Hon. J. H. Stephens introduced four resolutions, which were endorsed by the unanimous vote of the convention. The first, for the leasing of the public lands of the United States on lines similar to those of the State of Texas; second, asking the State Legislature and Congress to pass bills now pending for the purpose of defining the boundary lines of the Panhandle; third, indorsing the bill now in Congress permitting cattle to remain on board cars in transit to market for 40 hours instead of 28 as now; fourth, a resolution urging the Government to sink a deep well in the Panhandle, and indorsing the move now on at Childress to have the Government take charge of the well now at Childress.
