U.S. Representative John Ratcliffe representing the 4th Congressional District in Texas began his upbeat presentation by speaking to the Royse City Rotary Club and visitors.

"I am very optimistic that with the right leadership (in the White House), that the derogation of values as the world's super county, can be replaced," Ratcliffe said.

Ratcliffe mentioned the nation's veterans – 63,000 just in District 4 – and the senior citizens several times saying that "our country has always stood up for those who cannot stand up for themselves and that it is our government's duty to protect our interest at home and

He touched on Medicare briefly.

"We need to get back to the core values that made this country great," he said.

In the last seven years, he said, the national debt had doubled, going from \$9 trillion to more than \$18 trillion.

"The federal government is working for you, not the other way around," Ratcliffe said.

"I just don't think this president (Obama) believes in America. We need the government standing behind us, not in front or beside us. The rest of the world is ready for America to lead again."

Ratcliffe reminded everyone that he is a conservative Republican. He spoke about the "unborn issues" and of human parts being sold for profit (as related to the unborn babies and abortion).

"I won't be voting for funding, of any kind, to Planned Parenthood," he said.

"There is something that hasn't changed yet in this country and that is that people want to make sure their kids and grandkids in the country will have a good life," he said. "We live in the greatest state in the greatest country in the world and it is only going to stay that way if we fight for it."

A question-and-answer session followed Ratcliffe's presentation.

Royse City Lions Club honors camp participant

The Royse City Lions Club hosted a special meeting at the Denny's in Royse City at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, Aug. 27 to honor three young people who had just completed a week of adventures and learning at the Texas Lions Club in Kerrville.

Various camps are conducted for children with physical disabilities, Type 1 diabetes, cancer and Down's syndrome.

Their camp stays were sponsored by the Royse City Lions Club. The first to speak to the group was 11-year-old sixth grade student

Kaden Bredeweg of Fate, son of Jack and Alishia Bredeweg. Kaden spoke at a special event several months ago at the Wear Red Day in recognition of the American Heart Month Fund. He suffers from multiple heart problems and had a heart cauterization at 9 months to determine what his problems were and how they could be addressed. When Kaden was 10 months old, he had open heart surgery at the University of Michigan Mott's Children Hospital. He faces many more procedures and possible surgeries during his lifetime.

The Lions Club Camp Kaden attended was for children with physical disabilities and was in

Kerrville July 5-11.

"I enjoyed working with the ropes the most and getting up early the least," Kaden said. "There were 16 kids in my cabin. I liked the game called CSI the best. Someone broke a cotton candy machine and we were given clues as to try to find out who did it. I won a certificate for finding out who it was."

His mother, Alishia, said he wants to be a police officer when he grows up.

KennedyZiegler,9,ofRockwall and Harmony Forsythe, 13, of Royse City, attended the camp in Kerrville for children diagnosed with Type 1 diabetes.

"My favorite thing to do in camp was horseback riding," Ziegler said. "My horse's was named Monkey. The food there was really good. I also liked camping out and roasting marshmallows. I learned to load my own insulin and give myself my own shots."

Renee, Kennedy's mother, said "she came back from camp a changed child. She is now very independent. I was a wreck while her daughter was gone because she had never been away from home. But when Kennedy returned, her mother was quite proud she had gone.

"The camp and making new friends made such a big difference in her," her mother said.

The third camper to tell of her camp experiences was Harmony.

"I also loved the horseback riding and my horse was named

2015 Property Tax Rates in City of Rockwall

This notice concerns 2015 property tax rates for City of Rockwall. It presents information about three tax rates. Last year's tax rate is the actual rate the taxing unit used to determine property taxes last year. This year's effective tax rate would impose the same total taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. This year's rollback tax rate is the highest tax rate the taxing unit can set before taxpayers can start tax rollback procedures. In each case these rates are found by dividing the total amount of taxes by the tax base (the total value of taxable property) with adjustments as required by state law. The rates are given per \$100 of property value.




