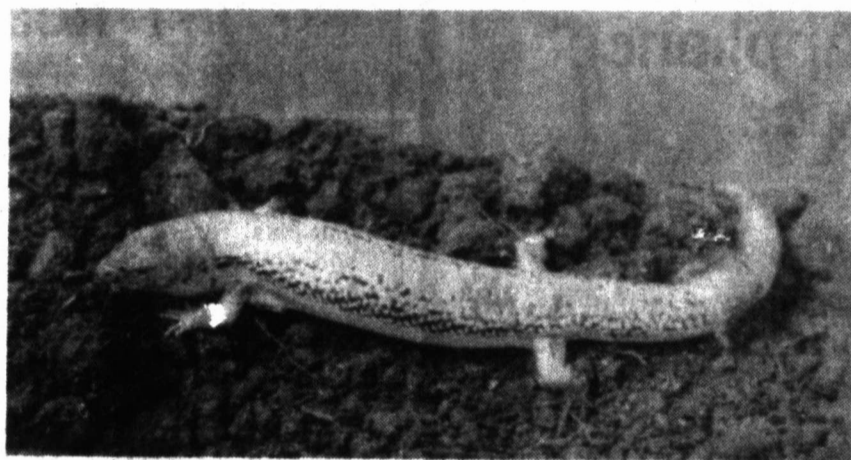
## Lizard Captured

## College To Host Elderhostel

Clarendon College will host an Elderhostel program on its Clarendon campus June 9th through June 15th. Participants from eight states, as far away as Maryland, have enrolled.

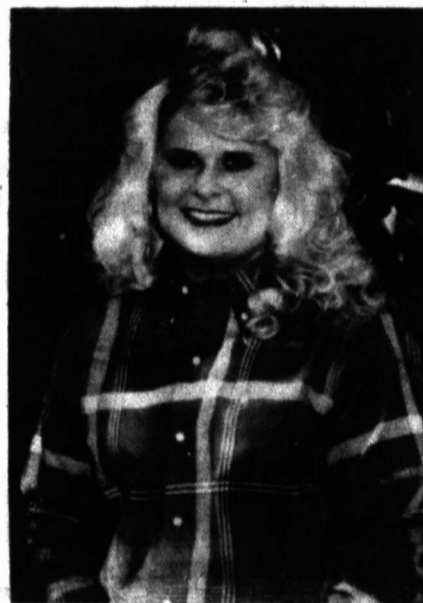

## Operation Bootstrap Set

Operation Bootstrap, an innovative HUD housing program providing rental assistance to unemployed or underemployed families was recently awarded to Panhandle Community Services. The ultimate goal is to assist persons currently enrolled (or wish to enroll) complete their post-secondary education and acquire the necessary skills to obtain and retain employment at a wage rate that will allow the family to become self-sufficient. Qualified Texas Panhandle residents must be certified eligible for HUD housing assistance, will receive a needs assessment, and will be tested both vocationally and motivationally. Successful candidates must be able to complete their education within a two year period; and will be selected by a local coordinating body. ## Mid-Year Crop and Livestock Reports Given

Austin: With land preparations and spring planting getting underway across the state, Texas producers are gearing up for another year, and one of the most important production inputs a producer can use in determining production and marketing plans is the mid-year crop and livestock reports released by the Texas Agricultural Statistics Service.

Beginning June 1, representatives from the Texas office will begin contacting farmers and ranchers across the state to help set the 1991 planted acreage estimates

and mid-year livestock inventories. "Information from these surveys will provide Texas producers with solid facts and figures they can use when making their plans for the coming year," state statistician Dennis Findley reported.

"The surveys will be very important this year because they will be the first accurate measure of the impact of participation in the 1990 government farm bill," he added.

Individual reports will be combined with other reports to set state estimates. Results of the confidential interviews, conducted by telephone or in person by field enumerators, will be published later this summer. The 1991 acreage estimates will be released June 27, while the mid-year cattle inventory will be released July 29.

These surveys are important production tools, and good, overall participation will give producers an accurate view of where Texas agriculture stands.

