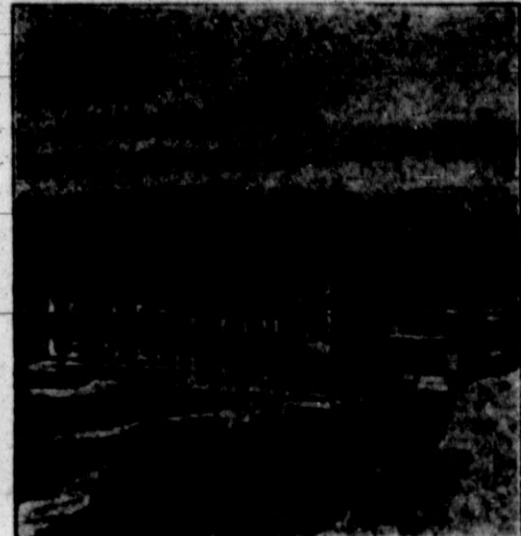

COURSES

Nothing is put down for show, every item in the courses is approved by experienced and conscientious teachers.

The department of Mental and Moral Science and History includes Psychology, Logic and Christian Ethics. History is considered valuable only as it furnishes useful lessons of life. The aim in this department is to bring into the student life the principles that will develop symmetrical character.

DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGY AND CHRISTIAN EVIDENCE

On these subjects Dr. A. Clark will deliver two lectures each week. These will embrace the science and pedagogy of ethics and the why of Christianity.

DEPARTMENTS OF MATHEMATICS AND SCIENCE

A thorough course in mathematics is offered including arithmetic, algebra, geometry, trigonometry, surveying, and analytical geometry. The science course embraces physiology, zoology, botany, physical geography, chemistry, physics, and laboratory work.

DEPARTMENT OF ANCIENT LANGUAGE AND LITERATURE

Two years' work in Greek is offered. The Latin course covers four years, including first book, grammar, composition, Caesar, Cicero, and Virgil. The English embraces four years, including rhetoric, composition, history of literature and critical study of authors.

INDUSTRIAL DEPARTMENTS

Practical training in horticulture can be had in the Hereford Nursery, near the College, and as fast as they learn the business can get pay for their work.

DOMESTIC SCIENCE

This is recognized as one of the most important departments in the school. It is hoped a teacher will be secured before the next issue of this paper.

DEPARTMENT OF ART

Courses include free hand drawing, crayon, pastel, water

colors, oil, and china painting

DEPARTMENT OF ELOCUTION AND PHYSICAL CULTURE

This department offers training in correct breathing, vocal culture, reading, literary interpretation, oratory, and physical culture.

DEPARTMENT OF MUSIC

In the different branches of the Music Department the pupil is not only taught to know correct rules of position, technique, etc., and given a thorough knowledge of the rudiments of music in the Theory and Harmony Classes, but to be able to render, in an intellectual and pleasing manner all selections whether of a simple or difficult degree.

PIANO—The piano course includes five years' work—each year being so extensive as to require diligent application to complete it in the given time, and the whole course is as thorough and extensive as is offered in the best conservatories in America.

VIOLIN—A thorough course in violin and other string instruments is offered, the ensemble work making a prominent feature in this department.

BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENTS

The buildings and equipment are in all respects first class. The college building now being completed is of stone and brick 117 by 70 feet, two stories, with basement for heat and light plant and work shop. In the planning, construction and furnishing of the building the convenience for study, the comfort and health of the students have been constantly in mind. The Girls' Home is finished and furnished after the most approved modern style with steam heat, bath rooms and all conveniences necessary for comfort and health. The young men will be furnished offices on their own campus and will take their meals with the teachers and young ladies at the Girls' Home.

A study hall for all students will be in charge of a teacher through all the study hours of the day and from 7 to 9 p. m.

Negroes Swindle Europeans.

Since President Roosevelt "opened the door for the negro," Europe has an epidemic of black swindlers, who have run up bills and borrowed money from gullible tradesmen and others on the ground that they are friends to the president and Booker T. Evidently President Roosevelt's negro "policy" is making trouble for the negroes abroad as well as at home.

While we concede the Tribune-Chief's claim that Quanah has the best public school in Northwest Texas, we proudly cite Hereford as having the best public school in the Panhandle, the Panhandle not being considered a part of that section of the state.

PROSPECTORS IMPRESSIONS.

The following letter in the Pilot Point Post-Signal, written by D. J. Moffitt, who was a visitor in Hereford during the Canyon reunion. Mr. Moffitt evidently means to give this country justice in his article, and while he does not exaggerate in our behalf he does not willfully and maliciously falsify, as did one man recently who paid this country a visit (?) while passing through the country in a passenger coach.

