It has always been the Reporter's policy to believe, for our confidence in mankind extends unto this degree—that on some questions involved, he is just as honest and sincere in what believes to be right as we are, and has just as much right for a presentation of his claim as those who oppose him. It was through recognition of this fact that our Democratic form of Government found its origin, thus according "equal rights to all, with special privileges towards none," with the intention of its laws based on the principle, that whatever law a majority of the people said the country should be governed by, opposition was to submissively submit and be ruled accordingly. For this reason we we favor a discussion of all public questions to be put before the people, for we truthfully know, that not until one hears both sides of any arbitrated issue, is he in position to rightly weigh the evidence, or form a reasonable conclusion about what is right.

To The Voters Of Wilbarger County:

On August 19th., the question of Local Option, or as it may be under the new laws, "Prohibition" will be voted on and you will be called on to decide one of the most important questions that has ever been before you affecting your personal rights, new prohibition Laws are being passed at most every meeting of our Legislature; till today we have before us the Allison Bill prohibiting the shipment of Spiritous and nalt Liquors into Local Option territory, this will be a law that will require you to go to the nearest point at which Liquor is sold and return with it yourself for your own and family use, this would be an unfortunate condition as most every family in Wilbarger County at some time during a year must have either Alcohol or spiritous liquors for sickness and to alleviate suffering. The self styled temperance advocate would take even the opportunity from you of getting Alcohol or spiritous liquors even in these extremes cases of sickness, accidents or suffering, and I appeal to the intelligence of the Voters "not your Prejudices," of Wilbarger County, and hope you will give this question and the situation thereof most careful consideration before you cast your ballot on the 19th. of August, under even the present laws now in effect the construction put on them by the Attorney General is that you cannot even get spiritous liquors at any point in Texas unless you go after it yourself and then you are not allowed to even give any one else a drink even though your life depended on it, with one exception, your immediate family, the Pros say this not so and quote their Lawyers to prove it, let that be as it may, I below give you an article from Austin Texas, to the St. Louis papers and it was so published in St. Louis under the heading "It grows longer each day between drinks"

One of the new laws makes it illegal for any person firm or corporation to deliver to any other person any intoxicating liquor for shipment into Local Option territory. It is also unlawful to transport or carry liquors into districts where its sale is prohibited and another restriction makes it unlawful for anyone to receive such liquor. In other words, the only way a person can get an intoxicant in a local option district is to carry it on his person. He is barred under the law from offering drink to another or permitting any one else to take a drink with him. The fact that the law provides a penalty of one year or not more than three years in the penitentiary for any one who shall be deemed guilty of its violation makes its observance assured. So from this you are

not even allowed to give any one else a drink even though their life depended on it. A farmer is more isolated than the resident of our Cities or towns and it is on the Farmer that these new restriction Laws bears the hardest. A child or some member of your family may be bitten by a snake, tarantula or centipede, and in such cases there is no remedy that will take the place of Alcohol, it will save life when nothing else will. This was the condition Mrs. Goldman found herself in a short time since, they live south of Vernon, she was stung by a centipede on the thigh, her husband had some whiskey left in a bottle, she took a good drink and sent her little child to the field after her husband, he came and gave more whiskey, they sent for the Doctor and he prescribed more whiskey. I would also cite you to the recent case of one of our time honored citizens who is a paralytic, Mr. Bruce Wilkerson our former Ex-County Commissioner he is bedfast, the Doctor prescribed whiskey and to get it a trip had to be made to Wichita Falls and there are several cases this month where parties from the country had to take the train for Wichita Falls to get Alcohol and whiskey requiring in each case a trip of many hours and much larger expenditures of money than if secured at Vernon, which is accessible in a few hours from any point in our County. Now the new laws do not make exceptions in such extreme cases, but would put anyone in the Penitentiary that would give them whiskey to save their lives.

There is no substitute for alcohol, in the manufacturing of medicines and the filling of prescriptions, and when one comes out of a hard spell of fever and their vitality is very low, by bathing the patient in Alcohol frequently saves their life and restores vitality, one of our Vernon Doctors thinks he is still allowed the permissious use of Alcohol, if this law is enforced against him he will find out a few things he is not up on now.

The new laws are not specific enough and does not make exception of Druggists and Doctors, and below I give part of an article published in the Dallas News of July 12th., by a prominent Druggist of that City under the heading:

"ALCOHOL SITUATION DISCUSSED"

He goes on to state: "Alcohol has been used in the preparation and preservation of medicines and without its use and present knowledge no solvent can be substituted, he further states:

"No druggist can afford to pay the tax for using Alcohol. It would mean confiscation of their business or go into the Liquor business, which no right-minded

person desires them to do.

"Not only should every druggist take a personal interest in this matter, the Governor and the Legislature, but the people are as deeply concerned. Relief should be given at once. It may be that a construction of the present Law may be had which will accomplish this; but not being versed in law, I am not in position to give an opinion.

I do hope every reader will recognize the importance of this matter and have this unfortunate situation relieved at the earliest possible moment. No state or county has a comparable conditions relating to drugs and medicines confronting them.

