version could be called the Taxpayer Protection Act， which would protect taxpayers as rising entitlement costs and high deficits spur calls for tax increases in coming years．

| Many people－especially teenagers and young adults－still do not take one of the simplest and most effective steps to stay safe：Buckling up．According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Admin－ istration（NHTSA）， 59 percent of the pas－ senger vehicle occupants killed in crashes in 2002－32，598 men，women and children －were not wearing seat belts． <br> Teenagers and young adults are par－ ticularly at risk．Motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death for teens and young adults in the United States from age 16 through 34，according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention．Yet， 64 percent of 16 to 29 year old（and 68 per－ cent of 18 to 34 year old）passenger vehicle occupants killed or seriously injured in crashes in 2002 were not wearing a safety belt，according to NHTSA． <br> Sometimes the fear of getting a traffic ticket is the only reason that someone will wear a safety belt．That is why state and local law enforcement officers across the | country are joining the national Click It or Ticket／Operation ABC（America Buckles Up Children）May 2004 Mobilization that runs from May 24 through June 6， 2004.
