


To put Lewis in jail might have signaled a walkout of miners, and led to weeks or months of paralysis in coal production. The fact that Lewis was let off without a jail term may open the way for a return of the miners to the pits, the resumption of coal production, the revival of faltering industrial

production. From a practical point of view the government was probably right but it is obvious to all Americans that the government dared not send John L. Lewis to jail.

"In a sense John L. Lewis is more powerful than the government of the United States, almost any other man in the country who flouted the authority of the courts as Lewis did would go to jail without ceremony, especially for a second offense. Lewis is more powerful than the courts in the sense that the courts fear the consequences of jailing him. The 400,000 miners who make up his union have more influence on the government than the necessities and welfare of the remaining 139.000,000 American citizens.

So a ticklish and critical situation has been by-passed, maybe. But in some future time, perhaps when the nation's life hangs in the bal-
