## DENVER & FORT WORTH RAILWAY.

The prospect of the early completion of the Denver and Fort Worth Ry. through the Panhaudle is very flattering. The work of grading is being pushed this side of Decatur with all possible speed and track laying will begin January 15th, and according to the Henrietta Shield will be accomplished at the rate of a mile and a half a day until it reaches the Canadian river.

At this rate the road will be running through Donley county within eight months. The point on the Canadian river at which this road will cross will in all probability be about ten miles west of the mouth of the Big Blue. This difference of ten miles from the preliminary line will not materially change the route through this immediate section.

The Denver and New Orleans road from the former place will connect at the Canadian with the Fort Worth road thereby placing Denver and the mining districts one chousand miles nearer to the tide water than at present. 


