisticated public relations campaign against him.

Why are they fighting so desperately to avoid answering questions about this deal? Is it because the entire mess reeks of ethical problems and conflicts of interest? For example, three prominent lawyers, one former President of the Texas Bar Association, have made sworn statements that they were asked, but refused, to make a \$1 million payment in order to join this team of private attorneys working for the state. The spouse of one of the lawyers picked for the case even swore in a deposition that her then-husband bragged about paying money to get the lawsuit. Or take the issue of the actual contract, which was changed numerous times, while the lawsuit was going on. And how about the \$40 million in "legal expenses" that were rung up and reimbursed even though the case was a near exact duplicate of other state tobacco lawsuits?

But perhaps the worst of all is the allegation that the lawyers actually sold out their own clients. A consistent refrain from the lawyers, and even from some in the media, is that the legal fee was paid by Big Tobacco, and it did not come from the

proceeds of the settlements, so it did not diminish the amounts received by Texans. However, this claim, on its face, appears to be false. It is clear that the tobacco companies did not care if their funds went to help children or to pay the plaintiff trial lawyers. It is very possible that the lawyers made off with billions of dollars that should actually have gone to Texas hospitals and health care programs, instead of buying more private jets, mansions, and seaside vacation homes for personal injury lawyers. In other words, it's not only that they made off with an outrageous and possibly unethical legal fee, it was probably our money that they made off with!

These are not minor matters - some of the questions are criminal in nature. Yet these issues have never been adequately investigated, and until recently it appeared that they never would be. Now, if a Harris County court orders it, the oath will be administered and the hard questions will be asked. If these lawyers admit wrongdoing, then the consequences of their conduct will expose them to huge monetary liability. If they lie, they risk detection and subsequent criminal prosecution for perjury. If they refuse to answer the questions based on the Fifth Amendment right against self-incrimination, a civil-jury (as opposed to a criminal jury) may assume that their refusal to answer is evidence of their guilt.

So it is really no surprise that these five plaintiff trial lawyers fought to escape General Cornyn's questions all the way to the United States Supreme Court. But they lost - and now it is time for them to answer some very important questions:

Did these trial lawyers pay money to the former Attorney General in order to receive their contract to represent the State of Texas in the tobacco litigation?

Did these trial lawyers lie about the amount and type of expenses they incurred in the case?

Did these trial lawyers have a conflict of interest that they failed to disclose to their client, the State of Texas?

Did these trial lawyers breach their fiduciary duties to the taxpayers of the State of Texas?


If these lawyers have done nothing wrong, it is inexplicable that they would take such extreme measures to avoid answering these types of questions under oath. Yet now the trial lawyers are stalling again, alleging that this is "political season" and everything should be put on hold until after the upcoming November election. This is a particularly disingenuous argument since it has been their own stalling tactics that has pushed this issue into the political season. Perhaps they believe their best hope is that a newly elected Attorney General might drop the inquiry

That would be a travesty. These are important questions that may affect our state's ability to fund education for our children, and health care for our disadvantaged. Let's quit stalling. Stop the delaying tactics. Let the depositions begin and let the truth come out.
