A member of the Central Lutheran Church in Dallas, he served on the church council and sang in the choir for many years.



Know the basics ... hope of resurrection

Based on God's rightly divided word, God's beloved saints and born-again children have the hope of future resurrection events.

A study of the Gospels reveals the our Lord Jesus was the firstfruit from the dead. Jesus' Father raised him up from the dead first. At a later time during the spiritual administration of the grace of God, the Day of Christ will come. More details about the Day of Christ may be found in 1Thess. 4:13-18 and 1Cor. 15:51-54.

Fulfillment of the Day of Christ will mark the beginning of the period of time recorded in Revelations.

The resurrection of the "just and the unjust" will occur during the Revelations period of time (See Daniel 12:1-3, Acts 24:15, Rev. 20:4-6, and 20:15).

Concerning the Revelations period resurrections, it says in Daniel 12:2, "And many of them that sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame and evelasting contempt."




