

DONLEY GETS MEMBER -SHIP IN THE TEXAS FARM BUREAU MELON ASSOCIATION

Last October during the Dallas Fair a meeting was held in Dallas for the purpose of organizing a state watermelon exchange. As this section is capable of producing late market melons of an unsurpassed quality, I attended this meeting, knowing that if we could get admission into some kind of exchange which would assure us of a market for our output, this would give us another valuable money crop which would fit in nicely with our system of farming, coming in at a time between the busy cultivating season and the harvest. At the October meeting, committees were appoitned with different duties, bylaws for the proposed exchange were begun. A moeting date was set for March Mr. W. T. McBride of Lelia Lake

who was going to the Fat Stock Show, very kindly consented to represent Donley county at this March 14th meeting at Dallas. The following plan was decided upon. The state of Texas was divided into five zones, with a director in each zone. This county was placed in the 5th zone, with Mr. Jordon, a prominent farmer of McLean, Gray county, as director. The president of the State Exchange is a melon grower from zone 2. The head office will be at Dallas under the management of a marketing expert, who plans to have an expert assistant to come help us solve such problems as pruning, fertilizing, grading, etc., all of which are of utmost importance, but more especially is the grading. There will be three grades of melons, numbering from 1 to 3. These melons will be graded by a local manager, employed by our county association who in turn day afternoon. will wire the Dallas office that a certain car of melons is ready for shipment. The Dallas office will advise us where to ship and send us confirmation of the purchaser's order. Such a system eliminates the old disadvantage of each individual, and even each county association of Sunday. being in competition with each other, it eliminates waste in bad shipments caused by improper grading.

Last year 32 cars of melons were shipped from this county and even with poor markets which were always inevitable with our old system of individual ocmpetition many acrese netted the grower \$150.
