## County considers water supply plans

Rockwall County may soon have access to new water resources, according to a report given at last week's Rockwall City Council meeting.

Mike Rickman, a spokesman for the North Texas Municipal Water District, said population and structural growth have placed a significant burden on utility providers throughout the Metroplex, and the best solutions involve long-term planning. The potential for seasonal drought in the region can also tax NTMWD's

reserves, even if recent weather provides a vibrant exception.

So, Rickman presented statistics and technical data on a number of future reserves that the NTMWD hopes to tap in the coming months and years.

"Today, we're taking water out of three lakes," Rickman told the council. "For tomorrow, we are not looking only at the supplies we currently have, but we're uncovering any rock we can find to locate more water out there."

Among the plans are a wetlands reservoir in northern Kaufman County that could feed between 81,000 and 102,000 "acre-feet" of wa-

ter back into Lake Lavon each year, as well as a partnership with the Upper Sabine Water Supply that could yield another 133,000 acre feet of water. Both projects, Rickman said, are expected to come online this year, while others - including a potential connection to Lake Texoma, along the Red River - are planned in the coming years.

But the most effective water plans do not involve large reserves or manmade lakes. Instead, Rickman said, daily conservation can alleviate a great deal of pressure from utility providers, and it's also a priority the Rockwall City Council hopes to emphasize simultaneously.

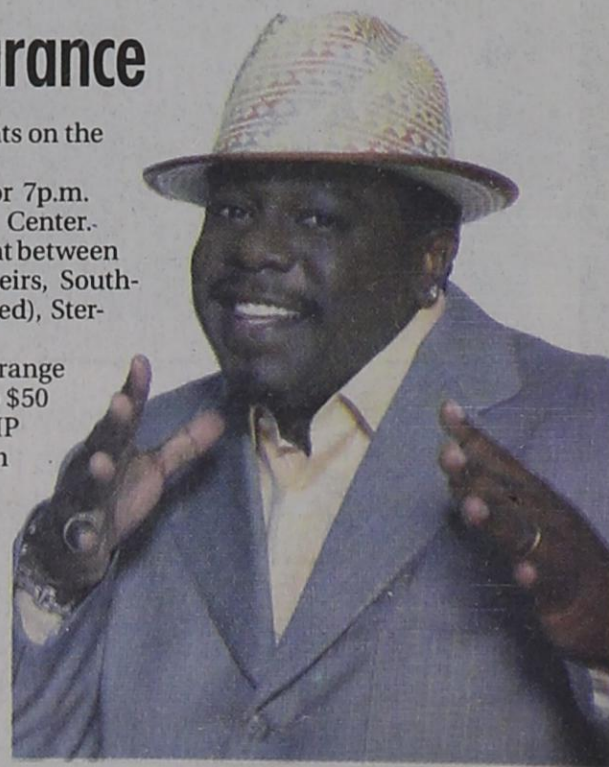
college. We look forward to future events on the college's behalf."

### Prison ministry celebrates second anniversary

Woman Set Free prison ministry volunteers gathered on May 16 at the WSF corporate headquarters at 303 N. Goliad in Rockwall to celebrate the group's second anniversary and the growth it has experienced in both support and service opportunities during the past two years. In 2006, the faith-based, non-denominational, non-profit women's prison ministry launched its corporate mission to teach God's word and share Christ's love with women who have experienced life behind prison bars. Since that time, the ministry has experienced steady growth and now includes 26 volunteers who minister inside prison walls, 28 volunteers who serve on its prayer team, and over 100 individuals who provide support in other capacities as Good Neighbors.

With the support it has garnered over the past two years, Woman Set Free has been able to expand its ministry to include visits to jails

# Piano Angel program assists students

# Fundraiser set for Forney toddler

FORNEY - A fundraiser for Hannah Kessner, 4-year-old daughter of Danny and Michelle Kessner of Forney, is scheduled for Saturday at the Forney Chick-fil-A. Kessner has been diagnosed with Chiari Malformation a congenital defect in the area of the back of the head where the brain and spinal cord connect. The defect causes the brain to sink into the spinal cord. Kessner had been complaining of headaches and vomiting which are symptoms of the defect. The diagnosis was made last week after an MRI was performed. The family is seeking community support to help cover

the expense of surgery. Customers should ask that their receipt go to Hannah or the purchase will not be counted in the fundraiser to help cover medical costs.

