





are being planted to give more information on weevil overwintering, and the information should be complete before commercial cotton crops begin to square, Owen said.

Dr. J. C. Gaines, head of the entomology department at Texas A&M emphasized the importance of in-season weevil control below the Caprock. He explained that this would reduce the number of weevils migrating to the High Plains and thus minimize the acreage needing treatment this fall.


