Words from Faith & Grace by Cecil R. Biggers, Lutheran Lay Minister

This week we begin the Season of Pentecost. The Jewish holy day of Pentecost commemorated the giving of the Law to Moses and served as a time of thanks for the harvest of crops. It was a time when no labor was done. Pentecost celebrates the beginning of the unique Law of Israel. For the Christian Season of Pentecost we celebrate the giving of the Holy Spirit, the beginning of the unique Law of Love exemplified in the inclusive/universal church. We study Acts 2:1-21, Psalm 104: 25-35, Romans 8:22-27, and John 15:26-16:15.

In Acts, the tentative, hiding disciples are suddenly empowered by the Holy Spirit and emerge into Jerusalem proclaiming Christ. Jewish teaching held that there was the Present Age and then would come the Age to Come but between them was the dread Day of the Lord. The Day that God would intervene in history, the empowered believers were proclaiming that the Day of the Lord was at hand, God had intervened in history through Jesus Christ.

The Psalmist sings of the wonders and powers of the Creator God; the Psalmist prays that he will be pleasing to God and that sinners and the wicked be removed from the earth.

Paul describes the whole of creation as groaning in labor pains, until the coming of the salvation of God. The earth, all of creation, was subjected to the sin of man though Adam; with the redemption through Christ and the coming of the Holy Spirit, we as believers are adopted of God; we are Children of God; the earth, all of creation is restored. In Romans, Paul reminds us that we do not know how to pray as we should, but the Holy Spirit prays for us and God hears these prayers to our benefit.

John shows Jesus explaining that when the Advocate (the Holy Spirit) comes, He will guide the believers in truth. The Spirit will glorify Christ because He will take what is Christ's and declare it to the believer. Christ says that all that is the Father's is His. Hence the believer is sustained by Father, Son and Holy Spirit. But Jesus explains that when he goes to the Father that the Spirit will be with all his disciples all the time The Spirit will act to convict men of sin, to establish the righteousness of Jesus, to warn men of the impending judgment, and allow the believer through the grace of God to obtain faith which brings salvation.

Jesus further warns his followers that the Spirit will lead them, but the world will reject them, even kill them because the world does not know God; but the Holy Spirit will be with the believers always.

In these passages from Romans and John, we see an explanation of the triune God, the Holy Trinity who is One.

May the Holy Spirit empower your faith.



Murphey described the Pampa concert as a community effort. Billy Bob Brown, state director of the Texas Farm Bureau, agreed.