Rockwall Independent School District current piano classes at both High School and Heath High School. The program was started in the 2006-07 school year at RHHS. The success of piano performance in its first year allowed the district to adopt the program as well. The main purpose of the Performance course is to give students an opportunity to gain experience making a piano ensemble. With the support of the district, piano specialists and Doudney proposed, and implemented a district piano program. The district began recruiting students for the first program of its kind in 2006. A group of 96 students formed the first Performance 1 class. Students will be able to enroll in 1-4 as they progress through high school at both RHHS. The district intended to give students who did not have the opportunity to take music lessons a chance to learn a musical instrument. Doudney, the RHSD administrator, said the program will engage students with new and exciting musical experiences. The overall success of the program confirms that the administration was

on target with providing a course which students desire and can achieve success. The RHS piano program is off to a booming start with students receiving superior ratings in Garland ISD piano festival last March, three piano recitals given in May, in-class recitals during the year, class visits by local musicians, a recent field trip to Steinway Hall and double the enrollment for 2008-09, only half of whom can be accommodated.

Students enrolling in Piano 1 are beginners with no prior piano experience. Both RHS and RHHS Piano Performance classes have state-of-the-art electronic keyboards and communication centers.

Studies show that students who participate in music education receive numerous life-long benefits that include increased self-esteem, motivation, self-expression, concentration and critical thinking skills. Educational research has shown that involvement in this type of fine arts program decreases drop-out rates and increases test scores.

The majority of piano students do not have access to pianos or keyboards outside of their school program. The RHSD Piano Angel program provides students with donated instruments from the community which extends the music experience into the homes of piano students per-

manently.

Through Piano Angels piano students receive a donated piano or keyboard based on essay submissions. During the 2007-08 school year four Rockwall High School students have benefited from donated pianos/keyboards.

Ricardo Ramirez, a Rockwall High School junior, was one of the first students to receive an instrument through the Piano Angel program. In his essay Ramirez described his desire to own a piano saying, "I need a piano because I would really love to learn to play songs for my family or any other guests that came for an occasion. If I did win the piano, I would use it to learn all the songs and if I get

good enough, I would love to write my own music."

RHS accepted donated pianos or full-sized electronic keyboards that are in good working condition.

Individuals can donate an old instrument to students learning a new art or they can make a contribution to the RHS piano fund.

"This has been a really great experience. I like how I got the piano and I will always cherish and take care of it because this is my first piano ever," Ramirez said.

