

#### SOCIAL SECURITY **NEWS**

"Social security is the first life insurance that most school boys and girls pay for out of their own earnings by summer employment," J. R. Sanderson, manager of the Amarillo Social Security Administration field office in the Post Office Building, said today. "Very few of them, and few of their parents realize they are acquiring insurance, because the social security card is still usually associated in the public mind with old age.

"The fact is that eligibility provisions in the Social Security Act favor young people. Until a person is twenty-four and a half years old, earnings of as little as calendar quarters are sufficient credits in a social security account, to give the equivalent of \$60.00 life insurance, minimum. need to be consecutive. And no matter how young a person may ed, the insurance remains in force until attainment of 24 and a half years of age, even if the boy or girl never does any more work in covered employment after the six
