#### Police Brutality

(Following is an article given us that was taken from the publication 'Baptist Standard')

##### A LETTER TO OUR POLICE DEPARTMENT

Dear Sirs:

One of the most common phrases heard in our society and our city today is 'police brutality.' Perhaps I don't understand the meaning, but I would like to give you one mother's viewpoint on this subject.

To begin, I should first tell you that I have two teen-age sons, and being a mother, I cannot help but want the very best of everything for them. I am a 'typical-mother' in that I don't want to see them hurt by anyone. I am not a typical mother, for I see things many mothers never hear of, much less become involved in, because my husband is a minister and we see the very best and the sordid worst.

I would like for you to be brutal with my sons. Is that a surprise?

If you find them speeding in a car, please be brutal. I have sat at a hospital holding a grieving mother's hand because of someone's mistake. That was brutal. I have gone with my husband to tell a wife her husband was killed. That was brutal. I have helped nurse a beautiful teen-age girl crippled in a wreck. That was brutal. I have played organ music at funeral services for babies, teenagers and adults because someone drove too fast. That was brutal.

If you should catch my underage sons with liquor in their possession, please be brutal.

I have sat all night by my husband's side trying to help piece together two under-age young men's lives, both broken by drinking. That was brutal. I have listened to the horrors experience by another man while he was drunk and heard him recall the many jails he had served time in for this. That was brutal. I have helped feed hungry children because a drunken father did not come home. That was brutal. I have tried to console a mother whose daughter was killed after being struck by a drunken driver. That was brutal.

If you should find my sons with drugs in their possession, please be brutal.

I have tried to help rehabilitate a woman just out of prison for shooting her husband while she was drugged. That was brutal. I have seen a handsome young man turn into an old ugly one because of drugs. That was brutal. I have seen a young mother who was addicted to a drug scream and rave for lack of a 'fix.' That was brutal.

If you find my sons committing any kind of immoral act or carrying any pornographic materials, please be brutal. I have listened to the sad cry of a young girl who was pregnant but not married. That was brutal. I have been present when a boy and girl broke the news that they had to marry. That was brutal. I have tried to comfort a mother whose beautiful daughter was criminally raped. That was brutal. I have seen a promising young man with a brilliant future have to give it up and too young assume the responsibilities of a wife and baby. That was brutal.

If you ever see my sons taking something that isn't theirs or willfully destroying property, please be brutal! I have walked into a hushed, sacred church that was stripped of everything that could be sold. That was brutal. I have seen a lovely, expensive home and yard completely torn up by vandals. That was brutal. I have seen a school and its marvelous equipment torn apart by other vandals. That was brutal. I have wiped a little boy's tears and helped him hunt for his stolen bicycle. That was brutal.

If you should ever catch my sons doing anything illegal, please be brutal! I have come to realize that your kind of "brutality" cannot in any way compare with the brutality that comes from breaking our laws.

My husband and I have tried to teach our sons that their rights end where someone else's begin. We believe they have learned this lesson; but in case they forget, we look to you and others who influence their lives — teachers, coaches, etc. — to see that they remember.

And if you must be brutal to remind them—then please, please be brutal!

The Ropes Cemetery Board Association hopes to make the clean-up day more successful this year, by combining with it, a dinner on the ground for all participants.

The annual affair is held each Memorial Day, May 30, which is on Thursday this year.

If you know of someone out of town who has an interest in the cemetery, you are asked to notify them of the work day. It is hoped that several past residents will be present.

Everyone is to bring the necessary tools, and food to contribute to the dinner. Those who are not able to work are asked to bring food and join the workers at lunch.

The cemetery can be cleaned and lots of visiting accomplished at the same time.

Postmaster General Marvin Watson announced recently that a contract has been awarded to Mr. and Mrs. Jimmie Kelly of Plainview to build the new post office building in Wolforth, and lease it to the post office department for ten years with options to renew the lease for an additional twenty years at an annual rental of \$3480 for the basic lease term. It represents the lowest responsive bid of seven received by the department on a competitive basis, and reflects what departmental studies have determined to be a reasonable and economic rental for leased space in this area.

The announcement of the award to the successful bidder advances the new building closer to the construction stage. When fully operational, the Postmaster General said, the additional space and more modern equipment will, in the long run, more than offset the extra cost involved in producing more efficient handling of the mail, in accord with President Johnson's directive to provide the best possible postal service at the least possible cost.

Mr. Watson explained further that the department's capital investment is limited substantially to postal equipment. The building will remain under private ownership with the owner paying local real estate taxes.

Mr. Watson also said the building should be completed and ready for occupancy by February 1, 1969.

I do not want my two sons to grow into two grown-up boys. I want them to become men, able to assume their places in this world and make a good contribution to it. I sincerely hope they won't need your help; but if they do, and if you must, then be brutal.

(Mrs. Leon K. Aduddell, wife of the pastor of Bellaire Church of San Antonio, wrote this letter to a policeman and member of that congregation after he had been accused of brutality in the arrest of narcotics addicts. His department published it in its March issue of The Badge).

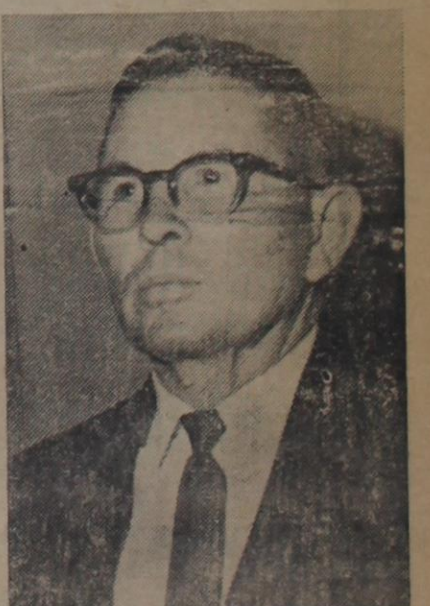
I have lived in Hockley County 30 years.

