

Postal Service's new packaging guidelines

Postmaster R.G. Mc-Combs today issued a reminder to postal customers in Clarendon that if the Postal Service's new pack-aging guidelines are followed they can virtually eliminate damage to their parcels.

Postmaster McCombs said

Postmaster McCombs said that checks at bulk mail plants show that more than 80 per cent of all articles damaged in the mails were improperly packaged.

While the regulations and guidelines adopted recently by the Postal Service are lateiled they held departs.

detailed, they boil down to several basic steps that can help assure safe delivery.

First, select a strong carton. Use a fiberboard box with the "burst-test" number printed on it. If the box says, for instance, 125 lbs. it can be

used for mailing many types of merchandise weighing up to 20 lbs.

dense or heavy materials, such as books, stronger

boxes are required. For 10 lbs. of books the Postal Service recommends a box with a 175-lb, burst test.

The Postal Service suggests that wrapping paper not be used on cartons. If a wrapper is torn or lost in transit, the mailing address

transit, the mailing address can disappear. Further, the paper adds nothing to the package's strength.

The use of masking and cellophane tapes for closing or sealing is prohibited. In transit they tend to peel off, and they have little strength. String is not recommended. String is not recommended. If twine loosens, it can readily catch on processing machinery.

Instead, parcel post cus-tomers are urged to use the pressure-sensitive, rein-forced tapes. They are forced tapes. The almost unbreakable

"Do Not Bend," it is 20 lbs. required that the container have stiffeners which will protect it from being bent

box, it is important to mark out addresses that may have been printed on it along with extraneous numbers that could be confused with the ZIP Codes.

A final suggestion: Enclose a return address card in the package so that it can be returned if the mailing label is damaged or lost.

and checking all the parts--to and checking all the parts-to help insure safety and high-quality food. Home pressure canners destroy botulism spores in low-acid vegetables, and proper cleaning is one key to their success.

CLEAN CANNER ITSELF

In washing the canner, remove any stains from remove any stains from aluminum canners with a paste of whiting and vinegar. For porcelain-enameled steel canners, use water instead of vinegar. Be sure to clean the edges of kettle, and cover

kettle and cover

thoroughly.

If necessary, scrub them with whiting and water, since dried food, dirt or scale from

hard water on either edge may prevent a tight seal and allow steam to leak out.

allow steam to leak out.

Special cleaning also
solves problems with odor or
metalic taste.

For example, an aluminum
or timed-steel canner may
have an odor after storage
and a new metal canner used
also for cooking may give

and a new metal canner used also for cooking may give food a metallic or rusty taste.

To get rid of problem odor or taste, put one inch of water in the canner, add a handful of potato peels and any racks and pans with similar problems. Heat for 15 minutes at 15 pounds pressure. Cool. Wash kettle, pans and racks in hot soapy water. Rinse and dry.

CLEAN PETCOCK, SAFETY VALVE, GAUGE

openings.

Occasionally remove the petcock and safety valve and soak them in vinegar for a short time.

canning all the air can be driven out of the canner in 10 minutes. Clean the gauge to prevent incorrect pressure readings due to clogging. Clean the safety valve so it can work if pressure becomes to high.

Before canning—and throughout the canning season—clean the petcock and safety valve openings by drawing a string or narrow string of cloth through them.

Never use sharp tools that might nick and damage openings.
