complete in Buck Relays

Saturday the Bronchos and Bronchettes competed in the Buck Relays at White Deer. The Bronchos finished in second place with 113 points, behind Stinnett who scored 119% points for first place. The Bronchettes finished with 34 points. During the morning field events finals were held for both the girls and boys. In the girls' division Sandy Rippetoe placed fourth in the shot put with a throw of 30 feet 8 inches and third in the discus with a throw of 89 feet 9 inches. Jenny Devhie placed third in the high jump when she cleared four feet six inches

In the boys' field events Mickey McGuire placed third in the shot put with a throw of forty-one feet five inches and Tim Brown followed in fourth place with a throw of forty-one feet 2% inches. Mickey also placed sixth in the discus with a throw of 116 feet 111/2 inches. Gary McCleflan placed fourth in the long jump with a jump of twenty feet 1/2 inch.

The top performer in the field events was Keith Floyd who, won the high jump at six feet four inches. This broke the meet record by three inches but more importantly he broke the Clarendon school record of six feet 2 inches which Bobby 7 Leeper set in 1972 and had been equaled by Keith last year. In the afternoon the finals in the running events were held. The Bronchos started the afternoon by winning the 440 relay with a time of 46.1. The members of the 440 relay team are Billy Gardner, John Hall, Keith Topper, and Gary McClellan. The team received a trophy for their winning effort. In the 120 yard high hurdles Irven Thomas placed second with a time of 16.2 and Darrell Gillam placed fifth in the same event.
