| It's time for dinner and the cupboard is bare, you are too tired to cook, and take-out is getting too expensive. What about that long aisle of frozen meals in the grocery store? <br> Old-fashioned "TV Dinners" have evolved into a wide range of contemporary meals. How can you choose the ones that are the most healthful and tasty? <br> Quick and easy frozen foods vary from beef, chicken, and pork to pasta, hot "pocket" sandwiches and vegetarian meals. Many are controlled in calories, fat, and sodium. Often, they are less expensive than take-out. Popping a frozen dinner in the microwave can spare you a messy kitchen, too. <br> However, some nutritional considerations should be kept in mind: <br> 1. Look for meals that have the most vegetables. One roast turkey dinner might include mashed potatoes, but another might have carrots and green beans, too.