The senior editor and youngest son were among the many excursionists who took in the recent U. C. V. and Cowboy Reunion at Canyon City. Amarillo and Hereford were also included in the visit by most of the excursionists. This was our first visit to the plains and it was interesting to see such modern towns and evidences of prosperity right in the very spot where, in our early school days, was marked on the maps "The Great American Desert." Whether there ever was a great desert on the Texas plains we can not say, but certainly it is not there today, for nature has carpeted the earth with the nutritious buffalo grass and it is now one of the finest stock countries in the world.

The air on the plains is delightful and the constant breeze makes it cool even in midsummer and outdoor life is enjoyable; it is very rare that one cares to sleep throughout the night without extra cover, in fact, it is a fine country for sleeping. We are here reminded of what an old gentleman in Hereford told us. He bought a drill and took it home thinking he would try a crop of wheat, but his son objected to the innovation saying "we did not come out here to raise wheat: we came to sleep and let the cattle eat the grass." The old man sold the drill. Notwithstanding this young man's objection to wheat raising, it is pretty generally believed that it will become a paying crop. For the last two or three years wheat and oats have done well. We gathered the following wheat statistics from J. C. Womble of Hereford who has been running a threshing outfit the past four years. The average yield for the four years previous to this year was 14 bushels per acre. Highest yield 21 bushels. The first year, four years ago, he threshed only 15 bushels, last year 8,000. Was not through threshing this year. There are three outfits now in the county. The wheat was pastured during the winter and up to April 15. Oats did well this year, about 35 or 40 bushels per acre. This gives some idea of the development in this line. The old man and his son had better not sleep too long

or they will wake up way behind the procession. Some corn is raised but is not a sure crop. It is too cold for cotton. With the settlement of the country—turning the soil, planting of trees, extension of railroads, etc., will probably come more rainfall, improving the agricultural conditions in that section, as has been the case in Denton county in the last thirty years. But the country will always, or for many years yet, be a stock country. The cattle business is undergoing a change—from the large ranch where cattle were left to shift for themselves the year through to the smaller stock ranch on which the cattle are carried over the severest winter weather by feed raised on the ranch, in other words to stock farming. Kaffir corn and milo maize is the main crop for feed. This change is being rapidly made and many farmers from the other portions of Texas are buying these lands. Denton and surrounding counties are well represented on the plains. Lands are going up in value and are selling at \$3.00 to \$5.00 per acre and as high as \$10.00 near the towns.

This is a treeless country but trees are being planted and there are some orchards already bearing. Judge L. Gough at Hereford has almost every kind of fruit trees growing in his orchard. Among them the cherry seems to be the most thrifty and is said to do remarkably well, berries also do well. By experiment varieties will be found which will do well out there as was the case in this section where it was considered, twenty-five or thirty years ago, that fruit could not be successfully grown.

The present year has been the driest for many years on the plains and crops were suffering greatly, but good rains have fallen within the past ten days which will make a fair crop.

The reunion at Canyon City was all that could be desired—large crowds, much speech making, roping contests, broncho busting, base ball, etc. It is estimated that 7000 people were there on Cowboy Day. Canyon City is nicely located and is a pretty little town of about 1200 inhabitants. It has a local trade besides does a wholesale and shipping business for a large stretch of territory to the south. Her people are just now rejoicing over securing the location of the Baptist College for the Panhandle. There were six contesting towns and there was great interest all over the Panhandle in the result. The location selected is a beautiful one overlooking the town and valley beyond. Work on the building which is to cost \$30,000 or \$40,000 will begin at an early date. A \$12,000 public school house will be built this fall. Rev. J. D. Ballard formerly of this place lives at

Canyon City and is pastor of the Baptist church there, and it was the hospitality of his home we enjoyed while there, and were pleased to meet there his brother, W. N. Ballard of Clarady, Lamar Co., who was our companion during our sight seeing on the plains. The Palo Duro Canyon, a rocky gorge which begins within three miles of town, is worthy of mention. The creek of the same name, the upper waters of Red river, which is fed by never failing springs, flows through the canyon the walls of which rise perpendicular reaching the height of several hundred feet some ten or twelve miles down stream. The Barrel Springs, five miles, which we had the pleasure of visiting and Falls, twelve miles distant; are interesting resorts, but as yet in the state of nature. Fish are plentiful in the waters of the canyon.