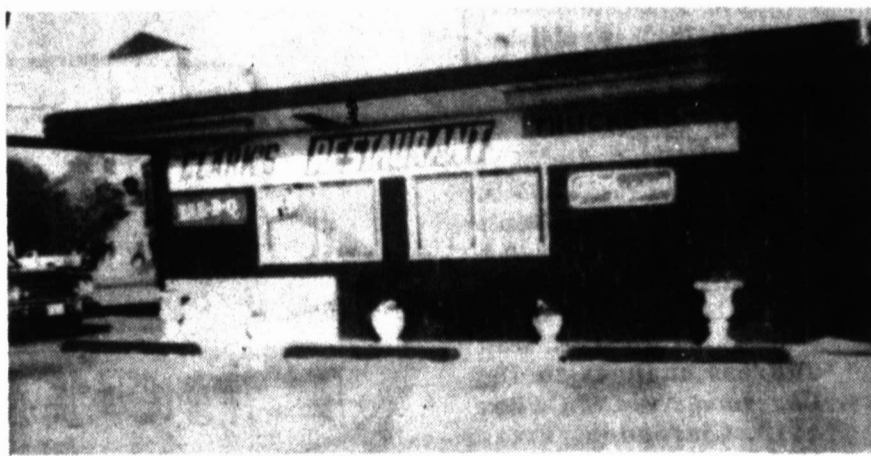

**Local Selected Eminent Scholar**

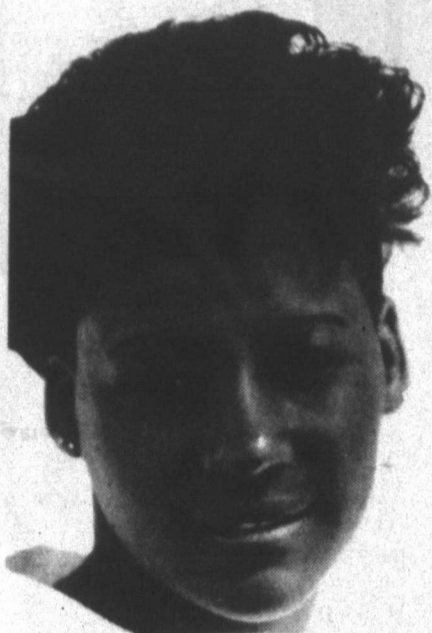
The Joseph Baldwin Academy for Eminent Young Scholars recently notified Amanda Ballard of her acceptance for the first summer session.

**Best Times to Take Medicines**

Many drug products seem to work best and/or cause fewer problems when taken at specific times of the day, with food, or without food. Because each medicine is unique, ask your pharmacist about the best time of day or night to take your medicines.

Diuretics ("water pills") can disrupt sleep and produce inconvenient trips to the bathroom if they are taken too close to bedtime. When prescribed for once-a-day dosing, mornings or afternoons are considered the best times to take these medicines.

Many antibiotics (infection fighters) often are prescribed to be taken before meals when the stomach is empty. One of the primary reasons for taking antibiotics without food is to produce higher antibiotic blood levels.

Arthritis medicines occasionally are upsetting to the stomach and may be prescribed to be taken "with meals" or when the stomach is full. Food provides a cushion on which these medicines fall.

Certain heart medicines are prescribed to be given at 8, 12, or 24 hour intervals. These precise dosing times should be followed in order to help ensure that the medicine is present in the bloodstream at the desired concentration at all times of the day.

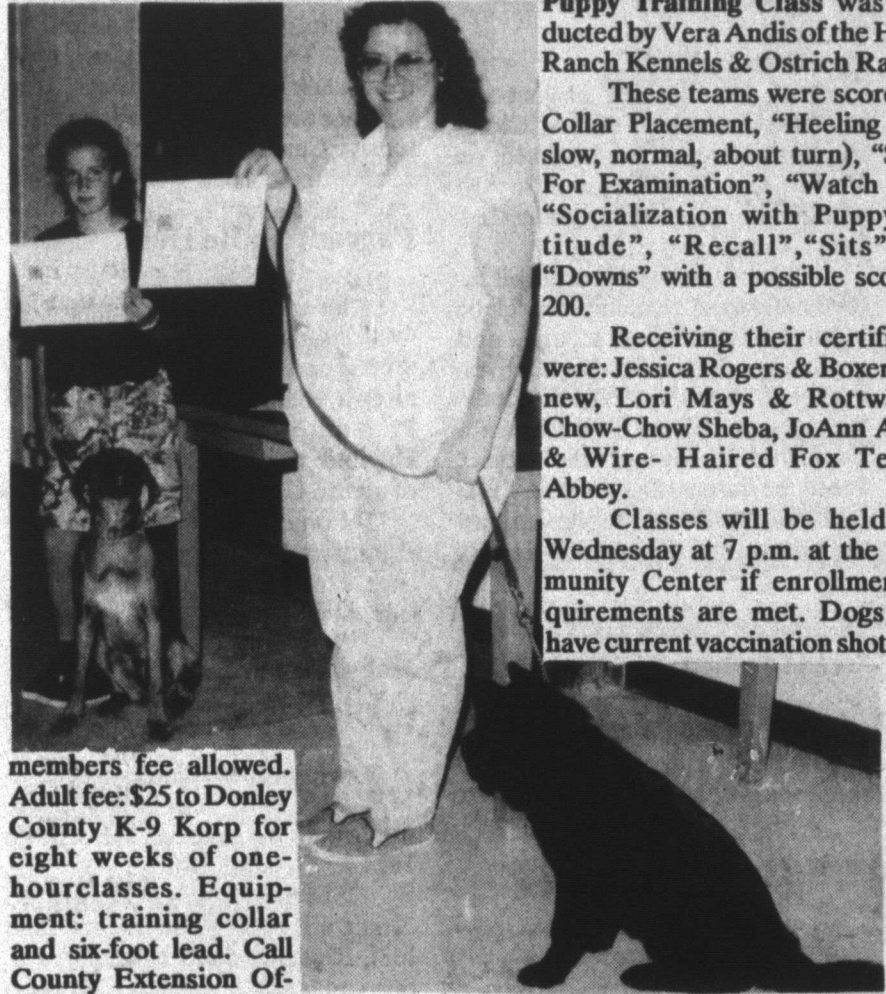
## Dogs Graduate

He says concerning his talents: "I prefer to use what ever measure of talent I have to bring honor and glory to God."

