Harris takes plea on robbery charge

Arthur Harris of Clarendon was sentenced to ten years in the Institutional Division of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice last Thursday, according to District Attorney Luke Inman's office.

Harris pleaded guilty to the second degree offense of aggravated robbery, as well as pleading guilty to the second degree felony of escape.

Pursuant to a plea agreement, Harris was convicted and sentenced to ten years for both second degree felonies.

Harris was originally indicted by a Hall County Grand Jury on August 14, 2007. Harris was later indicted on November 12, 2007, for the armed robbery offense out of Donley County. In exchange for Harris' plea of guilty, the State agreed to run both ten years sentences concurrently.

Inman was the prosecutor for the State of Texas with the Honorable Judge H. Bryan Poff, Jr. presiding by assignment.

Sales tax revenue higher this month

AUSTIN — Clarendon's sales tax revenues look better this month after Texas Comptroller Susan Combs delivered allocations to local governments Friday.

After October's rebate plummeted nearly 16 percent from 2007's allocation, the city's November allocation was less than one percent down from the same period last year.

Clarendon received \$32,455.58 this month, which was 0.85 percent down from \$32,733.88 in November 2007.

The city is now running 0.95 percent ahead on year-to-date collections at \$278,008.59.

Howardwick had another big month, bringing in \$1,492.87 and posting a 30.04 percent increase over the same time last year. That city is now 14.57 percent ahead on the year-to-date at \$13,651.19.

Hedley, however, continued to feel a little pinch with a November allocation of \$954.73, which is off 8.05 percent from last November and has the city running 2.45 percent behind on the year-to-date.

Statewide, Texas collected \$1.73 billion in sales tax revenue in

October, up 5.2 percent compared to October 2007.

"Sales tax collections grew in the first two months of fiscal 2009, however, at slower rates than generally seen over the past three years," Combs said.

"Collections have continued to increase overall, but remittances from the key retail trade sector have begun to decline slightly as consumers grow increasingly cautious and confidence erodes."

Combs sent Texas cities \$373.8 million in sales tax allocations, up 4 percent compared to November 2007. So far this calendar year, city sales tax allocations are up 5.2 percent compared to the same time period last year.

October state sales tax collections and November sales tax allocations to local governments represent September sales reported to the Comptroller in October by monthly tax filers and July, August and September sales reported to the Comptroller in October by quarterly tax filers.

The Comptroller's next local sales tax allocation will be made on Friday, December 12.

Clarendon EDC awards fifth storefront grant

Fred Clifford and the Clifford Grocery Partnership were the recipients this week of the latest cash award from the Clarendon Economic Development Corporation's Façade Grant Program.

The CEDC Board at its regular meeting last Monday approved Clifford's improvements to this historic Stocking Building at 116 S. Kearney.

The project consisted of replacing broken windowpanes and giving the storefront a fresh coat of paint.

The project received \$1,142.61 from the CEDC, which is half of the amount of the improvements. Chris and Terri Ford of Finders Keepers did the work.

Clifford said he had been planning on doing some work on the building but then went with a bigger project.

"I was just going to fix the windows," Clifford said. "That's all I was going to do, but then I found out about the grant."

Clifford appreciates the CEDC's efforts to improve Kearney Street.

"I think it's great. You've had good luck getting some things done."

Preserving the history of the Stocking Building was important to Clifford, who says he purchased the building several years ago after having his eye on it for many years.

"I wanted it even when I was in the grocery business next door," he said, "and I got out of that in 1979."

Clifford said his building is probably one of the oldest operational buildings in the Panhandle, having its origins at Old Clarendon with the area's pioneer doctor, J.D. Stocking. When the town moved to New Clarendon in 1887, the building followed the townspeople.

"The rocks and bricks and everything were carried here from the location in Old Clarendon," Clifford said.

Dr. Stocking practiced medicine in the building for many years, and his family continued Stocking's Drug Store into the early 1970s.

Since that time, the Stocking Building has housed a variety of businesses and is now home to Clarendon's municipal court and Judge Jimmy Johnson.

Clifford says he wants to make one further improvement to the building. During the recent project, the awning collapsed and had to be removed. Flashing was put up afterward, but Clifford says he wants to replace that with something that looks better. He just hasn't decided what yet.

The CEDC has again budgeted \$10,000 for this fiscal year's Façade Grant Program, which provides fifty-fifty matching grants up to a maximum of \$2,000 per project for properties on a three-block stretch of Kearney Street between First and Fourth Streets.

Projects eligible for consideration could be anything from a coat of paint to new signage to a complete rehabilitation of a store-

front. Those interested in the grants are asked to apply prior to beginning a project.

To date the CEDC has awarded more than \$5,000 in façade grants. A sixth application is

pending.

The CEDC Board will next meet to consider grant applications on Monday, December 1, at 5:15 p.m. in City Hall.

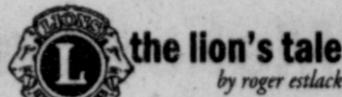

Both the seventh and eighth grade Colts will be starting basketball, and their first game is scheduled for November 17 at home against Quanah beginning at 5:00 p.m.

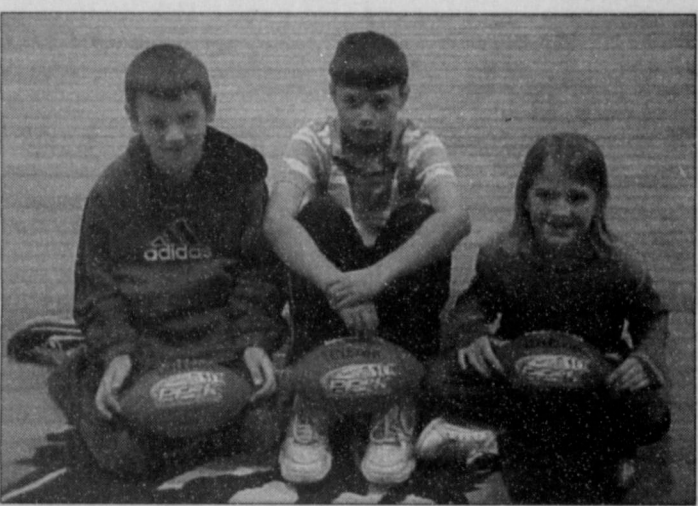
