Improper pruning of trees
can be just as bad or worse
than not pruning them at all,
emphasizes Ronatid Gooch,
county agent for the Texas
Agricultural Extension Ser-
vice. On the other hand,
preper pruning can turn a
tree or shrub into a beautiful
plant specimen.
Goch offers 10 pointers to
consider as far as the
pruning operation is con-
crenned:

1. Do not top trees. Topped
trees often die because the
topped branches cannot heal,
thus letring in decay fungi
and bacteria. Also, side
branches below topped stubs
