

Two County incumbents defeated Saturday

Two incumbent Donley County Democratic candidates were defeated by their opponents in Saturday's Democratic Primary run-off election with three votes making the difference in one race.

Losing incumbents were Donley County Sheriff Frank Lindsey Jr. to

newly elected Sheriff Truett Behrens and Pct. 3 Commissioner Junior Hill to new Commissioner Buford Holland.

Both Behrens and Holland will be reopposed by Republican candidates in the general election Nov. 4. They will take office when current can-

didate terms expire Jan. 1, 1977. Both will serve a four year term.

A total of 1,384 Donley County Democrats turned out to vote in the Primary run-off. Behrens

A total of 1,384 Donley County Democrats turned out to vote in the

Primary run-off. Behrens polled 718 votes to Lindsey's 557. The close commissioners race ended with Holland 213 to Hill's 210.

Both Behrens and Holland had previously lost political bids to opponents Lindsey and Hill, both in the 1972 elections.

The voter turn-

out, termed "remarkable" by County Democratic Chairman Mary Cooke, was only 237 less than the May 1 primary election. 1,621 voted in that election compared with 1,384 in Saturday's. In Donley County, 2,450 voters were registered.

In Saturday's primary run-off, Don-

ley County voters also showed a preference for state-wide winning candidates Jon Newton and Carl Dally. Newton, who won the Texas State Railroad Commissioner's post, received 700 county votes compared to 464 for opponent Jerry Sadler.

In the Judge's

race for the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals, a state-winner Carl Dally polled 544 Donley County votes to 458 for his opponent W.T. Phillips.

In the Sheriff's race, Behrens lead Lindsey in seven out of nine Donley County boxes. Lindsey gathered more votes in Box 3

located at Lelia Lake and Box 4, located at the Old College Building in Clarendon.

Lake called 'pick of the Panhandle' Greenbelt Pike fishing topic of article

Pike fishing at Lake Greenbelt is the subject of an article in the June issue of Texas Parks and Wildlife magazine.

The article, accompanied by color pictures of Lake Greenbelt, was written by J.D. Peer, public information officer for the Texas Parks and Wildlife Dept. in Lubbock.

In fact, Peer said later, the article contains a small mistake. As printed Peer states, the eggs of pike "are not adhesive; they sink to the bottom when deposited and the spawning ritual is completed."

Peer said later research indicated that the pike's eggs are sticky when first laid by the female and in fact the eggs will attach themselves to foilage in the water. Peer said this was usually to plants two or three feet below water surface.

One picture accompanying the article is of a metal spoon lure with deep scratches on

its surface caused by the sharp teeth of striking Northern Pike.

Another picture shows a lone pike fisherman fishing the shallow end of Kelly Creek at Greenbelt's south end.

In his article, Peer says the fish stocked in Greenbelt grow faster than usual for Northern Pike but also die at a younger age. Because of this, he speculates, no local fish will reach the national record size catch of 46 pounds.

Largest pike caught in Greenbelt, according to the article, was an 18 pound two ounce Northern hooked by Buster Dorough of Kress. The fish, caught last June, is the largest one on record in Texas.

Northern Pike were first stocked in greenbelt in 1967 when more than 150,000 fry were released by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Dept. Approximately 100,000 Walleye fry Pike were released this past spring by the department at Greenbelt.

Peer says most pike caught at Greenbelt are by bass fishermen trying for largemouth. he standard lures used for largemouth, spinners, plugs and spoons, also attract the pike.

He does suggest using a heavy-test line, 15 to 20 pounds, or a wire leader line

to insure against pike breaking it or cutting it with their sharp teeth. These same teeth also make using a dip net preferable over trying to pull the fish out of the water with bare hands.

Peer predicts the greenbelt state record of 18 pounds will be bested this summer

and, according to him, is expected to be broken at Greenbelt Lake.

"I'd say Greenbelt would be the pick of the Panhandle Lakes for fishing this summer," Peer said. He said the bass fishing in particular should be good here this year.