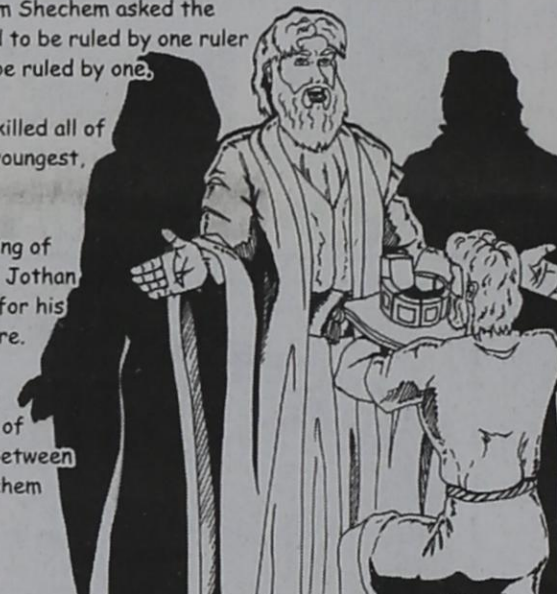
Abimelech becomes King

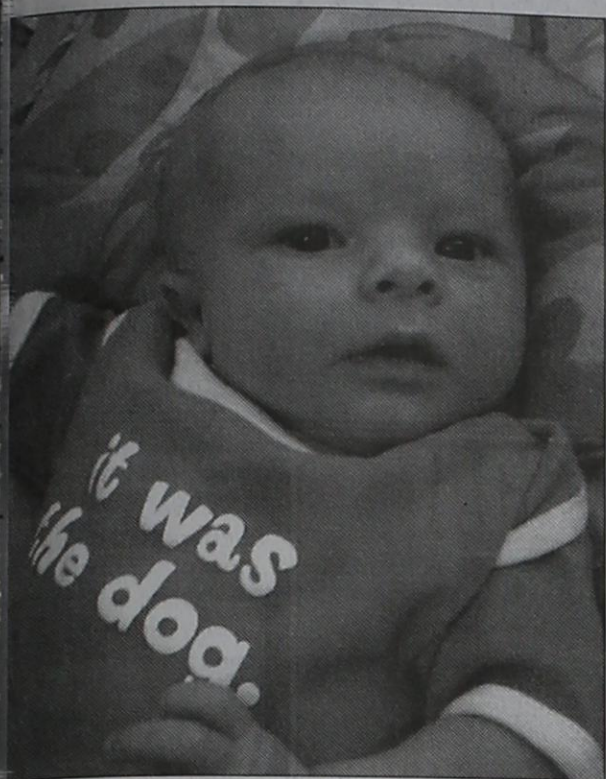

## Domestic violence victim speaks at luncheon

Dozens of area women gathered at the East Texas Women of Faith Luncheon Tuesday at First Assembly of God Church.

The event kicked off with a welcome by founder Debbie Brock.

"My dream is to have this place full of women wanting to walk with the Lord," Brock said.

Brock, who began the organization two years ago, said God laid it on her heart that she needed to create a Women of Faith group in Terrell.

"God has big plans for us," Brock told the women. "We can't sit idly by and let everyone else do the work."

"I want 200 women here in four years," she said.

Brock then introduced Healing Hearts ministry co-founders Mary Clemons and Susan White.

"We are so pleased to have these two women," Brock said of the founders of the minis-

try which serves domestic violence and sexual abuse victims. "God has put them in our path."

Brock then introduced White who told the women her personal testimony of abuse and the consequences she often faced because of her poor choices.

White gave the audience a vivid outline of her abuse which she said began in her early teen years and escalated until she was a mother in her 30s.

Because of the verbal, mental and physical abuse she endured, White said she became a broken person.

However, White said her faith is what sustained her.

"I know without a doubt I would have committed suicide without Christ in my life."

To demonstrate the broken pieces of her life, White gave each audience member a piece of paper with the picture of a woman. Each time

she mentioned an element of abuse - drugs, alcohol, affairs, jealousy, intimidation - the women were instructed to tear the paper again.

White credited her parents with helping her turn around her life by the Godly advice they gave her.

"They told me that they couldn't give me the answers, only God could," she said.

"My mother always reminded me, 'God will never leave you or forsake you.'"

White also said her mother told her that her pain would serve a purpose.

"I asked God to forgive me for what I had done to myself and my children. I became a new woman that day," she said.

White asked the women to use the tape on the tables to try to piece back their pictures. White told the women the leftover pieces represent the unmentioned parts of a victim - How do I get out? Where do I go? How can I

provide for my family?

White, who finally was able to escape her life of abuse, said she her life began to come back together after she allowed God to rescue her.

Today, White and Clemons are working to help other women who are victims of domestic violence through educational and fundraising efforts. Their latest endeavor is

the Victory House, which will provide transitional housing for two-to-three women and their children at a time.

The women currently are seeking financial donations as well as items to furnish the house.

