## WTU Releases Information

Customers of West Texas Utilities Co. could be paying less for their electric service starting in July if the Public Utility Commission of Texas (PUC) grants the company's request to lower fuel factors. WTU filed the request Tuesday (May 21) as an update to the original fuel filing it made in February.

Jerry Chambliss, WTU's local manager in Clarendon, said "the company is asking for interim factors to be effective in July and fixed factors effective in October. Based on the company's expected cost of fuel this summer, the interim factors produce a decrease, compared to current costs, of 7.8 percent or \$4.42 a month on consumption of 660 kilowatt-hours per month." In October the fixed factors will mean a decrease from today's costs of 2.6 percent (\$1.49) a month for 66 kilowatt-hours.

"Although the commission still must approve the company's request, WTU is optimistic that the lower factors will be the ones used to calculate customers' July bills", Chambliss said. Other customer groups will see similar decreases in their costs as a result of the lower fuel factors.

The company made the initial filing in February because the PUC had said that fuel costs should be reconciled at least every three years either through a rate case or a fuel reconciliation case such as the present filing. WTU's fuel costs were last reconciled in a rate case which covered a period ending with March 31, 1987, almost four years ago.

Although WTU's February request was for an increase in factors, the company said then that it intended to update the information this May to include current fuel cost information. That has allowed the company to pass along the benefits of its cost control efforts.

Those efforts include renegotiation of a lower cost coal transportation agreement with Burlington Northern Railroad and lower costs for spot gas. Previous efforts include construction of a gas pipeline to the Fort Phantom **Cont'd on pg. 5**

## Emergency Grazing Approved

Donley County has been approved for emergency haying and grazing of ACR and CU for Pay because of the dry conditions since January 1, 1991. Haying and grazing shall be confined within the county boundaries and is approved until December 31, 1991.

Producers must come by the ASCS office and do the following prior to haying or grazing: (1) Certify the acreage (2) Sign a register form.

Approved ACR and CU for Pay cover may be grazed and/or hayed by the producer's own livestock or another producer's livestock.

## Programs Set For Women Land Owners

Women involved in managing farms and ranches may wish to attend one of three educational seminars scheduled across the state in June by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

Dr. Wayne Hayenga of College Station, Extension Service economist and attorney, said the seminars are designed to help women explore income-generating and tax-saving opportunities for their farms and ranches.

Dates and locations for the meeting are: June 13-14 Holiday Inn Airport, Corpus Christi; June 24-25 Sheraton Inn, Wichita Falls; June 27-28 Fifth Seasons East, Amarillo.

Hayenga said discussions will center on income taxes, leases, business organization and estate planning.

"Farm leases and operating agreements may take many forms," Hayenga said. "Many of these will be discussed, including benefits and restrictions to both land owners and tenants."

Concerning income tax planning, participants will study tax-saving opportunities for business growth, land sales, retirement income and assisting children and grandchildren.

Hayenga said a session on estate planning will deal with wills, trusts, estate tax deferrals, gifts and property titles.

In regard to estate planning tools, discussions will include use of corporations and partnerships, selling part of a business, installment sales, oil and gas interests, special farm land valuation, deferred estate tax payments, life insurance and discounted estate taxes.

Registration cost is \$60 per persons, which includes meals and materials. For more information, contact the local Extension Service Agent Tim Trimble at 874-2141, Dr. Hayenga or Carol Sabo, (409)845-2226.

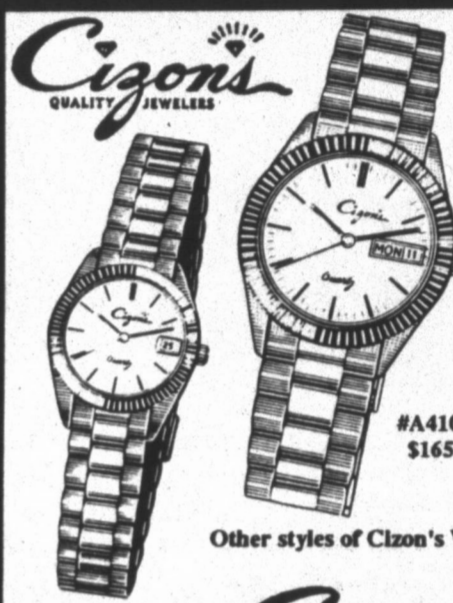

**Antibiotics: Effective Infection Fighters**

Because of their ability to interfere with or stop the growth of infection-causing bacteria, antibiotics are among the most valuable of all the prescription medicines. Antibiotics commonly prescribed include tetracycline, the penicillins (includes ampicillin and amoxicillin), the aminoglycosides, erythromycin, and the cephalosporins. A relatively new group of antibiotics, referred to as the quinolones, are gaining in popularity because of their ability to treat some infections that previously required intravenous antibiotic administration.

