## GTE/Contel Begin Integrating Services

GTE and Contel announced the closing of their \$6.6 billion merger, the largest in telecommunications history. The merged company becomes the largest and most geographically diverse U.S. based local telephone company.  
 "For the past eight months, a team of GTE and Contel employees has worked extremely hard to complete plans for this merger," said Kent B. Foster, president of GTE Telephone Operations. "Now that the merger process is completed, we can begin the task of formally integrating and blending the management and operational strengths of the two companies."  
 According to Foster, some integration plans will be implemented in the very near future and others will occur over the next two years.  
 "The most critical element of the merger planning process was to ensure that customers of both GTE and Contel continue to enjoy excellent telephone service during this transition," said Foster. "Also, we have taken great effort to minimize any changes in the way customers interact with the combined company."

## Texas Farmers Exempt From Set-Aside Cover Crop Rule

The Texas State ACS Committee has exempted Texas from the 50% cover crop requirement on Acreage Conservation Reserve (ACR) acres according to Jerry Harris, Chairman of the Texas State ACS Committee. The Food, Agriculture, Conservation and Trade Act of 1990 required that half of the acreage set-aside under the com-

modity programs be planted to a cover crop. The legislation also allowed for the exemption of those areas determined to be arid by USDA. The determination to exclude Texas was based on meteorological data that shows the line between non-arid and arid regions running from North Dakota through Texas. All states east of the line are

not considered arid and must comply with the 50% cover requirement. Most states west of the line are considered arid and do not have to comply with the 50% cover requirement. Since this line runs through Texas, the Texas State ACS Committee determined to exclude all of the state from the fifty percent cover requirement," Harris said.

## Texas Plains Expected to Experience Exonomic Experience and Growth

Austin: "The Plains region of Texas will enjoy modest job growth in 1991, now that employment in oil and gas has stabilized," State Comptroller John Sharp said today, releasing the latest issue of *Fiscal Notes*.

"Retail and whole-sale trade will provide the most new jobs as the Plains' overall economy improves," Sharp said.

The West Texas region, encompassing Abilene, Amarillo, Lubbock, Midland, Odessa, San Angelo and Wichita Falls, will gain 5,000 jobs this year.

Manufacturing jobs in the region should stabilize and the relatively large oil and gas industry should help insulate the Plains from effects of the

national recession. Eastland County is on the east side of the Plains Region, but it is also near the Metroplex and Central Corridor.

Because the area's economy has regained its footing and fewer residents are leaving the region, the Plains will also increase its population in 1991 - the first gain since 1983.

This issue of the award-winning *Fiscal Notes* takes a close-up look at 1991 employment and population projections for the six different economic regions of Texas.

Those regions include the Gulf Coast, the Border, the Central Corridor, the Metroplex, East Texas and the Plains.

Statewide, Texas' six economic regions will share 52,000 new jobs and 207,200 new residents.

"Trade will generate the most new jobs for Texas in 1991, followed by government, services, mining and transportation. Manufacturing will slide in all regions, and construction, real estate and financial services will remain weak in most parts of the state," Sharp said.

The program consisted of two videos, a hands-on demonstration of inoculating logs with the spawn and a discussion by Dr. Barnes relating his own personal experiences of growing these

mushrooms. A tour of the growing area and a question and answer session concluded the program.

Each participant received a hand-out covering many aspects of growing these mushrooms. There is a market for the Shiitake mushrooms for individuals and cooperatives who can furnish a steady supply of them.

## Banquet

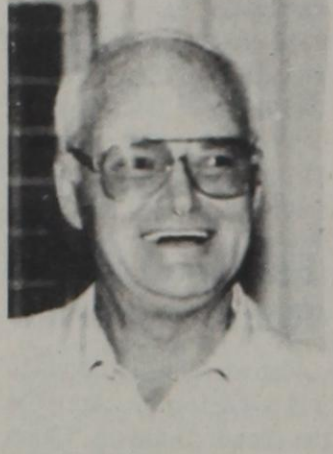
