County considers water supply plans

Rockwall County may soon have access to new water resources, according to a report given at last week's Rockwall City Council meet-

Mike Rickman, a spokesman for the North Texas Municipal Water District, said population and structural growth have placed a significant burden on utility providers throughout the Metroplex, and the best solutions involve long-term planning. The potential for seasonal drought in the region can also tax NTMWD's reserves, even if recent weather provides a vibrant exception.

So, Rickman presented statistics and technical data on a number of future reserves that the NTDMWD hopes to tap in the coming months and years.

'Today, we're taking water out of three lakes," Rickman told the council. "For tomorrow, we are not looking only at the supplies we currently have, but we're uncovering any rock we can find to locate more water out there."

Among the plans are a wetlands reservoir in northern Kaufman County that could feed between 81,000 and 102,000 "acre-feet" of water back into Lake Lavon each year, as well as a partnership with the Upper Sabine Water Supply that could yield another 133,000 acre feet of water. Both projects, Rickman said, are expected to come online this year, while others - including a potential connection to Lake Texoma, along the Red River – are planned in the

But the most effective water plans do not involve large reserves or manmade lakes. Instead, Rickman said, daily conservation can alleviate a great deal of pressure from utility providers, and it's also a priority the Rockwall City Council hopes to emphasize simultaneously.





The event kicked off with a welcome by founder Debbie Brock

"My dream is to have this placer full of women wanting to walk with the Lord," Brock said.

Brock, who began the organization two years ago, said God laid it one her heart that she needed to create a Women of Faith group in Ter-

"God has big plans for us," Brock told the women. "We can't sit idly by and let everyone else do the work."

"I want 200 women here in four years," she said.

Brock then introduced Healing Hearts ministry cofounders Mary Clemons and Susan White.

"We are so pleased to have these two women," Brock said of the founders of the minis-

Dozens of area women try which serves domestic violence and sexual abuse victims. "God has put them in our path."

Brock then introduced White who told the women her personal testimony of abuse and the consequences she often faced because of her poor choices.

White gave the audience a vivid outline of her abuse which she said began in her early teen years and escalated until she was a mother in her 30s.

Because of the verbal, mental and physical abuse she endured, White said became a broken person.

However, White said her faith is what sustained her.

"I know without a doubt I would have committed suicide without Christ in my

To demonstrate the broken pieces of her life, White gave each audience member a piece of paper with the picture of a woman. Each time she mentioned an element of abuse - drugs, alcohol, affairs, jealousy, intimidation the women were instructed to tear the paper again.

White credited her parents with helping her turn around her life by the Godly advice they gave her.

"They told me that they couldn't give me the answers, only God could," she said.

"My mother always reminded me, 'God will never leave you or forsake you." White also said her moth-

er told her that her pain would serve a purpose. "I asked God to forgive me

Painting by 25,297 people to be auctioned

hit the eBay auction block on June 6. The artwork titled, "A Little Dab of Texas," was painted by 25,297 individuals and stands 48-feet-long. The painting was recognized as a state project by the Texas House of Representatives and unveiled at the Texas State Capitol in Austin. The picture was later exhibited on Capitol Hill in Washington, DC, and toured 13 cities. The artwork has been certified by the Guinness Book of World Records, and holds the current record for "Most Painters of One Picture."

This colossal calibration art project was designed by Texas artist Jim Campbell. The artwork is compiled of 12 separate stand-alone pictures or scenes. Each scene represents an element of a working ranch - log cabin, barn, wagon, cows, cowboys, windmills, and horses.

The scenes were drawn in pencil on 4' x 8' hardwood panels; color-coded with dabs of color (like a paint-by-number picture); and then painted with

A big piece of Texas art history will acrylic paint by volunteers. The final picture is complete when all 12 scenes are assembled. "A Little Dab of Texas," stands 48-feet long and eight-feet tall.

Campbell traveled the state seeking volunteers at public events - fairs, festivals, schools, and malls. The 25,297 painters represented 844 Texas towns, 44 of the 50 United States and 21 countries. The project took three years and seven months to complete.

Over the years, Campbell met many people - young and old. The youngest painter was a 14-day-old, red-headed, baby boy, (his father helped him paint). The eldest painter was a 92-year-old man. Campbell also kept notes of statements made by the participants. For example a teenager in a Houston mall said, "I wish all of mankind could see and learn from this picture. If everyone would do just a little towards a common goal, great things would be accomplished."

The winning bidder will need to make arrangements to pick up the artwork. Since the painting comes with (and can be transported in) a covered cargo trailer, the winning bidder will have to get new license plates, pay applicable taxes, and transfer title to their name.

> Stoller Vineyards JV Estate Pinot Noir Rosé 2007 (\$). This Oregon rosé was made in a blend of two methods: half the grapes were pressed immediately and fermented in cooled steel tanks; the other half was cold soaked for 4 days before pressing and fermentation. The result is an outstanding, fruity rosé with ripe strawberry and sweet cherry notes.