The most of our ministers are unjustly alarmed at the advent of Saloons again in Vernon and are making some misleading statements trying to carry their point. Rev. Hail on our streets Saturday gave parallel description and comparison of Runnels County under Saloons and when same County was dry showing a decrease in whiskey, and etc. used after this County was added to the dry column, but he failed to explain to you that when Saloons were in Runnels that it was like Wichita County, that they shipped whiskey and beer into all dry territories surrounding that County and therefore an unfair statement to make, as it was misleading and did not show the facts in the case, as in his statement under Saloons he included all whiskies and beer shipped out of Runnels County, and not used in this County at all, therefore as to what Runnels County consumed under Saloons included not only Runnels but every dry County around it, and after the County went dry, he gave what was consumed in the County, he brought up Runnels to show that under Prohibition the consumption of Spiritous Liquors was decreasing when the facts show that it is steadily increasing as the last Government report from Washington for the past twelve months ending June 30, 1913, shows the following. The drinkers of the Country consumed the enormous total of 143,300,000 gallons of whiskey and brandy, breaking the former high record of 1907 by 7,300,000 gallons, 64,500,000 barrels of beer were consumed exceeding 1911 great record by more than 1,000,000 barrels.

Assessments on drinking and smoking luxuries, on corporations, Oleomargarine and other articles taxed by the Federal Government brought into the United States Treasury \$344,426,884.00 the greatest amount in history exceeding the previous high record of 1911 by \$21,900,000.00 now the state of Texas is not faring so well since this Local Option hobby came into

politics, as our Ship of State has had exceeding rough sailing the State is now over over two million dollars in the red and our educational institutions are crying out for a bond issue to get them out of debt and build necessary new buildings. And now we come back to our own dear Wilbarger. About eleven years ago when we had our first election you were told, Let us vote the Saloons out and make Vernon a moral town, any of you who are acquainted with the facts know that it did not do it as the scandals in your congregations, homes and public places will bear me out, you were told vote the Saloons out and reduce your taxes, did it do it? You know that ever since your taxes have steadily increased, and in Vernon the Council has had to transfer or borrow from one fund to the school fund to run our schools eight and nine months, you were told, vote the saloons out and increase the value of your property, did it do it? I myself was getting about \$200 per month for the rents on my business houses the day prohibition took effect my tenants moved out, hardware store, merchants and all went, and I did not get one dollar a month for over two years, the third year I rented some of my buildings at \$15.00 per month, and the reaction that has taken place since was not caused by prohibition not even a son of a pro. As I could not get away and therefore had to do something and I did, I went to Missouri and got three Missouri Bankers to come to Vernon and I sold them over ten thousand acres of land, the Houssels 4000 acres at \$7.25 per acre and other lands in proportion, we then resold these lands and settled up the Country, and then your town had to grow to keep up with the country, Vernon and Wilbarger County has not done its due because you have allowed a class of people with its portals to run its affairs that do nothing of themselves to increase the values of your farms and Real Estate, and I would ask you to carefully consider this as a feature of this Campaign. "Am I going to allow this County run by a class that is selfish and dictorial and not looking after the development of the County and the people's interest and only too frequent to the detriment of the people in general. Haray Mason has gone to some of our renting class and told them they should vote the prohibition ticket on the 19th. for if they did't the town would fill up and they would be crowded out of their places of business unless they would pay two and three times the amount of rents they are now paying, one man told him he would rather be doing business in a box house on the east side of the square with

saloons in Vernon than to be doing business in the brick building he is now in under the present conditions, and futhermore I will make this statement, if you will vote the Saloons back and Vernon does not grow and improve, our vacant houses fill up, rents increase and values of property increase then, if that does not happen I will help you vote out the Saloons, this is a fair proposition, as you now have the boot-loggers selling whiskey in your Community and while I have been writing this article two of them were arrested and put in jail, the jail that you were told you would have no use for if the Saloon was voted out, when is it not a fact that you have had to build a new jail to take care of your prisoners, and this same jail now has confined therein nine prisoners. All the pro talk I have so far heard deals in the past, the old doggerly and dive, when they know that under the new Laws such institutions cannot exist, they are only using them to scare the unsuspecting that does not know that a Saloon must observe the Law by closing at 9:30p.m. and not open till 6 a.m., that he can not have tables, chairs or loafing therein, but then this does not describe the Hell Hole you are told about, and to such I would ask you to investigate for yourself. And I would ask each and every one of you to get out of your Rip Van-Winkle sleep and wake up to the conditions now existing and all join hands in the upbuilding of our County and Community.

And let us have Saloons in Vernon, if in no other part of our County, as no locality may want them if we have them at Vernon. The Methodist knew what they were about and were looking at their own interest "which by the way we should all do" when they located their million dollar university at Dallas and within the shadow of 200 saloons. Why did they not improve further at Georgetown or go to Sherman or some other dry town? "Answer why." Now let this soak in slowly and come to your senses and help us to build Universities, Factories and our County Fair at Vernon and for Wilbarger county in general.