Any one or several of many bacteria may be responsible for a particular infection. Since all bacteria do not respond to the same antibiotic, the bacteria should best be identified. The identification of bacteria in the body is determined through a test known as a culture. Often antibiotic medicines are not started until the results of the culture are known. If the organism identified is a virus, antibiotics may not be prescribed at all. Viruses such as those that cause the common cold do not respond to antibiotic therapy. All antibiotics should be taken as prescribed by the physician in order to receive the maximum therapeutic benefit and to prevent the emergence of resistant organisms.

## Top Winners Named in District 4-H Roundup

High Plains 4-H'ers from eleven of the twenty counties in

Extension Panhandle District 1 qualified to compete in the State 4-H Roundup at College Station on June 4 - 5 by taking top honors in district competition on May 4.

About one hundred and eighty-two boys and girls competed in the one-day event which included twenty-seven contests. Winners received their awards in ceremonies at the Mary Moody Auditorium at West Texas State University in Canyon.

Representing Donley County were Brad Williams and Buddy Howard, who placed first in the Farm and Ranch Economics. Their demonstration was on different aspects of the Futures Livestock Market. Amanda Ward and Julie Floyd won first place in Clothing Educational Activity with their demonstration, "The Fiber Puzzle". All of these 4-H'ers will be competing in the State 4-H Roundup held at Texas A & M University in June.

station near Abilene to provide access to more suppliers, renegotiation of supply and transportation contracts for fuel and improvements in the efficiency of some plants so they burn less fuel to make electricity.

Costs to residential customers are essentially divided into two major parts, base rate and fuel factor. The fuel charge makes up about twenty eight percent of the total cost to customers.

Base rates cover all the other costs of providing electric service. To comply with the State's energy conservation efforts, WTU uses winter rates from November to April and summer rates from May to October. Summer rates are higher to encourage conservation when temperatures make air conditioners work long hours and help produce the greatest demand for electricity of any time during the year.

If the company's request to imple-

ment the new factors on July bills is granted, the lower costs will be in effect for most of the air conditioning season.

WTU provides electric service to 177,000 customers in 52 counties stretching from the Red River to the Rio Grande.

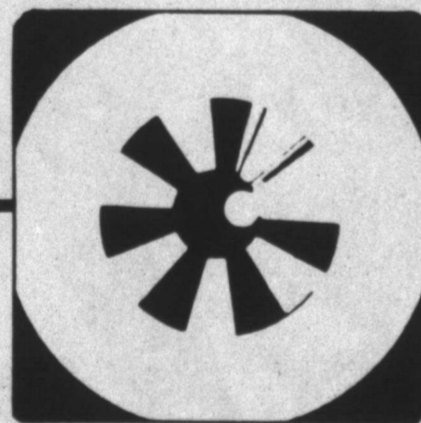

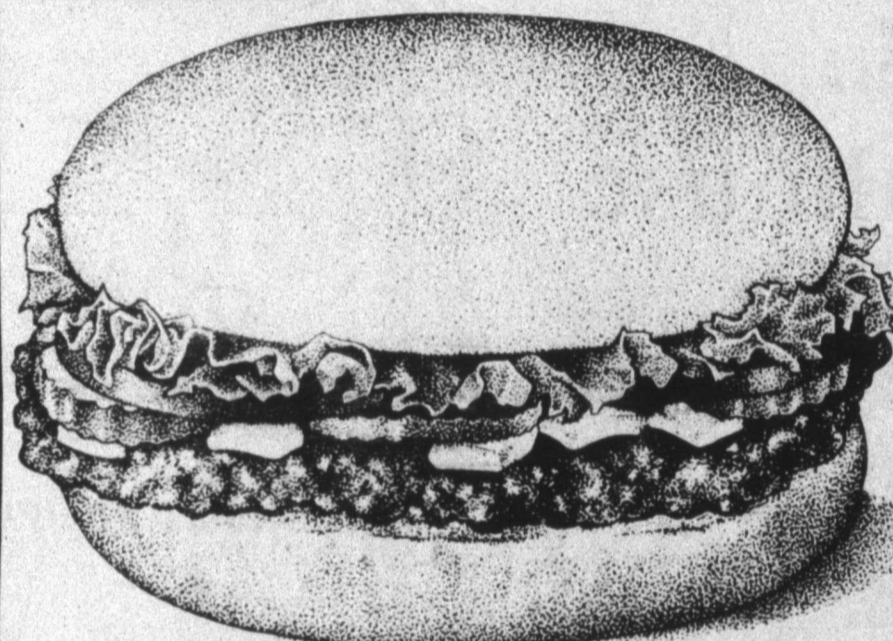