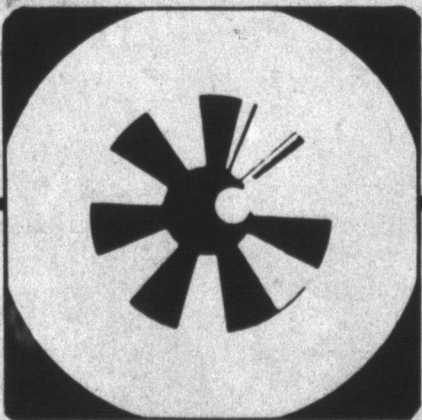

### One Example

Although Jesus claimed that the Father had given him all authority in heaven and on earth (Matt. 28:18), he nevertheless sought to win the hearts of his followers by persuasion. He never forced anyone to follow him against that person's will.

Jesus' claims were substantiated by his actions. Together they amazed his contemporaries. But they did more than amaze. Those who saw Jesus were either drawn to him or utterly repelled by him.

How different it is with those who claim to be the Body of Christ today! A great many Americans do not take today's churches very seriously. Our modern bodies do not attract most people powerfully enough for those people to want to become involved. Nor do they offend people by their examples of righteousness, justice and mercy. Perhaps there is no greater indictment of contemporary Christianity than our neighbors' indifference.

One major reason why modern Christians lack credibility is the fact that we are not consistently reflecting his life and teaching. Rather than serving those in need and proclaiming the Good News to broken hearts, modern Christians split doctrinal hairs and bicker about opinions.

If we dare, modern Christians can live Christlike lives, but it will not be easy. Jesus called us to work for him, not to waste time in bull sessions.

His call is dangerous. His earthly ministry ended in crucifixion. Those disciples who lived like him were often martyred. If we do his work and proclaim his message, many people (perhaps even most people) will react with rejection, some even with overt hostility. But others will be drawn to the example of Jesus in our lives. The power of the example of a united Body is overwhelming.

That was the reason why Jesus prayed that his followers would be one. He knew that one-ness was necessary for credibility.

Jesus taught by word and example. Our words will be weak so long as our example fails to show that we are one in him even as he is one with the Father, (John 17).

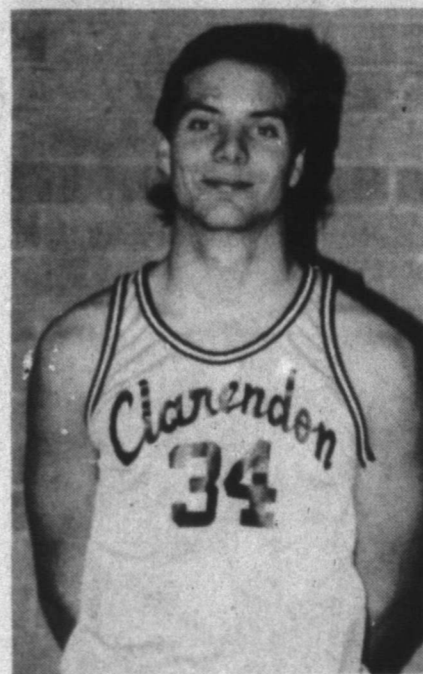

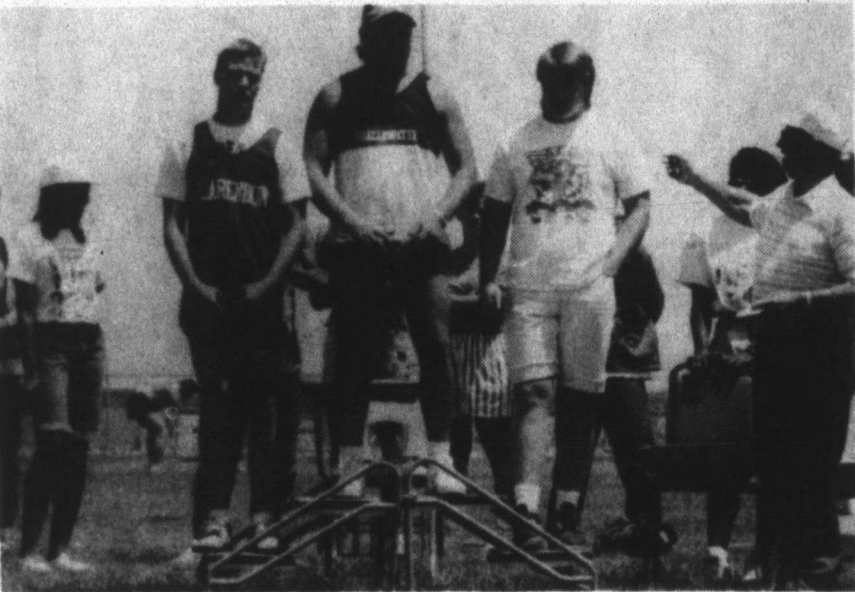