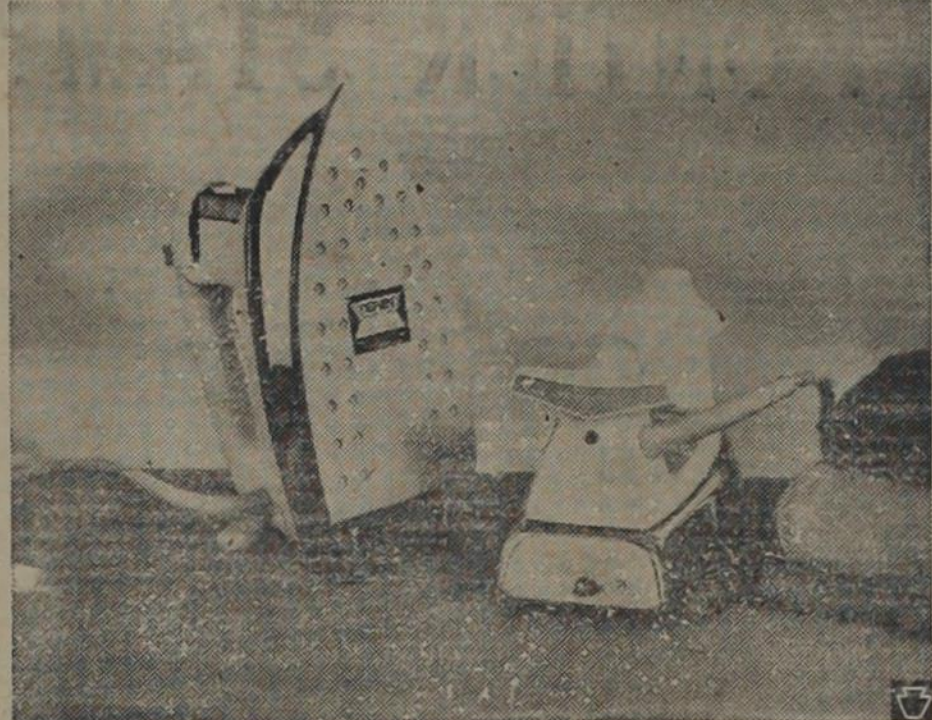

**"Heel Rest" Adds Safety To Irons**



Ever bump your ironing table and watch in horror as the iron tips and falls to the floor? Or put the iron down slightly off its base and have it fall off the table?  
 Accidents like that have been common, but they will be minimized greatly by a clever addition to the back of the handle of some new irons. A three-inch "V" called a "Heel Rest" provides a great deal of extra stability when the iron is sitting up, and a wider surface to rest it on when it is being placed in the upright position.

 Other features that have become popular also are present in these irons. They have the 36-hole sole-plate that provides a cushion of steam; the custom-grip white handle and blue cord, and easy change of the cord for right-handed or left-handed use.  
 One maker, Sunbeam, is offering the new irons in four styles, a steam iron with polished or Teflon-coated sole-plate, and a pair of steam/spray irons with polished or Teflon-coated soleplates. All four have such deluxe features as water level gauges and fabric guides.

**VITAMINS WEREN'T KNOWN IN 1900**  
 In the early years of this century, scientists knew that our food contained proteins, fats, carbohydrates, mineral elements, and water. It was not difficult to separate these substances into relatively pure form from basic foods such as milk, meat, and cereal grains.  
 But when mixtures of such material were fed to experimental animals, the animals would become sick and die. From this, scientists concluded that there must be unidentified factors in food that are essential to health. Animals did well on the experimental diets if butterfat and water soluble material from yeast were added.  
**Vitamin A Was First**  
 From such scientific investigation the discovery of vitamins evolved. The first to be discovered was vitamin A. This work was performed by scientists Elmer V. McCollum and Marguerite Davis at the University of Wisconsin in 1912. They found that something in butterfat or egg yolk fat could insure nutritional success with animals. Corroboration of this discovery of vitamin A came some months later from the Yale University laboratories of Thomas Burr Osborne and L. B. Mendel.  
 Now vitamins are known and classified according to their solubility. Those that are water soluble are vitamin C and the B vitamins. The vitamins that are fat soluble in their natural form are A, D, E, and K. All of these have been discovered and identified since Dr. McCollum's first vitamin was announced.  
 Nowadays, everyone knows that there are such things as vitamins. And many people thoroughly understand their function. Professional and public appreciation for the role of vitamins has been brought about by research and education.  
**Sound Nutrition Urged**  
 Many persons and agencies have shared in this work. In this column, however, it is a pleasure to remind readers that Dr. McCollum himself played a major role in convincing the dairy industry it should set up an ethical nutrition research and educational agency, the National Dairy Council, in 1915, to help educate the public to its need for good nutrition, including knowledge of the new "vitamins." The Dairy Council continues to operate in the public interest by urging sound total nutrition and improved eating habits.  
**Vitamins Regulate Body**  
 Vitamins are nutrients without calories. They furnish no energy, but the body must have them because they are regulators of body processes. Your best source of the vitamins you need is the four food groups—the milk group, meats, vegetables and fruits, breads and cereals.  
 By eating a wide variety of foods from these groups you will also make sure you are getting food factors that have not yet been identified. To avoid overdoses or waste of money, don't rely on pills for good nutrition. Your doctor will prescribe them if there's a reason. We'll talk more about vitamins in food in a future column.