Hereford, county seat of Deaf Smith county, 28 miles southwest of Canyon is a gem of a little city, of 2000 population. It is unusually well built with many brick business houses, the cleanest and most attractive town we have recently seen. The town enjoys a fine local trade from an excellent country which stretches for miles all around. All the usual business of a town of its size is represented; two banks, two newspapers, a fine planing mill, a good public school house and a fine college building in course of erection for Add-Ran College which has been established there by Addison and Randolph Clark formerly of Thorp Springs. The college seems to have a bright future before it.

Through the kindness of Judge L. Gough we rode out some five miles down the Tierra Blanco creek to a valley ranch and there had the novel experience of a boat ride on the plains. The body of water in the creek is about thirty feet wide, twelve feet deep, and extends about a quarter of a mile. This is quite a resort for fishing and picnicing. Judge Gough has at his beautiful home in Hereford an artificial lake supplied with water pumped by a windmill from a well, in which are quantities of fish. The water supply of Hereford and in fact most of the plains country should not be overlooked. At Hereford it is secured at a depth of about 50 feet and is the best water we ever drank, almost as cold as ice. The ex-Pilot Pointers living at Hereford are: Judge L. Gough, John A. Johnson, Wilson, L. S. Lacy, Geo. Cloyd, Geo. Dale, Mr. Sandifer, J. K. P. Russell, Rev. Mr. Bounds. Mr. Dameron from Bloomfield, Albert Johnson and in the vicinity J. H. Jackson, J. U. Williams from Aubrey.

For lack of space we will be brief regarding Amarillo, styled the Metropolis of the Panhandle, which has about 4000 population and is becoming a railroad center and is growing rapidly.

CLARENDON people are making arrangements to donate a good part of their proposed donation to the Baptist society for a college into their Methodist college located at that place. This is what should be done with at least fifty per cent of Hereford's proposed donation to the Baptists—tender it to Add-Ran College. In this way we would turn defeat into a most glorious victory.

We hear many doubts expressed as to Canyon's being able to build the college recently located there by the Baptist people, their reason being that according to Mr. Lester's \$10,000 donation a \$40,000 shall be erected. This means that at least \$15,000 more will have to be raised in order to guarantee the \$40,000 building and thus obtain the conditional Lester donation, as only \$15,000 was donated by Canyon unconditionally. However, we hope that the people of our neighboring city will overcome all difficulties in the matter and that the college will be formally opened for students at the beginning of the 1904 fall term.

Gone to Her Reward.

Mrs. Mary E. Grayson died Thursday at the home of her daughter, Miss Susie, from a stroke of paralysis received the previous day. Mrs. Grayson was born in Kentucky 77 years ago and from early childhood had been a member of the Christian church. Her remains were laid at rest in the Hereford cemetery, the funeral services being held at the Christian church and conducted by Rev. H. M. Bandy. Miss Susie Grayson, the surviving daughter has the sympathy of the community in her bereavement.

LYNCH LAW DEFINED.

By John Temple Graves of Georgia Before "Mob Conference."

Chautauqua, N. Y., Aug. 11.—Unique among all summer gatherings is the mob conference, now in progress at Chautauqua. John Temple Graves of Georgia, in his address before the conference today on "The Mob Spirit of the South," defended lynch law as a remedy for certain crimes, holding that though lynching is a crime, it is justified by the crime which most often provokes it, and will never be discontinued until that crime is eliminated.

The remedy for lynching must be elimination of the crime, and this he maintained could be done only by the separation of the two races in the United States.

In the course of his remarks, Mr. Graves said:

"The present penalty for assault, final as it is, appears to be inadequate through its deliberations to suppress the crime of crimes, which is the cause of lynching. I have argued that the negro does not fear legal death, and that he is not restrained by the ceremonial process of the courts.

"Is there any other penalty which can be devised, in or out of our present Constitution, which will startle and intimidate the passion which it seeks to restrain?"

"The mob knows its business and the mob today is the sternest, the strongest and most effective restraint that the age holds for the control of the monstrous crime which it avenges.

"The lyncher does not exterminate the rapist, but holds him mightily in check. It is folly to protest against this truth. Without the mob there would be a hundred assaults where there is one. Without the mob the South today would not be a place to live in. Thousands of vicious negroes halt in terror before the blazing anger and fiery vengeance of the mob.

"Criminal? Yes. Lawless? Yes. Ought to be abolished? If possible, yes. But as a sheer, cold patent fact, the mob stands today as the highest, strongest and most potent bulwark between the women of the south and such a carnival of crime as would infuriate the world and precipitate the annihilation of the negro race.

"It is not a pleasant thing to say. It is not a popular thing to say. But it is the only true thing to say.

