"Vaccinating children against hepatitis A is one of the most

spread of the disease," said Thelma King Thiel, chairman and chief executive of the Hepatitis Foundation International in
Hepatitis A, a highly contagious virus that affects the liver, is spread by personal contact when hands aren't washed after
bathroom use or by contaminated food or water. It infects as bathroom use or by contaminated food or water. It infects as
many as 200,000 Americans and costs the nation more than many as 200,000 Americans and costs the nation more
$\$ 450$ million annually, the foundation said. Primary symptoms include jaundice, fatigue, flu-like illness with high fever, chills, nausea, vomiting and diarrhea.
Almost 30 percent of those cases occur in children 15 or
younger.
Children do not always exhibit symptoms of hepatitis $A$, but can transmit it to adults who tend to develop more severe
symptoms.

Texans share secrets for best pinto beans

By Ellen Sweets DALLAS - Some things are just naturally associated
with Texas and Texans longhorns, home on the range, boots, boot-scootin, barbecue and beans. Nothing cute, nothing fancy, just plain old pin-
tos. Not kidneys, not navys, not Great Northerns, not black beans. In fact, when you say
"bears" to most Texans, pintos are presumed to be the legume in question.
Some time back, two readers, both men, J.B. and M.S., bean-based recipes. One wanted a noncommercial blend
of bean-friendly herbs spices; the other sought information about cooking - soaking vs. not soaking, length of
cooking time what to cooking time, what to add,
when to add it. A third reader when to add it. A third reader,
K.B., weanted a way to cook a
pot of beans that could be enjoyed without fear of, well, uh, audible gastric distress.
Readers responded with vengeance. Suggestions came
through the mail, over the Internet, from as near as Plano and Irving, from as far
as Midland, Naples and Como.

One in particular, B.F., sub mitted detailed instructions,
distinguishing along the way between "basic beans," with salt, pepper, onion and chili
powder, and "Tex-Mex" beans with garlic, oregano, ground cumin and fresh jalapenos. cook's choice of ham hocks or
salt pork Unlike salt pork. Unlike mocks sub-
missions, his does not call for missions, his does not call for
presoaking the beans, nor does presoaking the
it require meat.

## Writing Want Ads that really sell!

Unsure how to write a Classified Ad that will get results? Follow these pointers and you'll soon have an empty space in your storage room and cash in your pocket
For starters, look at ads which offer the same item/products. Get a sense of going rates and ideas for how to make your ad stand out. Once you're ready to write, begin with exactly what you're selling: "Dining room set, maple, six chairs." Then, remember these hints: - Give the price. A newspaper consultant says 70 percent of classified readers won't respond to an ad with no price.

Use key words to describe what you're selling. The key words for a car are make, model, year, body style, color, mileage and price. If it's a house, key words are location, type of construction, number of bedrooms and baths, and condition.

Don't use abbreviations. It's tempting to abbreviate and save money if ads are billed by the line. Brand ads are billed by the words, so spell them out