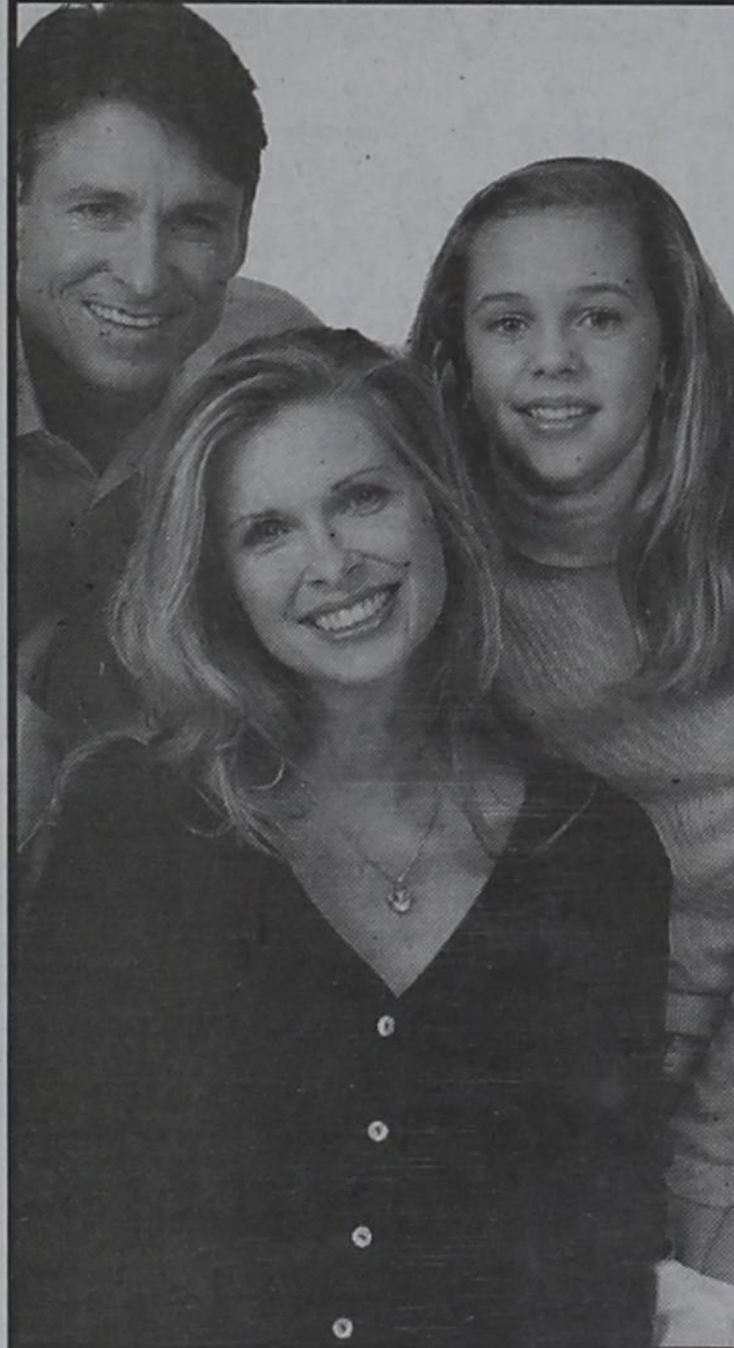

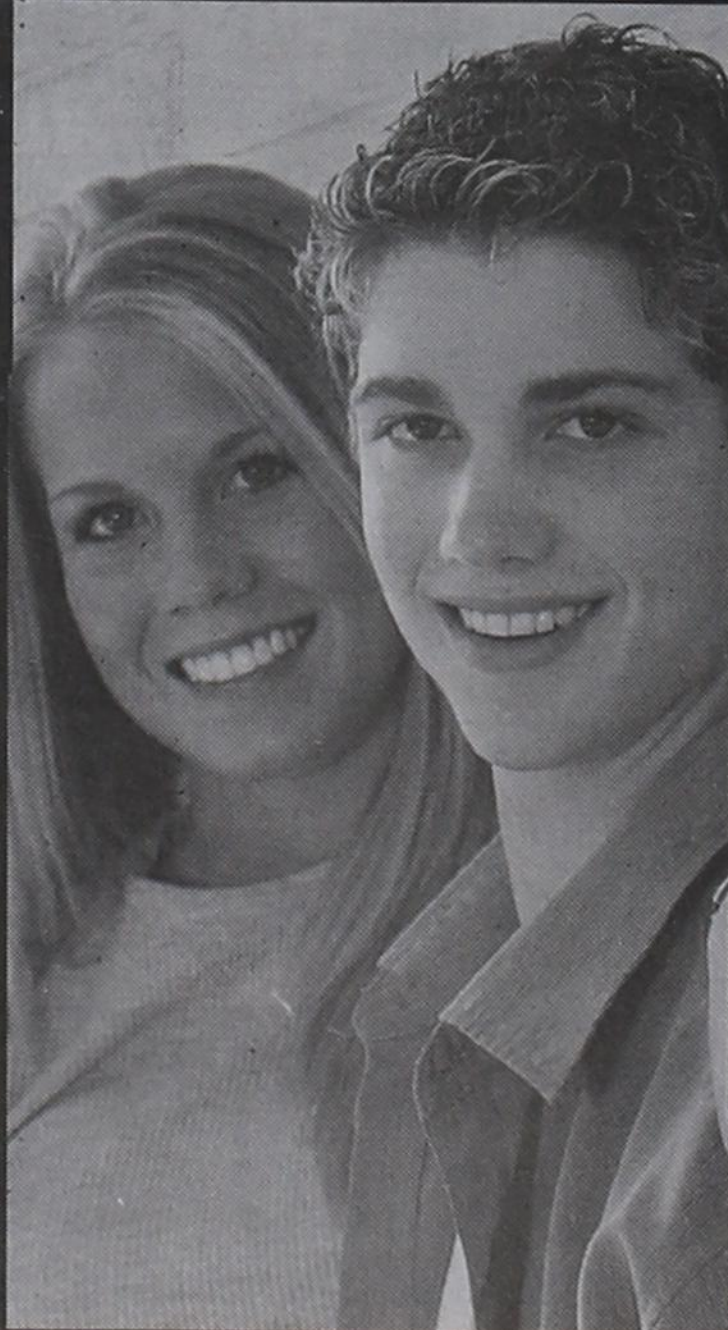



# Painting by 25,297 people to be auctioned

A big piece of Texas art history will hit the eBay auction block on June 6. The artwork titled, "A Little Dab of Texas," was painted by 25,297 individuals and stands 48-feet-long. The painting was recognized as a state project by the Texas House of Representatives and unveiled at the Texas State Capitol in Austin. The picture was later exhibited on Capitol Hill in Washington, DC, and toured 13 cities. The artwork has been certified by the Guinness Book of World Records, and holds the current record for "Most Painters of One Picture."

This colossal calibration art project was designed by Texas artist Jim Campbell. The artwork is compiled of 12 separate stand-alone pictures or scenes. Each scene represents an element of a working ranch - log cabin, barn, wagon, cows, cowboys, windmills, and horses.

The scenes were drawn in pencil on 4' x 8' hardwood panels; color-coded with dabs of color (like a paint-by-number picture); and then painted with

acrylic paint by volunteers. The final picture is complete when all 12 scenes are assembled. "A Little Dab of Texas," stands 48-feet long and eight-feet tall.

Campbell traveled the state seeking volunteers at public events - fairs, festivals, schools, and malls. The 25,297 painters represented 844 Texas towns, 44 of the 50 United States and 21 countries. The project took three years and seven months to complete.

Over the years, Campbell met many people - young and old. The youngest painter was a 14-day-old, red-headed, baby boy, (his father helped him paint). The eldest painter was a 92-year-old man. Campbell also kept notes of statements made by the participants. For example a teenager in a Houston mall said, "I wish all of mankind could see and learn from this picture. If everyone would do just a little towards a common goal, great things would be accomplished."

The winning bidder will receive: - Twelve, 4'x 8' panels containing the 12 scenes. (48-feet long when assembled), Support legs (stand) and hardware, Database containing the names and addresses of the 25,297 participants, covered 10-foot cargo trailer and 1,000 fine art posters.

The winning bidder will need to make arrangements to pick up the artwork. Since the painting comes with (and can be transported in) a covered cargo trailer, the winning bidder will have to get new license plates, pay applicable taxes, and transfer title to their name.

However, at about 600 calories and almost 60 grams of fat per cup, coconut milk is a nutritional splurge that many cooks would rather do without. Happily, light coconut milk, made from a second

or third pressing of coconut meat and with considerably fewer calories and less fat, makes a good substitute. Co-conut cream, from the first pressing, is so high in fat it's sometimes used for frying.