MOB HAS BROKEN THE BARRIERS OF SECTION.

"It is necessary to speak plainly now.

"The mob has broken the barriers of section and lynching is at least a national crime. The spirit of lawlessness is clearly an evil of the times. The touch of the mob has made the Republic kin. For every Newman there is a Washington. For Palmeto in Georgia, Kansas has its Levenworth. Sam Hose is matched by Alex. White. Evansville riots surpass the riots in Cairo.

"The mob that shoots in Mississippi is answered by the mob that slays in Danville, Ill. Akron, O., storms a negro's refuge in jail almost within sight of Canton, where sleeps the martyr president—the best beloved man who has occupied the White House since the Father of our Country.

"The crime which begot lynching was a crime against womanhood—a crime blacker than arson and deadlier than assassination—a crime besides which murder is a misdemeanor and death a holiday—a crime that killed thrice and each death without a resurrection—a crime unspeakable and unthinkable this side of hell.

PROBLEM OF HOUR IS HOW TO PREVENT THE CRIME.

"We might as well state the question fairly. The problem of the hour is not how to prevent lynching in the south, but the larger question, how shall we destroy the crime, which always has and always will provoke the lynching? When we reach this statement of the question we have made some progress. Not before.

"This is the single question which I shall discuss today.

"The answer which the mob returns to this vital query is already answered. The mob answers this question with the rope, the bullet and torch. The mob is practical about the matter. While the sentimentalists resolute on lynch law, the mob acts. Let the sentimentalists learn a lesson here from the mob. Let them orate less on lynchings and act more earnestly and practically for the suppression of the crime. Let the missionary spirit talk less and act more.

"And let it not be thought or said that the mob's theory does not effect its purpose in a large degree. It is the narrowest of reasoning to declare that assaults upon women continue in despite of lynching and that, therefore lynching do effect its end. That argument is blind and fatuous folly. Followed to its conclusions, it would abolish capital punishment and close the jails, for criminals multiply in spite of them.

"There is no real remedy but one. To the problem of the races and to the problem of this hour there is but a single remedy. We are wasting time in theories as idle as they are unequalled to the peril of the hour, which is at last but a symptom of the times. We are temporizing with a giant danger upon hasty and childish expedients. We are salving a broken limb with vaseline. We are healing a cancer with catnip tea.

"This, my countrymen, is a case of surgery—surgery heroic, but beneficent—the knife that severs the limb but saves the life. For no statute will permanently solve the problem. No anodyne of law, no counter irritant of legislation will quiet it longer than the hour of its application.

"The evil is the blood of races, the disease is in the bones and marrow and the skin of antagonistic people."

CAPT. J. W. STEELE'S VISIT.

Tells How the People of the Southwest Can Populate This Country.

Today at about 12:30 p. m. Capt. J. W. Steele, commissioner of immigration for the Southwestern railroads, arrived in town, accompanied by Avery Turner and Don A. Sweet, general manager and traffic manager, respectively, of the Pecos Valley System. They were met at the depot by a delegation of citizens and driven over the town. At a little after 1 o'clock they arrived at the tabernacle near the school house, where a large crowd of citizens awaited them. Judge L. Gough introduced Capt. Steele, who at once entered upon his duties of apprising our citizens as to his methods of colonizing the Southwest, during which he paid a glowing tribute to the enterprise and growth of Hereford. He explained that the object of his visit was not to solicit money (as the railroads are bearing all the expenses of the agency) but to solicit letters stating the actual experience of those who live here, which letters will be printed in the agency's monthly paper and sent to the farmers all over the United States. He stated explicitly that the railroad companies had no lands to sell to prospective settlers and their only object in establishing the agency was to settle the country with people who would of course become patrons of the railroads passing through the district in which they located. Capt. Steele explained why he wanted letters giving the experience of actual settlers, saying that a glowing writeup of the country by experienced writers would not be noticed by the people the agency wanted to reach as they were used to those kind of descriptions of a country and would pay no attention to them, but they would take interest in letters written by the people of the country itself, as they would feel that such statements were true and had some authority to whom they could make further investigations. He stated that the agency not only wanted letters from men of all occupations, but from the women as well, as the wife, in many instances, controls the husband's moves, especially when it comes to moving to a new country.

At the close of his remarks, which were short and to the point, he distributed literature among the audience and requested that every person present sign their name in a book he had provided that he might use them in connection with his work.

THE BRAND will have something more to say on this subject from time to time and we will close this article by urging all of our citizens to write letters to Capt. Steele giving their experience in this country. By doing this you will help to populate this glorious country.