She said the last flea market had about 15 displays set up. These included a Las Vegas Nevada resident traveling across the U.S. participating in local flea markets.

Booths will be set up at the corner of Hwy. 287 and Hwy. 70 in Clarendon. All area residents may sell merchandise for a \$2 space fee per day. Space for all three days may be purchased for \$5.

Operating times for selling will be left up to individual traders and any display devices such as tables must be provided by individuals.

Two fish were registered as contest entries for the Clarendon Press' fishing contest over the weekend.

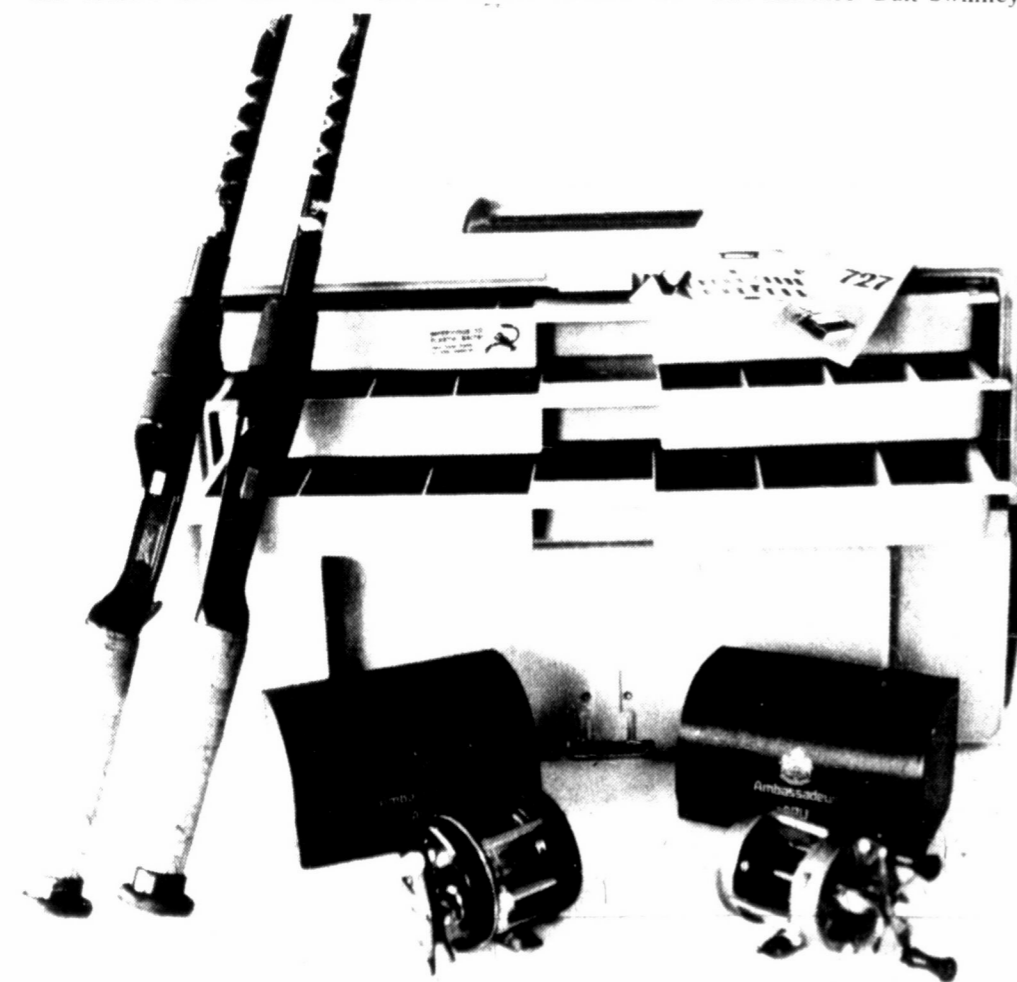