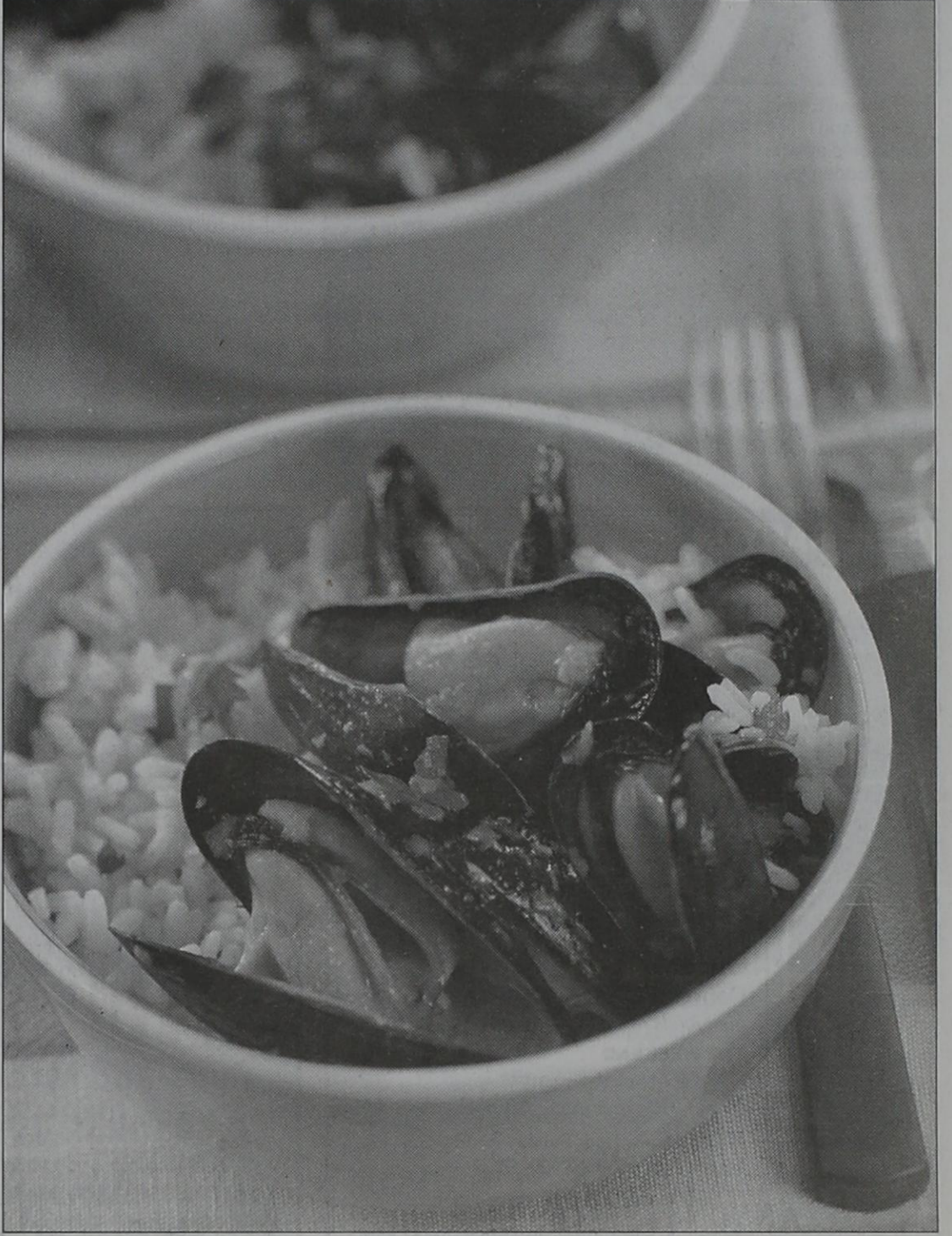

## Amy Parks third graders take a step back in time

Boys in suspenders and girls in bonnets - not your typical day at school - at least in the year 2008. But for the pioneers, these were essential elements of their daily wear. Third graders at Amy Parks Heath Elementary spent the afternoon outdoors, learning about the life of early Texans.

Students were instructed to dress like pioneers and pack a lunch that would have been customary for a student from the 1800s. Children arrived carrying baskets or metal buckets with biscuits, ham, fresh fruit and homemade desserts. 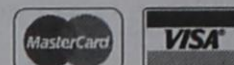
