To face death is also to become a philosopher. I discovered this to be true while working as a chaplain at the Parkland Hospital in Dallas. When death rears its head, all men begin to seek out some wisdom about it. This is what philosophy means—love of wisdom. We all seek some knowledge, some wisdom about that which is going to happen to us. This is true of the doctor. Each patient that dies causes most, if not all, doctors to search out their minds in an effort to answer this thing called death. This is true of the patient who is told that he is soon to die. Once the patient truly believes that he is to die, he seldom turns his head to the wall and simply dies. Rather, he seeks someone out who will talk to him about this great unknown. And, we do the patient an injustice by not listening to the ideas on death, but we fail when we do not give our own ideas on the subject.

I shall not soon forget the doctor who came to me one day. He had just told a lady that she was to die of cancer. She asked him some questions about death and rather than answer he left the room and came to the chaplain's office. He was as scared as she was for he had no answers to give her. He had no word of hope. He had only words like, "You will suffer a great deal for three more months. There is nothing I can do. It is too far gone."

What to do? Where to turn? What is the answer?

For the Christian there is an answer to this thing called death—FAITH! We know not what is on the other side of that black curtain. It is beyond us, but a Christian's philosophy, his wisdom, his faith, is seen in the words of Paul to the Romans: "None of us lives to himself, and none of us dies to himself. If we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord; so then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's." We know not what death brings, but we know by faith that God loves us here in life as well as there in death.

ma and Jon Hagler, State FFA President in 1953-54 who is now with Waddell and Reed, Inc. and is the Investment Manager for United Funds, Inc. of Kansas City, Missouri, are among the speakers to address the 3500 rural youth convened in San Antonio, July 15-17.

C. T. McCormick, Vocational Agriculture Teacher, will accompany FFA members to the San Antonio Convention.

### TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY Region No. 5, Lubbock

The Highway Patrol investigated 15 rural traffic accidents in Hockley County during the month of June, according to Sergeant A. E. Roberts, Patrol Supervisor of this area.

These wrecks accounted for one person killed, six persons injured and an estimated property damage of \$45,000.00.

The rural traffic accident summary in Hockley County for the first six months of 1964 shows a total of 51 crashes resulting in two persons killed, 32 persons injured and an estimated property damage of \$72,970.00.

"As of July 3, there had been a total of 1,060 fatal crashes in Texas taking the lives of 1,288 persons," the sergeant stated. This is 174 more traffic deaths than for the same period of 1963.





### Palo Duro Canyon State Park

Etched deeply in the high plains of the Panhandle, just south of Amarillo, lies a spectacular gorge, widely renowned for its scenic beauty.
